# May Membership Meeting – Fly Fishing Cost Rica and Belize

Robert Thomas will present a program illustrated with pictures from two separate fly-fishing trips taken in 2005 down to the Central American countries of Costa Rica and Belize. Rob hosted these trips for Fly Fish The World. Robert led 9 fly anglers to Costa Rica in the spring of 2005 to take advantage of the excellent tarpon and jungle fish species fishing available there. In the fall of 2005, Robert again hosted a group of 6 fly anglers, all of whom fished primarily for bonefish permit, tarpon and barracuda on the flats of Belize. Robert reports these two angling venues are very safe areas and all of the folks living there are very friendly and hospitable. After the formal presentation, Robert will allow plenty of time to answer questions specific to the program or questions about any aspect of flyfishing.

### June Membership Meeting - Angling For Cobia

VAC Members Buddy and Danny Noland will present at the May VAC Membership Meeting a program about angling for cobia. The tackle and bait to use, proven techniques to hook, and likely places to find these energetic fish will be well covered at the May meeting. Got a buddy who likes to cobia fish? Bring him along. # Virginia Anglers Club Life Member Phil Cheatham Passes

Virginia Anglers Club Life Member Phil Cheatham pulled lines for the last time on May 5, 2006. Phil joined the VAC in 1971, after taking up angling at the age of 40. In a touching eulogy at Phil's memorial service, his son Randy noted that Phil was a man of many talents, many of which were unknown to his friends in the VAC. Beyond many active years as an officer of the VAC and an avid supporter of the Order of the Jungle Cock, Phil was an accomplished wood worker, a self-taught clarinetist and saxophonist, a licensed "ham" radio operator, a builder of model airplanes and a fan of the big bands and the music of the 1940's. Those that fished with Phil will probably remember him saying something like "It must be 5 o'clock somewhere in the world" as he opened a "cool one". Phil's VAC Club Record for a 53-8 cobia on 12 # line still stands to this day. During recent years, Phil's health prevented him from attending Club meetings, so he is better known to older members. # Club Member Wins Two Grand Championships in Florida Fishing Tournament

VAC Club Member Tony Horsley was an Overall Grand Champion in the Top Male and Team Guided categories of the Herman Lucerne Fishing Tournament held in the Florida Keys on the weekend of April 30-31, 2006. Captain Mark Gilman shared honors with Gordy in the Team Guided category. The Herman Lucerne Fishing Tournament was initially established in the memory of Herman Lucerne, a man who extensively fished in the Everglades National Part and introduced many young anglers to the sport. The tournament has been called "the most challenging backcountry fishing competition". The event requires teams to pursue bonefish, snook, red fish, trout, snapper, tarpon and black drum/black bass, with the goal being to catch at least one of each species over the two days of the tournament. Essentially, the team with the most inches of fish wins and no fish can count as more than 36 inches long. Any team catching all 6 species receives a bonus of 10 inches. This is an all release tournament with proceeds going to the Homestead Hospital. Congratulations, Tony, for an impressive wins.

# CATCHY COMMENTS by Elly Robinson

The bad news is that our cool, windy spring has kept the number of local saltwater specie catches to a minimum so far. The great news for the Club is that new and younger club members are coming on strong and entering lots of cards. These members are the future of our Club.

Let's start with the Angler of the Month competition from the April meeting. As predicted, John's Creek catches ruled the roost. Young **Ryan Noland** (remember that last name as you will see it quite often this month) came in 1<sup>st</sup> place with his 3-12 brook trout on 2 Fly for 535 points. Uncle **Buddy Noland** took 2<sup>nd</sup> place with a 6-0 Brown Trout on 2 Fly for 468 points. Father **Danny Noland** got 3<sup>rd</sup> place with a 3-0 Brook Trout on 2 Fly worth 428 points. All these fish were caught on a 2-day trip to John's Creek on April 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup>. **Fred Cousins**, trying to add to his 1<sup>st</sup> place catch in the February meeting, came up short again. Fred entered a 1-1 Sunfish on 2 fly for 354 points and a 3-5 Largemouth bass on 2 Fly for 276 points to take 4<sup>th</sup> and 5 places. Only 1<sup>st</sup> thru 3<sup>rd</sup> places count towards the annual Kinnard Angler of the Year competition, awarded to the club member who accumulates the most points in the monthly Angler of the Month contests.

Remember how we heard a lot about the **Nolands, Winstead** and **Doughty** in last months Catchy Comments? Well they were at it again.



**Danny Noland** had a 10-10 Flathead Catfish on 2 Plug for 214 points from the James River on April 6<sup>th</sup> to take the species lead. The James was the location again on April 23<sup>rd</sup> when Danny had a 0-13 White Perch on 2 Fly for 270 points and the species lead, and **Ryan Noland** caught White Perch weighing 0-12 and 0-14 on 2 fly and 4 Fly worth 250 and 236 points.

**Buddy Noland** took out of state member **Steve Luterek** to the James on April 27<sup>th</sup> and Steve had 4 entries – White Perch of 0-9 and 0-10 on 2 Plug and 2 Spin for 148 and 164 points and Hickory Shad of 1-4 and 1-9 on 2 Plug and 2 Spin for 142 and 177 points. Way to go Steve!

**Dean Winstead** hit the Nottoway River on April 8<sup>th</sup> and landed a 1-8 Hickory Shad on 2 Spin using a Road Runner. Then Dean hit a private lake to catch a 2-2 Largemouth Bass on 4 Plug. Not to be out done, **Jeff Doughty** went to Lake Nottoway and caught a 0-14 Crappie on 2 Spin. These two have a friendly battle going on who is going to emerge as "the man" in the VAC!!

Well the cards flooded in from the **Nolands – Doughty – Winstead** trip to Lake Moomaw on April 12<sup>th</sup>. Remember the Yellow Perch had spawned out! Dean entered Yellow Perch of 0-12. 0-14, 1-0 and 1-2 caught on 2 Spin for the ones under a pound and 2 General for the big ones. Jeff had Yellow Perch of 0-12, 1-3 and 1-3 on 2 Spin and 2 General for the 2 big ones and takes the Lunker List lead. Jeff also had a 1-15 Chain Pickerel on 2 General. The old man of the group, **Buddy Noland** had a 1-3 Yellow Perch on 2 General and a nice 5-7 Largemouth Bass on 2 General. I would say the boys had quite a trip and, as the Nolands often do, paved the way for the rest of the club in finding a great place to fish.

**Dr. James Wright** informed me he fished the James with a guide and had 2 citations – a 44 -0 Blue Catfish and a 21-0 Striper.

**Fred Cousins**, kicking into high gear his quest for Freshwater Angler of the Year, fished my pond and landed the pond record Sunfish, a 1-1 on 2 Fly as well as a 3-5 Largemouth Bass on 2 Fly while I was away fishing in Florida. Fred's Sunfish makes the Lunker List and specie lead while the Largemouth takes the specie lead. Fred turned in a card at the May BOD meeting for a 555 point 2-6 Brook Trout caught on fly on 4/27/06 at John's Creek.
