We thank John for giving us an evening of his time and getting up what will be a very informative and enjoyable program.

Even though I am writing this a couple of weeks early, there is still a lot to report! We are off to Iowa for the first half of July, so I'll catch

Buddy and **Danny Noland** and **Ricky Dale** are sporting new colors after their recent weeklong adventures off Virginia Beach – black and blue! Or, as Danny put it, "we're getting too old for this"! Black is for lots of nice black sea bass (but no world records this time), and blue is for bluefish. They entered several nice black sea bass from 2-8 to 5-0 pounds, with Danny's 4-6

on 4 plug topping the list for a new club record. Buddy tied a club record with his 5-0 on 12 plug. Ricky also earned a new club record with his 18-0 bluefish on 12 spin! Spadefish were also on the menu, with Danny's 3-1 on 4 fly taking another club record and potentially an IGFA world record!!

Dr. Jim Wright has been busy at the Norfolk Canyon and elsewhere. He had blue and white marlin releases on one trip to the canyon and a 27-11 dolphin on another. These were the first local club billfish catches in several years! He has also recorded releases for cobia and a nice 6-11 sheepshead on 12 general. **Scott Johnston's** club record 5-0 dolphin on 4 fly caught off Hatteras has the dolphin lead. Scott was fishing aboard **Captain David Holsclaw's** Unbound! and had scads of dolphin to shoot at. **Parks Rountrey** and **Bruce Henderson** took advantage of light winds and ran 60 miles to the South Tower on July 2nd for AJ's. Also Herb Gordon was there on Pretty work, Jim and David Wright on High Hopes, and a few others. There was too much traffic around to get the jacks up on the

surface for the flyrods, so they got out the heavy stuff and caught a few jacks on bucktails and live croakers. Both had release citation AJ's. Also had a cobia on for a while and got bit off several times by monster barracuda.

From calmer, inshore waters, **Scott Davis** released a nice 12-0 striper on 2 spin on the Mobjack. **Fred Murray** took the croaker lead with a 2-3 on 2 spin from the Rappahannock. **Stuart Lee** had a great day at Hatteras with a 4-0 Spanish on 6 spin and a club record 33-0 jack crevalle on 16 plug. I spent the middle of June soaking my feet in the eastern shore surf, as usual. My reward was a couple dozen red drum. Most were yearlings, but there were five over 40 pounds and one I'll call "Bubba" that went 58!

Bubba earned me the June angler of the month honors, scoring 414 points. **Scott Davis** captured second with his 1-2 sunfish on 2 fly that scored 360 points. **Fred Murray** was third with his 2-3 croaker on 2 spin that scored 291 points.

BUBBA AND MICKEY MOUSE by Dennis Cline

The forecast for light easterly winds for most of the week had me optimistic. If only I could find some bait! Saturday and Sunday had been good days, but I had used the last of the mullet. Monday found me waiting for the pound-netters and hoping they had some bunkers to spare. I was in luck. With a cooler full of large, fresh bunker, I spent Tuesday and Wednesday catching yearling drum and fighting huge stingrays and sharks. I did manage one nice 44-0 late in the day. I was starting to wonder if this was the end of the spring run?

I was on the beach early on Thursday and the fish were waiting for me. I released three yearlings in the first half hour. Then it went dead. For the next three and a half hours, I spent my time baiting empty hooks. Small bluefish had taken over, and if there were drum out there, they couldn't get to the baits before the bluefish. I finally hooked one of the little buggers and used its head for bait. Maybe it would last longer than the bunker chunks.

I left the bluefish head out for a long time. After about 30 minutes, I reeled it in for inspection. The little buggers had chewed it up some, but there was still some meat left. Since bunker chunks were only lasting

a minute or two, I cast the head back out and waited. I was getting really pessimistic. I gave up trying to keep the bunker on the hooks and sat down on my beach cart for a rest.

The sound of the clicker woke me abruptly! The rod was bowed and bucking in the sand spike as the bluefish head went for a ride. I grabbed the rod and set the drag. My first impression was big stingray. The brute was on a long, steady run that went a good 60-70 yards. I kept inching up the drag, cursing the winged demon that had so rudely interrupted my nap. Finally it stopped and turned back toward the beach. I reclaimed about half the line, but then it went on another run. This one was shorter and soon I was reclaiming line again. Now it was coming in, but heading down the beach. Again I thought, damned stingray. So did two guys down the beach from Delaware, who had been watching with glee after battling a few stingrays themselves.

Now it was getting into some shallower water and, for the first time, I felt the brute shake its head. I caught a glimpse of what looked like a fin and thought it must be a big shark! Then I clearly saw the tail. **Holy Cow!** It was a **drum** and it had to be a big one!! I quickly



eased off on the drag and prayed the hook would not pull out. After a few hair-raising minutes, "Bubba" was on the sand. We measured, weighed and tagged Bubba and quickly returned it to the water. The drum was 51" long and scaled out at 58 pounds!! My biggest drum ever. What a magnificent animal!

After casting out new baits, I returned to my seat on the cart not really caring if another fish bit. Such is the feeling of total, unequivocal satisfaction. As I sat on the cart, I noticed the stiff, northeast wind was blowing an object onto the beach. A few minutes later, it washed up at my feet. It was a **Mickey Mouse** party balloon. One side was pretty weather beaten. The other side had the inscriptions "**Gotta hand it to ya**" and "**You did it**"! Indeed I had. I gathered my gear and the balloon and went home.


