The public hearing at which inperson comments can be made will be held on September 8, 2003, at the offices of the Virginia Marine Resource Commission in Newport News, VA and will start at 7:00 PM. There are 12 projects up for consideration. The scopes range from \$830 for a youth fishing tournament to \$300,000 for repairs and extension of the Cape Charles (VA) Fun Pier. The total value of the projects listed is about \$1,157,000. Those funds do not come from some mysterious part of the General Fund of Virginia. They come right from your wallet in your hip pocket.

One project the VAC Board of Directors really questions is project "J" on the list, "An Assessment of Economic Importance of Virginia's Commercial and Recreational Fisheries". Funding proposed to be granted to VIMS for this assessment amounts to \$235,241. On the surface this project appears to be structure that has been fished many times before and might be a study of studies. If this proposed project catches your attention, check out the complete list of projects at the link noted above.

Copies of the proposed 2004 VAC Tournament Schedule will be available at the August Membership Meeting. Angling Activities Chairman Bob Brown has put this draft listing of 2004 tournaments together with the intent of getting as much input and as many comments as possible from the membership. July angler of the month honors went to **Bruce**Henderson for a 27-0 barracuda caught on 6spin that scored 415 points. But that wasn't the best cuda on the boat that day! Jennifer

Henderson's 39-0 on 8-plug that scored 487 was nearly the best fish entered for the club since June and one of the best ever in the spouse competition!! Second place for July went to **Buddy Noland** for a 4-14 spadefish on 2-plug that scored 325 points. Buddy's spade is the first ever entered on 2-plug. We had a three-way tie for third that was won by **Scott Davis** with a 4-8 black sea bass on 4-plug that scored 300 points. Scott's new club record black sea bass was caught 15 days earlier than **Danny Noland's** identical bass! Scott also had a 6-0 flounder on 4-general that scored 300 points.

So, what was the top fish entered since June? How about a 25-0 flathead on 4-general that earned **Bob Brown** a new club record!! The real skill in that catch just may have been finding a day when the James was fishable! Congratulations Bob. Only two other freshwater catches to report. **Kelly Stafford** tapped a private pond for another nice largemouth. Too bad he didn't take a 12-pound scale on the trip. He gets credit for a 6-0 on 4-plug worth 300 points! **Eddy Johnston** upped the ante to 430 points for best gar of the year with a 14-0 on 2-general.

Saltwater action has been pretty good in spite of an endless parade of thunderstorms, rain and cold water. **Scott Davis** released several amberjacks, headed by a 25-0 on 8-plug scoring 277 points. **Dr. Jim Wright** turned in 7 AJ releases on heavy tackle. His AJs were all between 44 to 51 inches! **Buddy** and **Danny Noland** scored on black sea bass and spadefish on several offshore trips. In addition to the above fish, Buddy had a 4-4 on 4-plug. Buddy also tapped the Texaco wreck for a nice 5-0 flounder on 6-general.

Reggie White leads the cobia race with a 33-0 on 8-general. Scott Johnston regained one of his croaker records from yours truly with a 2-0 on 8-fly. Some nice red snapper have been caught at Ocracoke. Bill DuVal caught a 10-8 on 12-general in July, and Scott Davis bested it with an 11-4 in August. Dr. Jim Wright took over the club record for spadefish on 12-general with a 9-4 from the Anglo-African wreck. Lud Kimbrough had the most unusual catch of the month, which was a 5-2 tautog on 4-spin! The tog was caught on a crankbait at Windmill Point!

One way to escape the cold local water is to head for Florida. **Bill DuVal** did just that in July. In my book, it was a good choice, since he returned with three more club records! Bill set records for snook and little tunny. His snook were 17-0 on 16-general and 26-0 on 30-general. The 26-0 now leads in the "Lunker Club" as the largest snook ever entered by a club member, surpassing an



18-0 by **Dick Stephenson** caught many years ago. Bill's little tunny was an 18-8 caught on 30-general.

Speaking of the Lunker Club, the all-time list that is compiled and published in the newsletter is simply taken from the existing club record sheets and corrected for any new entries. In the event of ties, the first caught fish is the one listed. A final note – think about what you want or need to catch over the next few months. Angler of the year competition could be wide open this year, as there are several members with a few good fish!!

Record State Bigeye Tuna Landed

A 285 lb. 12 oz. Bigeye tuna caught on August 12, 2003 by Melvin Bray of Dumfries, VA has been certified as the new Virginia State record by the Virginia Saltwater Fishing Tournament. Bray, who is the mayor of Dumfries, caught his fish at the Norfolk Canyon while fishing with Captain Danny Defreitas on the Hyltonian.

The bigeye, which measured 81 inches in length and had a girth of 55.5 inches, struck a ballyhoo trolled from an 80-pound class rod and reel spooled with 80-pound test

line. The fish was hooked at approximately 12:30 p.m. and was not boated until 3 hours and 45 minutes later.

"We had just lost a big tuna that had been hooked for just over two hours, when this fish hit," Capt. Defreitas said. In describing the fight Bray stated that the mate was still putting the baits back out when the fish hit, so he grabbed the rod, got in the fighting chair and started to fight the fish. Bray had to endure a driving rain squall and the steamy heat in its aftermath during the nearly four-hour battle.

"The crew was great, they wouldn't let me stop fighting that fish," Bray stated. Defreitas said that the mate had the leader in hand three different times before finally being able to land the fish.

The prior state record of 279 pounds was caught at the Norfolk Canyon by Shaw Hergenrather of Sterling, VA on August 7, 1999.



Tip-Of-The-Day – Fish hook Removal

First remove hook from lure or attached line. Make a loop from 20-pound test line or heavier and tie the ends securely together. Place the loop around the back of the wrist and out between the thumb and forefinger.

Place the loop over the eye of the hook and center it in the middle of the curved part of the hook. With the thumb of the other hand, press down firmly on the eye of the hook and steady it from wobbling. Tighten-up slightly on the loop. In this position, the wound spreads open a bit and the barb has very little bite.

Now while applying downward pressure on the eye of the hook, give a sharp jerk on the loop. This will pop the hook out in much the same direction it entered.



Other hints:

Apply ice or cold water to the general area of the wound to deaden feeling before you begin. Pop the hook out fast and hard, in one motion. If removing hook from another person, it's best to have them look the other way while you work. If snagged with a hook, see a doctor for a tetanus shot.

The information you put into the site when you join will at no time be shared, sold or otherwise distributed. There are no costs associated with joining or using the website of the Sportsmen of Virginia.

A very useful feature of the web site is the ability to, with a couple of clicks, contact your Legislators via pre addressed e-mail with a text box ready for your message to that person. There are also chat rooms and many useful links, lists and calendars on the site that will be of interest to you as an angler.

The Virginia Anglers Club has endorsed Sportsmen of Virginia. Two VAC members have been associated with the formation of the Sportsmen of Virginia from the very beginning. Lynn Spurlin is a member of the SOV Advisory Board, an active Committee Chairman and represents the Fly Fishers of VA on the Advisory Board. John Wetlaufer, Sr. is a Director and the Secretary of the Sportsmen of Virginia and he represents the Virginia Anglers Club.
