DUES MUST BE CURRENT TO HAVE CATCHES RECOGNIZED

Membership dues are due and payable on December 1, 2006. The three month grace period following the date due ends on February 28, 2007. Members must be current in their dues to have entry cards accepted for catches made on or after March 1, 2007. Once the dues are made current, catches made on or after the date the dues are paid, will be counted. Catches in the interim will not be counted. If you received an invoice for dues in the mail around the first of February, you dues were at least 2 months overdue at that time of receipt.

BOARD APPROVES PURCHASE OF BLACKWATER/NOTTAWAY RIVER ATLAS

The Board of Directors of the VAC has authorized the purchase of a copy of The Blackwater/Nottaway River Atlas. This book contains an account of the history, legends and stories of the Blackwater, Nottoway, and Meherrin Rivers, which are included in the Chowan Watershed. The 91-page atlas, which also contains detailed maps of the area, will be featured in a raffle later in the year. Over five years of work went into the writing of this atlas.

CATCHY COMMENTS

Well the weather sure has played a major role in what club members have been able and or willing to catch so far this angling year.

December was mild and calm and a perfect setup for the big stripers and bluefish in the bay and along the eastern shore. Generally it's cold and windy. Then after a nice opening to January, winter set in and local fishing has suffered all the way into mid February. Fresh water catches are way down with limited prospects for improvement any time soon. But sooner or later the big yellow perch will arrive and turn on and everybody will be happy – I hope !! And shad season can't be far away either.

Since **Danny Noland** last wrote this column in early January the biggest local news has to be **Bob Shepherd** taking advantage of **Fred Murray's** wintertime James River cat

fishing expertise to land a 55 lb. bluecat on 6# general for 517 points and a new club record and general division lead. No harm was done as Bob beat his own club record. On the saltwater non local front the big news is that **Bill Duval** has another potential world record caught in Key West. Bill landed a 7 lb. red grouper on 16# fly for 166 points.

The Chickhominy River just hasn't been up to par so far. **Mike Cline**, **Robbie and I** have made several trips down there and Mike has emerged as the stud crappie fisherman with a 1 lb. 1 oz. on 2 plug which takes the species lead and might just win the Grab Bag tournament. Mike's crappie took over the lead from **Scott Johnston** who had previously caught a 12 oz. one on 2 fly from the Chick.

Eddy Johnston must have had a blood transfusion from **Scott Johnston** (those two are related aren't they?) because the two fished the Dragon Run in January and Eddy came away with a 1 lb. 14 oz pickerel on 2 fly. The fish must have been thick and on fire biting that day as I witnessed Eddy at his best a few days later getting skunked on the Chick and he never picked up a fly rod that day. Scott caught a 10 oz. yellow perch on 2 fly that day to take the species lead.

Rounding out freshwater action was **Robbie Robinson** getting bored at home and going down to the pond to catch an Elly's Pond record 4 lb. 15 oz. largemouth bass on 2 spin which wasn't enough to over take **Fred Cousins** species leader. Later Robbie and Fred Cousins got together and went to the Hot Ditch where the white perch were thick and both caught 1-lb'ers on 2 spin with Robbie's coming first to take the species lead.

On the local saltwater front, **Stuart Lee** caught a 28 lb striper on 12 spin for a new club record. Stuart got lost that day according to **Glenn Carter** who was fishing with him and wandered around off Quimby to finally find the fish.

Finally those rich club members who got tired of the turn to winter here headed south to warmer climes and targeted sailfish. Buddy Noland and Ricky Dale (yes Ricky still is kicking and fishing) fished out of Isla Mujeres Mexico and caught their master angler required billfish on 8# general flatline. Both intrepid anglers landed Atlantic sailfish on 8# as well as 2 other sails apiece on 20# general before Buddy begged Ricky to please go in to port as the 12 foot seas had begun to disagree with Buddy's breakfast. Ricky said his sail on 8# must have weighed 80 lbs. and Buddy said his was at least 20 lbs heavier than Ricky's. Ok guys when are you going to complete your master angler journey?? Congratulations on a great accomplishment. Bill Duval, fishing with the world's greatest female angler (maybe you can drop the female cause Norman Miller says Gene can whip anybody on light tackle), went to Golfito, Costa Rica and landed 2 pacific sailfish on 20# general as well as a 5 lb. cubera snapper on 6# general.

