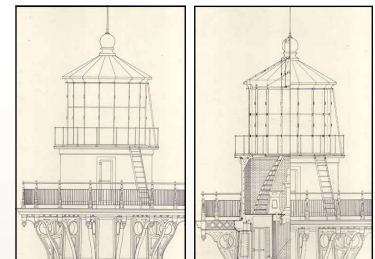
**Honorary Virginia Anglers Club Member

Mark Your Calendars For The Annual Awards Banquet

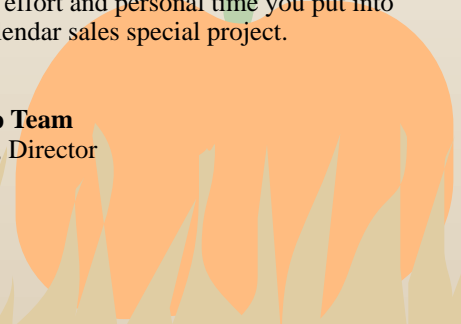

CATCHY COMMENTS

Elly Robinson, for the second month in a row, swept the “Angler of the Month” competition. Elly’s entry for a 21-12 flathead catfish on 4# general, scored 294 points. Elly caught this fish while he and **Robbie** were fishing the James with **Mike Ostrander**. This fish was the only entry I received at the meeting for the AOM competition, so Elly’s “sweep” isn’t as impressive as last months, where he took all three places, but the fact that Elly is fishing, and catching nice fish is impressive. It doesn’t appear many other members are fishing, or at least catching quality fish locally. I hope the program for October, “Fishing local Waters” will get everyone back on the water.

Stuart Lee and LeRoy Houser took a trip to Katella, Alaska in August for some Salmon fishing. Stuart caught a Club Record 14-0 Coho Salmon on 12 fly for 350 points, while LeRoy entered a 12-8 Coho on 12# fly for 312 points. Fishing wasn’t as steady as they would have liked, but the trip alone had to be great.

While Stuart and LeRoy were heading to the Northwest, **Reggie White** was heading up to the Northeast. Reggie took a trip to Labrador, Canada, for some brook trout fishing. Reggie set 3 new club records with an 8-0 brook on 6# fly for 615 points, a 7-4 brook on 12 fly for 329 points, and a 7-12 brookie on 8# fly for 484 points. I hope Reggie took a lot of pictures for the newsletter.

Now, when I look back at these entries, it tells me that we had 4 people fishing or catching quality fish, last month, out of ~130 members. The angling year ends on November 30, which gives us about 6 weeks of fishing left for the 2006 angling year. Have you ever wondered how it seems that the same people walk away with all the awards each year? First, they are the ones that are putting in the most time on the water. Second, they study the yearly entries and plan their remaining trips to maximize their entries. When I look at the entries, the first thing that catches my eye is which species are still available in the area that has not had any entries so far this year. In freshwater, two fish are the walleye and warmouth. Lake Chesdin is known for its walleye fishery, and warmouth are available at many of the lakes such as Prince, Western Branch, and Lake Toano. Next I’d look at the specie that could be beaten if you were to target that fish, such as largemouth bass, currently a 3-5 on 2 fly. A 4-3 on 2# spin or plug would earn more points and someone probably knows of a farm pond with 4 and 5 pound fish in it. The rock bass, smallmouth, and bowfin are also beatable if you were to target them.

Saltwater species still available are red rum, Spanish & king mackerel, tautog and weakfish. Species that could be beaten, appear to be sea bass, striped bass, croaker, and spot. Sit down and figure the weight and tackle that it would take to beat an existing entry, and you might surprise yourself when

you walk away with the cups at the Banquet. It may not be as hard as you think.

It is also time to turn in any angling rating entries that you may have achieved. Already this year, **Elly Robinson** has achieved his Master Angler rating. Take a look and you may have earned a new rating, such as a Division Expert.

Perhaps this time the title should be the view from the south, as I ventured to Richmond for the last week of September and immensely enjoyed the presentation of Dr. Julie Ball at the VAC meeting on September 26. Later in the week I had the pleasure of fishing with Mike Ostrander for the second time. We fished last year in October and I landed a 32 pound Flathead citation, and it was on heavier line than allowed by the club for an entry, but it was still great fun and I have the citation hanging on the wall.

This time we were ready. Digital camera, Calcutta reels, 4 pound, 6 pound, 12 pound line and a lot of enthusiasm. That was probably our downfall, because we only catch the real big ones when not prepared. We drifted and caught about 30 bait fish and when we anchored in "the spot" we were ready. Mike landed a 15 on 4, and being the gentleman he is he let me take a 22 on 12, 18/8 on 6 and 16 on 4. We fished for about 2 hours and landed 9 fish including one channel cat and had a heck of a good time. We left the club record in the river for someone else to catch.

We are still fishing Lake Ontario for Salmon and Steelhead and doing very well fishing out of Oak Orchard. The fishing should be good right into November, but the problem becomes access as most launch ramps pull their docks for the winter.

In about three weeks the boat will be put away and we'll be chasing deer in the woods. With that said, I enclosed a photo and might try some stream fishing this winter Brrrrrrrr. Everyone enjoy the holidays and tight lines.
