VAC Surf Fishing Team Places in the Top Third

The VAC Surf Fishing Team finished 41st out of 120 teams in the recent 48th Annual Invitational Cape Hatteras Angler's Club Surf Fishing Tournament. The event was held in the Buxton, NC area on November 3 & 4. Lead by the fish catching ability of Gary Martel, the team consisted of VAC members Lynn Spurlin, Quentin Corbett, and Tom Johnson. Quentin's brother, Billy Corbett, and Capt. Russ Cress rounded out the team. All the members fished hard and caught numerous fish from the surf in four different positions over a two day stretch. This tournament is now listed in the Guiness Book of World Records as the largest surf fishing tournament in the world and is perhaps the premiere surf fishing tournament on the East Coast. The team looks forward to improving its position in next year's tournament.

Spots, Spots and more Spots By Elly Robinson

If it didn't have spots on it or it wasn't a Spot it wasn't caught by club members in the past month or so. Well that isn't 100% true but almost.

This is the first year that Spot (the fish) is being recognized as a species in our club and **Scott Johnson** had been trying

to get the early club records during the summer. But as everyone knows the big Spots are caught in the fall. And the best places are the mouth of the Rappahannock River, the area from the M&M Bridge to the Hampton Bridge Tunnel, Lynnhaven Inlet and Rudee Inlet. Well, Dr. James Wright has emerged as the spot king with a reported 300 fish catch over several weeks in Lynnhaven. His heaviest citation was 11b. 6oz. and he also had a 13 1/4 inch release citation. Dr. Wright had 6 club records topped off by a 1lb. 2oz. spot on 2 spin for 417 points. Fishbite bloodworms was the ticket for Dr. Wrights success. Scott Johnston had a club record 10 oz. Spot on 6 fly. **Robbie Robinson** had a club record 1-0 Spot on 4 general. Elly Robinson had several fly and general division club record Spots with a 1lb. on 2 fly for 476 points topping the list and claiming the species lead, the fly division lead and 1st and only place in the Angler of the Month contest at the October club meeting (nobody else turned in any cards!).


Spotted Seatrout were the next most entered species by club members. Our master speckled trout catcher Larry Allen almost took the species point lead from **Fred Cousins** on Oct. 1st with a 3lb one on 2 spin which also won the club tournament. Dennis Cline bested Fred and Larry on Oct. 11th with a 3lb. 6 oz. on 2 spin. Dennis, frustrated by the water and wind conditions on the eastern shore and lack of Red Drum in the surf early in in Sept., had switched to targeting the speckles. Dennis also had a 2lb. 2oz. on 2 fly and a 2lb. 8 oz. on 2 spin on Oct. 6th. But Dennis' species lead was short lived. **Elly and Robbie Robinson** ventured to Rudee Inlet on Oct. 27th with the intent of targeting Spot but found the Spot gone and the speckled trout plentiful and larger than a week earlier. Out of 61 trout landed on 2lb spin and plug, 15 were 17" or better, Robbie caught all the big trout at or over 3lbs. and came away with the species leader, at least for the time being, of 3lbs 11ozs on 2 spin. Word has it that **Parks Rountrey** is fishing every day in the surf at Nags Head and going after the big speckled trout hoping to get the elusive 150 point surf catch and maybe beat Robbie's 245 point trout. He has experienced several 50+ trout days so far with 2lbs. 12ozs. being his best fish.

News flash: **Bob Shepherd** took off from work and hustled down to fish with Parks and kept fishing when Parks called it a day. You guessed it, while Parks snoozed Bob dined and wound up with a 3 lb. 7 oz. speckled trout in the surf!!!!!!!! Second news flash: Fred Cousins has reclaimed the species lead with a fantastic citation 5lb. 9oz. speckle on 2 spin for 370 points from the Hot Ditch on November 5th. Congratulations Fred!!

And then there is the Red Drum, the drum with one or more spots on each side of their bodies. **Dennis Cline** has stayed with it and finally achieved success on both puppy drum and the big bulls. It took till late Sept. to find the little ones and Dennis caught Reds of 13, 15 and 16 lbs. in the surf on Sept. 29th. On Oct. 19th he hit the jackpot with Reds of 35, 37,

37, 44 and 47 lbs. and a 39 lb. drum the next day. All were caught in the surf while Dennis was fishing alone. People would have paid money to see that exhibition of angling excellence.

Several other notable fish have been caught. **Dr. James Wright** had a 45" Cravelle Jack release at the Light Tower on a live spot and a 2 lb. 5 oz. Croaker on Fishbites bloodworm. **Lynn Spurlin** went to Oak Orchard NY. and had a 12 lb. brown trout on 12 fly. This was the only brown Lynn saw and he was successful in getting it to eat and then landing it. You ought to see the beautiful picture of the trout that Lynn has! Everything else that Lynn hooked were salmon. **Darnley Adamson** also went with Lynn to Oak Orchard and was 1 for 1 on brown trout but I haven't received his card yet. And **Fred Cousins** struck again with a new species leader, catching a 3lb. 14oz largemouth bass on 2 spin for 258 points at Lee Hall.



