Elly Robinson finished off the month of August in grand fashion by taking all three places in the Angler of the month competition. Elly's third place entry was a potential world record Almaco Jack, 26-8 lbs on 6# gen for 294 points. His second place entry was a nice 16-4 lb African Pompano on 6# spin for 361 points. Elly finished off his AOM sweep with a 29-0 lb Barracuda on 8# spin for 362 points. I was amazed at how humble Elly was after his sweep. I'm sure he will be buying **Bruce Henderson's** dinner this month at the meeting for putting him on all these great fish. These entries scored 1017 points and moved Elly into the lead for Angler of the Year competition with a total of 2129. **Fred Cousins** is still a close second, but Elly is trying to stretch out his lead.

Bruce Henderson finally got to land a couple of fish on his boat this summer out of Hatteras. Bruce turned in a 19-8 lb Barracuda on 6 spin for 300 points and followed that entry up with a 12-0 lb African Pompano for 266 points. **Jennifer Henderson** took the Spouse lead with a 26-0 lb Barracuda on 6# gen for 346 points. That's a great catch Jennifer. If I'm not mistaken, I think Elly had said that you had several Cuda's that day and earned every one due to the rough conditions.

Mike Ostrander gave an excellent program at the August meeting on his techniques for catching giant Catfish on the James. **Fred Murray** also gave us a few tips on catching these big Catfish on Spin, Plug and Fly tackle. **Elly and Robbie Robinson** decided to take advantage of Mike's expertise and fished the upper James with him later in the week. They had several Flatheads, with Elly's 21-12 lb on 4 general for 294 points being the best catch of the day. **Eddie Johnston** took off some time from trying to plan our annual banquet, for a little Gar fishing on the James. Eddie still keeps his title as king of the Gar with a 9-12 lb on 2# general for 283 points.




Fall Speckled Trout Fishing By Capt Mark Horner August 2006

With the air and water cooling, the speckled trout should be on the upswing. These fish will begin to feed more aggressively with fall's cooling weather. Areas to look for are grass beds, oyster bars and various other similar structure. Many of the same techniques used for freshwater fishing, (grubs/Texas rigged worms/Carolina rigs/crank baits/stick baits/etc.) will work on these fish. Fly-fishing for these fish is another method that has been successful. Regardless of the method for getting the lure in the strike zone the colors tend to be the same for all techniques: chartreuse over white/red and white/pumpkin and chartreuse, other variations of these combos tend to work as well.

Being quiet is very important while speckled trout fishing: use of the electric motor or poling the boat is the required means of propulsion. If the wind and tide are working in your favor, drifting the area to be fished is very effective, drifting can be managed by the aide of a drift sock (this can slow your drift). Many times when you locate a school of fish you can quietly anchor the boat and work the area for some time. When flyfishing for these fish the use of a sinking line is very helpful, a 200 or 250 wt. line seems to work best for me, I can cast this line all day without tiring my arm and still get very good distance. The longer cast does allow me to cover more water, which keeps the fly in the feeding zone longer. The fly of choice is the clouser or any streamer that will get down into the feeding zone. When fishing plastics a 1/4 oz jig head seems to work best. Popular places to hunt for these fish are; Mobjack bay area, Poquoson Flats, Hole in the Wall, and Damnron Marsh. Old reliable places such as Windmill Point/North End and Piankatank River do not seem to be producing fish as they did in the past.

It is no secret that the numbers of these fish have been falling for the past few years; this is in no doubt because of the illegal netting practices that occur along the Poquoson Flats and Mobjack Bay area. These fish can be very fickle, one day you get on them and they will feed and the next they will not. Having been able to sight cast to these fish in Texas and Florida really gives one some insight to this eating habit (or lack of). Hope this will help you catch that trophy 5lber.

The View From Up North By Steve Luterek September 2006

As I sit here unable to fish this weekend due to inhospitable weather and water conditions, I thought I would share some New York area fishing statistics I ran across recently ...

In August 2005 the Cabela's Master Walleye Circuit had a stop in Dunkirk, NY, which is the general area I usually fish in, approximately 30 miles west of Buffalo, NY. A record 10 fish basket was weighed in setting a new circuit record of 71.53 pounds.

A 2005 creel census was taken for the various tributaries of Lake Ontario. Region 7 fisheries biologists reported two of the top tributaries for fishing action from September to November were the Salmon River in Oswego County and 18 Mile Creek in the Town of Newfane, Niagara County. 18 Mile creek is about 20 miles west of Oak Orchard towards Buffalo, NY.

The "reel" shocker was with Brown Trout, where 26,266 fish were caught in 18 Mile Creek, the most productive in New York State. Of that number 1,284 were harvested and the balance released. The next closest Brown Trout total was the Salmon River with 5,517, Sandy Creek with 4,844 and Oak Orchard River checked in with 3,329 fish.

For Steelhead, the top stream was the Salmon River with 7,738 fish caught and 1,141 creeled. Not far behind was 18 Mile Creek with 6,476 and Oak Orchard was a close third at 6,136.

In the Salmon department, the Salmon River outproduced the others with 89,441 caught, 25,998 harvested. On 18 mile creek, 11,743 were caught. The statistics for Oak Orchard were not published in this report, but it continues to be a favorite area of some fishermen. Since the state has cut back on stocking efforts in this area, the local charter captain association has been running a pen-rearing project for a good number of years that has started to show larger numbers of fish returning to Oak Orchard every year. My personal best was a 35 - 8, fishing out of a 16' boat casting small spoons on 12 Spin.. That was my pre VAC days; otherwise you would see a card faster than you can say Big Salmon. I've attached a photo for those interested.
