

Membership Packages

Dennis has been keeping the records for the last 11 years and as an Angling Rules turnover gift to the club he has printed out the past 11 years of entry cards for each angler. This document should be kept by each member and

used as a reference document when submitting rating applications like Angler, Fresh and Salt Water Expert, Division Experts and Master Angler. Back in 1995 when the record system was converted from a company computer to Dennis's computer a similar master list of all entry cards was given to each member. Scale Certification

Scales will be certified at the February meeting. Please present your scales in a Ziploc or similar bags with your name on a card inside the bag or written on the bag. Scales will be ready for pick-up at the close of the meeting. **Note:** Too many scales are disqualified because of poor condition. Be sure your scales are clean and in good working order. If you seriously plan to use your scales for IGFA entry purposes, please request that the special IGFA certification be made for a particular scale(s). We try to avoid "just in case" IGFA certification.

Basic Weight Charts

The Freshwater Basic Weight Chart distributed in the membership package has one set of errors in it. The Dolly Varden specie basic weights are wrong. Dolly Varden is a new addition to our freshwater species list. The correct basic weights for Dolly Varden were published in the November 2005 Newsletter. The correct basic weights will be used when any Dolly Varden entry cards are processed by the Angling Rules Chairman.

CATCHY COMMENTS

The catching keeps right on happening for many club members. Freshwater and saltwater, it just doesn't matter as good quality fish continue to be caught in all tackle divisions with several club records thrown in the mix.

Let's start is saltwater. The striper bite had been hot in the ocean off Oregon Inlet so **Bruce Henderson** decided it was time for a trip and invited **Mickey Kodroff** and I along. Winds were light and temps icy the morning of February 2nd when we left Manteo. At the inlet we encountered a bad inlet even with an incoming tide – reason was apparent when we got outside, 4 to 5 foot swells from the southeast. As the day wore on we covered 170 miles by sea looking for the stripers. Never saw a single gull or gannett dive. Worked south to Rodanthe and as far north as Corolla. Only fish we caught were at the 102 Tower where we found a Black Sea Bass bite and we all caught nice ones. Bruce's was best at

4lb. 10oz. on 6 plug for 342 points. Mickey's was next at 3lb. 6oz on 4 spin for 306 points. I had a 3lb. 3oz. on 4 spin. Bruce's fish is the new Plug Division leader.

Robbie Robinson and I have been hitting the Chickahominy River several times when the winds are light and days warm. Fishing has been good some days and poor others. Best fish have been caught down in the stump bend before the docks on the left in 8 to 13 feet of water. We hit a good school of Yellow Perch on January 27th and I had a 1lb. 2oz. and 1lb. 1oz. on 2 spin. Robbie had a 14 oz Yellow Perch and 1lb. 5oz. Crappie on 2 plug the same day. On January 20th I had a 1lb. 5oz. Crappie on 2 plug. We have also caught several stripers to 10lbs up at the dam.

Scott Johnston and I fished the Dragon Run in January and had a very good day on an outgoing tide. No fish worth entering were caught but we had an assortment of 40 largemouth bass, pickerel and yellow perch all caught on one point. If you have never fished the run it's worth a trip. Just be careful of the mud flats and stump beds as you go up stream.

Robbie Robinson has been fly fishing in my pond late in the afternoons on calm days regardless of the air temperatures. After trying poppers which had historically been successful in the winter he switched to dry flies after seeing fish rising and taking little brown bugs off the surface. Many afternoons he has been able to catch over 20 sunfish and crappie by very slowly retrieving the dry fly over or just under the surface. Best fish so far are a 12oz. sunfish and 14oz crappie on 2 fly.

Fred Cousins and an assortment of club members have been fishing the Hot Ditch with fair to excellent results. Fred has the best Spotted Seatrout so far with a 5lb. 2oz speckle on 2 spin for 341 points. Fred recently went back to the Hot Ditch and caught a White Perch that weighed 15 oz on 2 spin for 246 points

Mike Ostrander invited me to fish Taylor's pond in West Point on February 10th, a windy cold day just before the snow storm. Fishing was fantastic with Mike catching 31 Largemouth Bass to 6lb. 12oz. and 3 Pickerel to 2lb. 14oz. Most were caught on 4" Yamasenko worms in smoke with no flake Texas rigged. I was lucky enough to catch the Master Angler required Largemouth Bass of 7lb. 12oz. on 12 plug for 193 points which was also a club record. Mike's fishing superiority showed as I could only manage 15 bass and 1 pike. All I have left for Master Angler now is the tarpon on fly.


Mike Cline took over the Crappie lead with a 1lb 7oz on 2 spin for 228 points while fishing the Chickahominy River at the stump bend in January.

Eddie Johnston and **Tony Horsley** fished the Chickahominy River in early February and Eddie had a 1lb. 7oz. Pickerel on 2 spin for 143 points while Tony had an 11oz. Yellow Perch and 1lb. 11oz. Pickerel both on 4 spin for 149 and 124 points respectively.

Only one trip was made to Johns Creek in the last month that I know of and that belonged to **Scott Johnston** and **Lynn Spurlin**. They picked 2 cold days but came away with some nice fish. Scott had Brown Trout of 2lb. and 2 lb. 4oz. on 4 and 6 fly, Brook Trout of 2lb. 4oz. and 2lb. 14oz. on 4 and 12 fly – the latter a club record, and a 6lb. 12oz. Rainbow on 4 fly. Lynn had a 7lb Rainbow on 8 fly and a 2lb. 11oz. Brook Trout on 4 fly.

Mike Ostrander has been helping several club members catch some nice fish. **Rich McDaniel** had a 37lb. Blue Cat on 4 general for 394 points and **Lynn Spurlin** had a 38lb. Blue Cat on 12 general, both caught in the James River. Lynn also had a 1lb. 4oz. Crappie on 4 general to top off the trip, one of 60 crappie caught that day.

In some ocean striper fishing **Bruce Henderson** caught a 15lb. 12oz. striper on 6 fly for 315 points. I sense Bruce is going after the Saltwater Angler of Year Award !!! **LeRoy Houser** fished off Va. Beach and landed a club record 40lb. 8oz. Striped Bass on 16 plug for 289 points.

And finally **Dr. Jim Wright** has been catching Va. Citations left and right! The citations were for a 42lb. striper, 5lb. 2oz. Black Sea Bass, 5lb. 6oz. Spotted Seatrout and a striper length release.

What a month! And we now move into the hot part of the fishing year !!!!!!!