And finally I figured out what those yells were I heard on successive days after the Virginia Tech victory over Boston College. **Buddy and Danny Noland** and **Ricky Dale** were beaten by **David English** on a New River smallmouth float trip on the 1St day. David's Smally was 2lbs. 4ozs. on 6 spin. I understand it wasn't even close which makes it the second time it has happened this year. David also did it on a trip with **Norman Miller** out of Ocracoke . And on day two it was yells of joy *Continued on Page 3...*

when the boys caught several really nice rainbows on fly on Johns Creek at the Maggie farm. Buddy had a 6lb. 4oz bow on 4 fly and a 7lb one on 8 fly, a club record. Danny had a 7lb 8oz bow on 4 fly and Ricky had a 7lb 8oz bow on 12 fly, another club record. Danny's 694 point fish was leader of the pack. The stream is again open but the flow is low. The farm is in the process of being sold and turned into a luxury golfing resort. We are not sure if the stream will be open to fishermen once the sale is finalized. So if you need a rainbow on fly better act now. There were also some nice brown trout seen but not caught. The fishing will be tough on Johns Creek in the coming few months as the rainbows move into their spawning period and they get very picky. The browns are spawning now. The low crystal clear water doesn't help either.



Time is running out on the 2005 Angling Year. Remember to get your November catches postmarked or in the hands of a club director or the Angling Rules Chairman by Dec. 10th. For the Joe Brooks Angler of the Year awards, members who are competing for the awards must complete the award form and submit to the Angling Rules Chairman, **Elly Robinson**, before Dec. 21st. The New Member Angler of the Year award submission forms must be given to the Angling Rules Chairman before Dec 21st also.



ANGLING RULES CLARIFICATION

WHAT ARE ARTIFICIAL AND NATURAL BAITS AS THEY RELATE TO SPIN / PLUG DIVISION AND GENERAL DIVISION?

As many club members are aware, the Angling Rules Committee and the Board of Directors have been engaged in a lengthy review and discussion of how to classify the emerging array of baits and lures with particular attention focused on Fishbites®*, including their artificial bloodworm product. The question basically was, are these types of baits eligible for inclusion in Spin and Plug divisions or are they only eligible for the General division? This discussion eventually lead to a review of the Angling Rules' Section 5: Tackle and Method Specifications, Sub Section (D): Tackle and Methods which is on page 3 of the Angling Rules. Within this subsection is a table, which basically states, that for bait type the Spin and Plug divisions require artificial bait types and the General division can use either artificial or natural bait types.

After much discussion and some attempts at expanding the angling rules to try to provide clarification embedded within the angling rules, it has been decided that the Angling Rules have served the club very well for years and don't need to be changed to address this situation. Instead, what was needed was to communicate and educate club members as to how to apply our angling rules when questions arise. Therefore, going forward when questions arise and or entry cards are disqualified or changed, the Angling Rules Chairman will provide clarifications and explanations at the monthly Membership Meetings and in the VAC newsletter, The Angler. On some occasions the Angling Rules will be changed out of necessity. These changes will be communicated in *The Angler* and our Angling Rules will be revised and distributed to members in the annual membership information package.

The Board of Directors has determined that Fishbites® and the associated bloodworm Fishbites® are artificial bait types and can be entered in the Spin and Plug divisions provided all other rules are met concerning Spin and Plug divisions. If a member wants to use Fishbites® and enter a catch in the General division, the member must conform to the General division rules and or not conform to the Spin and Plug division requirements. An example might help with the understanding. If I am fishing for saltwater fish with a spinning outfit using an artificial bait type but rigged my rod with a leader longer than the distance from the

rod tip to the middle of the reel seat, I am fishing in the General division. If I am again fishing with a spinning outfit using an artificial bait and short conforming leader, make my cast in an orthodox manner but put my rod down in a rod holder or against the railing, I have not cast and retrieved in an orthodox manner and have therefore moved any fish I might catch with that cast to the General division.

Typical artificial bait types are hard plastic plugs, jigs made with bucktail or other materials not intended to entangle fish and often with soft plastic tails added for additional attractant, soft plastic baits like Storm shads, Fin-S and Sassy shads and various types of worms and lizards and flukes and grubs including Power Grubs and Gulp Baits, metal jigging lures like Hopkins lures and blade type baits like silver buddies and crazy blades. Scented bait types and spray on scents are allowable unless they are made from fish oils, and materials coming from creatures like shrimp, squid, clams etc. Fishbites® were considered artificial because they are made from non-natural materials.

Typical natural bait types are all live (still kicking or recently deceased) baits (either whole, almost whole or parts as in chunks or strips) like minnows, frogs, crickets, worms, grubs, squid, spot, croakers, bluefish, sunfish, shad, bunker, bloodworms and the list goes on and on.

