all over the west? They had become used to eluding inept local posses and weren't quite prepared to deal with these new guys on their trail. Well listen up, old timers, 'cause there are some new "Pinkertons" in the club, and they are hot on your heels! I'm not suggesting you jump off a cliff into the river and flee to Colombia, but you might want to tighten up a bit and start catchin' some better fish!

Case in point, the April Angler of the Month was new guy **Rich McDaniel**, who took first and third in the competition! Rich's winning entry was a new club record 4-10 rainbow trout caught on 2-fly from a pond in King William county that scored 616 points! He went back the next day and released a 6-2 largemouth bass on 2 general that scored 350 points! Second place went to **Fred Murray** for his 44-0 blue catfish on 4-general that scored 478 points. Congratulations Rich and Fred!!

Another new guy, **Lud Kimbrough**, had a super day on a pond in King and Queen County. Lud caught several bass and crappie on 4 fly. The bass were just under 2 pounds and the crappie were about a pound each. But the fish of the day for Lud was a 4-0 chain pickerel that munched a clouser presented on 4-fly! 400 points and a new club record, not bad for a day on the pond!

The new 2-plug class is getting plenty of attention. Another new guy, **Travis Henderson**, set the yellow perch record



with a 0-8. **Bruce Henderson** took over the largemouth bass record with a 3-4. **Elly Robinson** grabbed the crappie record with a 1-8 and the hickory shad record with a 1-14. Elly had the sunfish record with a 0-11 for about 10 days, until **Robbie Robinson** beat it with a 0-13.

A few white perch have showed up. **Robbie Robinson** released 0-14 and 0-15 perch on 2-spin that were caught in the James. **Rich McDaniel** caught a 0-14 in the Rappahannock. The shad run is on in the James. Several members have recorded hickories to 2-0 so far. They also report American shad to about 5 pounds in the James, but these are not legal club entries and may not be kept in your possession. The Nottoway remains high and unfishable. The club trout outing on Dunlop Creek was lots of fun, with a few small brooks and browns and rainbows to 2-0 caught in very uncrowded conditions.

(Commentary from the President - John Wetlaufer)



This fine fly fishing rod was won by Stuart Lee in the raffle which netted the club \$390. Thanks to all who took a chance on this rod.

Lynn Spurlin and your president were summoned to specially called meeting of the Department of Game and Inland Fisheries Director's Advisory Board. This board is comprised of volunteer members who represent hunting groups, angling groups, bird watching groups and many other groups who take advantage of the wonderful outdoor facilities and recreational opportunities which are so aptly managed by the DGIF. The DGIF uses the board as a sounding board for new ideas, etc. and as a way to get information out to the groups represented. Lynn and I represent the Virginia Anglers Club on this board.

The meeting was called to hear a proposal by Ken Parr who is with the Virginia Wild Turkey Federation. Ken's proposed the establishment of a web site thru which timely information about pending legislation and other items of interest can be easily made available and responded to by sportsmen and outdoor enthusiasts. site will allow members to be proactive in their response by early posting of legislation as it is due for consideration in the months to come. Links to other sites of interests, links to members of the Virginia General Assembly, chat rooms where site members can present and exchange opinions and many other useful features were proposed. Ken has received a sizable grant from the National Wild Turkey Foundation to be used for establishing the site and maintaining it for a number of years. The proposed name at the moment is Sportsmen for Virginia. A non-profit limited liability corporation (LLC) will be established to provide oversight and management of the site, compete with a 6-member board of directors and an executive committee.

Membership in the website will be free and by individual sign-up. Those using the site will have secure access by password.

Membership data will remain with the site and not be sold. Len and I will keep the VAC membership up to date as the formation of this site progresses. One nice feature I saw was that if a user has an opinion of a piece of legislation (which will be posted as soon or earlier than submitted), a simple process will allow you to find your representatives, created an e-mail message addressed to him/her and share you opinion, all with couple of key strokes.

The VAC Board of Directors approved the 2003 club budget at the April BOD Meeting. Expenses for the year are projected at roughly \$11,000. Twenty percent of this is for conservation and legislation related items. Details are available from the treasurer.



# Eastern Shore Red Drum / Flounder May 31 & June 1, 2003

Location: Barrier Island surf and inlets, Eastern Shore, Va.

Awards: 1 cup for the highest point red drum in the surf (must be

released).

1 cup for the highest point other species (surf or boat -100

point minimum).

Bait: You will need to provide your own. Top spring drum bait is peeler crab. Other choices are fresh spot, bunker or bluefish. Minnows & squid are always a good bet for flounder. Try Chris' bait & tackle at Edgewood Motel (757-331-3632).

Launches: For Smith & Myrtle islands - Shell ramp on Inter-coastal waterway is now closed. Use mud ramp at Raccoon Creek for johnboats, or Kiptopeke State Park ramp for larger boats. Also, larger boats can use public ramp at Oyster (if you know

the way across South Bay).

For Wreck & Cobb islands use public ramps at Oyster or Willis Wharf.

Tips: Fish upper ends of inlets and creek mouths for flounder. Good spring spots include Big Ebb Drain, Ship Shoal Inlet and the inter-coastal near Oyster. Just look for the boats! Hit the beaches about two hours before through two hours after low water for drum. Then try flounder again on the rising tide. If you are only interested in drum, they bite on all tides.

Tides for Ship Shoal Inlet are: Saturday (H) 9:21 am, (L) 3:04 pm & Sunday (H) 10:00 am, (L) 3:43 pm. Be sure to pay attention to the tides when running and anchoring. Call Dennis for fishing report and bait availability at 757-331-3037.

about 7 pm on Saturday. Please call ahead to help us with a count and to get directions if you need them.

## Light Tackle and Fly fishing for Grey Trout and Rockfish

Cory Routh works for the Virginia Marine Resources Commission and serves as coordinator for the Virginia Saltwater Recreational Fishing Development Fund. Cory is an avid saltwater fly angler with over 15 years of fly-fishing experience. Cory's favorite fishing haunts are the CBBT, Lynnhaven Inlet, and the Eastern Shore. Cory will share his secrets for grey trout and rockfish on fly and light tackle.

# **Deep Water and Structure for Large Flounder**