Something to keep in mind, if you are fishing in freshwater, the I. G. F. A. rules limit leader to 6 feet, double line to 6 feet and the combined length of double line and leader to 10 feet. All club entries must conform to I.G.F.A. angling rules for entry into the General division. If an entry is to be made in the Spin or Plug divisions, the VAC angling rules for those divisions must be complied with as well as I.G.F.A. rules.

Anglers with questions regarding any element of the angling rules should contact the Angling Rules Chairman who will provide guidance on the spot or gain clarification from the Board of Directors.

ANGLING RULE CHANGES FOR THE 2006 ANGLING YEAR

Changes to the Angling Rules and Rating Requirements of the Virginia Anglers Club are based on the input from club members and the Angling Rules Chairman. The Angling Rules Chairman brings the recommended changes to the Board of Directors where the suggested changes are discussed and are voted for acceptance or rejection. The changes that are accepted are first communicated to the membership via a summary of the changes in the November *Angler.* The full text of changes is found in copies of the revised Angling Rules that are included in the Member Packages handed out at the Annual Banquet. A vote by the membership is not required for changes in angling rules. A vote by the membership is required for changes in the Articles of Incorporation and the By Laws of the Club.

This year the Angling Rules Chairman formed a committee to assist in developing the rules changes that was proposed to the Board.

A summary of the changes in our Angling Rules (AR) and Virginia Anglers Club Rating Requirements passed by the Board of Directors appears below. Changes are numbered sequentially for convenience of identification and become effective December 1, 2005, the first day of the 2006 Angling Year.

CHANGES IN ANGLING RULES

- **1. AR 2 ANGLING ACTIVITY:** = In the first sentence drop "championships, prizes and points" and add "ratings, awards and tournaments" In the second sentence, <u>delete</u> "badge ratings and awards" and add "ratings, awards and tournaments" (Formally recognizes dropping the practice to award cloth badges for various angling ratings and wordsmithing the terminology to that used in the club today).
- **2. AR 4 RE- INSTATED MEMBERS:** = <u>Delete</u> "BADGE" and <u>replace</u> it with "RATING" (Formally recognizes dropping the practice to award cloth badges for various angling ratings).
- 3. AR 5(A) GENERAL: = Delete the word "(ATTACHED)" at the end of the first sentence in this section.
- 4. AR 5(D) GENERAL: = In footnote (***) insert "THE" between the words "PREVENT" and "ANGLER".
- **5.** <u>AR 6 WEIGHING</u> = Add section 4(B) stating, "IF A DIGITAL SCALE IS USED, RECORD THE READING INCLUDING THE DECIMAL FRACTION ON THE "LBS." LINE OF THE SCORECARD. DECIMAL READINGS WILL BE ROUNDED DOWNWARD TO THE NEAREST OUNCE FOR THE PURPOSE OF DETERMINING POINTS AND CLUB RECORDS."
- **6.** AR 6 (4B) WEIGHING = Change the section to 4 (C) and change the first sentence to read "THE WEIGHT OF THE SLING, PLATFORM OR NET (IF ONE IS USED TO SECURE THE FISH ON THE SCALE) MUST BE DETERMINED IMMEDIATELY AFTER WEIGHING THE FISH, <u>USING THE SAME SCALE</u> AND DEDUCTED FROM THE TOTAL WEIGHT" (the objective of this rule change is to achieve the most accurate weight of the fish that is possible).
- 7. AR 14D ANGLER OF THE YEAR AWARD = In the introductory paragraph, add award names and delete "IN FRESHWATER, SALTWATER AND OVERALL".
- 8. AR 14D ANGLER OF THE YEAR AWARD = <u>Add</u> three new dotted sections as follows:
 - IN SALTWATER, ONE ENTRY PER DIVISION (5) ALLOWED BUT NOT MANDATORY. WINNER HAS MOST CUMULATIVE POINTS.
 - IN FRESHWATER, ONE ENTRY PER DIVISION (4) BUT NOT MANDATORY PLUS ONE OPTIONAL ENTRY ONCE EACH OF THE FOUR DIVISION ENTRIES ARE MADE. WINNER HAS THE MOST CUMULATIVE POINTS.
 - "JOE BROOKS" WINNER DETERMINED BY ADDING FRESHWATER AND SALTWATER TOTAL CUMULATIVE POINTS.

CHANGES IN RATING REQUIREMENTS

- 1. <u>Delete</u> words "GREEN BADGE" (page 1) and "YELLOW BADGE" (page 2) (Formally recognizes dropping the practice to award cloth badges for various angling ratings).
- 2. In the Fresh Water Angler rating requirements section, in A2, <u>delete</u> "COHO SALMON" and <u>renumber</u> subsequent sections to reflect deletion.
- 3. In the Fresh Water Angler rating requirements section, in B, line 8, <u>replace</u> "SALMON, ATLANTIC" with "SALMON, COHO".