Well I hope this time next month I am writing about big yellow perch and many many entry cards. Guys get out there and fish !!!!!!!!!!!!!

Rules: Escatawba is a FLY FISHING ONLY stream, catch and release, Barbless or bent barb hooks only. Please

take great care when handling & releasing the fish.

Comments: Estatawba Farms is a farm located near Covington, Va on Dunlap Creek. It is blessed with a beautiful,

well maintained Trout stream. Derrick Barr stocks the stream with Rainbows, Brook, and Brown trout. The trout are stocked several times a year, and not each day as some trout farms do. Once stocked, these trout must live on the forage base present in the stream, which makes fly fishing very more enjoyable. In the past trips taken to Escatawba by the VAC, fish sizes ranged from 1 to 3 lbs. Anglers can expect to catch from 15-30 fish, depending on your level of skill. Escatawba is a great place for the beginner Fly Fisherman, as every condition you will find on a trout stream is present, riffles, pools, rapids, etc. There are also 3 ponds that are stocked. If you are a beginner fly fisherman, you will have plenty of fellow anglers to instruct

you.

2006 AWARDS

The 2006 Angling year wrapped up with the annual awards banquet at the Virginia Center Crossings. Eddie Johnston planned another great night of good food, great fellowship and awards. Buddy Noland provided his usual Power Point photo recap of the 2006 angling year.

The awards presentation began with Bruce Henderson winning the first cup for a 4-10 Sea Bass on 6 plug. This was followed by Robbie Robinson with a 13-8 Dolphin on 6 gen. Glen Carter was next with a 10 oz Spot on 4 fly, followed by Mike Cline with a 1-12 Crappie on 2 plug. Vic Skakandy won the Surf Division award with a 18-0 Bluefish in the Surf.

Scott Johnston, our fly rod specialist, was the first of the two cup winners with a 1-0 Yellow Perch on 2 fly and a 1-1 croaker on 2 fly. Dean Winstead was next with a 2-10 Hickory Shad on 2 spin and a 15 oz Rock Bass also on 2 spin. Jeff Doughty picked up the next two cups with a 5-14 Bowfin on 4 general and a 1-13 Smallmouth on 4 general. Ryan Noland won the American shad with a 3-4 on 2 spin and the Brook Trout with a 3-12 on 2 fly. Danny Noland followed with a 44-0 Shark on 12 plug and the White Perch cup with a 13 oz on 2 fly. Stuart Lee won the Landlocked Striper cup with an 11-8 on 8 plug and won the Saltwater Fly Division award with a 17-8 Striped Bass on 6 Fly. Jim Sheffield picked up the Amberjack Cup with a 29-0 on 6 plug, and the Saltwater Spin Division cup with a 12-8 Bluefish on 2 spin. Mike Ostrander won the Largemouth Bass award with a 8-0 on 6 spin and the Saltwater General Division with a 27-0 Striped Bass on 6 general.

Buddy Noland was our first 3 cup winner with a 6-0 Brown Trout on 2 fly, a 4-5 Triggerfish on 6 spin and a 6-6 flounder on 6 plug.

Fred Cousins had an outstanding year, ending up with 4 cups, a 5-2 Spotted Seatrout on 2 spin, 1-1 Sunfish on 2 fly, the Freshwater General Division cup with a 41-0 Blue Catfish on 4 general, and the Freshwater Fly Division with a 9-4 Rainbow Trout on 2 fly.

Elly Robinson won the Flathead Catfish with a 21-12 on 4 general, the Chain Pickeral, an 3-1 on 2 spin and a 16-4 African Pompano on 6 spin. Elly also won the Saltwater Plug Division with a 29-8 Barracuda on 6 plug. the Freshwater Spin Division with a 10-12 Carp on 2 spin, and the Freshwater Plug Division with a 14-0 Gar on 2 plug.

Jennifer Henderson won the Saltwater Spouse award with a 26-0 Barracuda on 6 general for 346 points. Elayne Kodroff won the Freshwater spouse cup with a 1-4 Crappie on 2 spin for 193 points.

Reggie White picked up the Non-local Award with a 8-0 Brook Trout on 6 fly for 615 points, while Robbie Robinson won the American Shad cup with 5 releases, and Danny Noland won the Amberjack Release cup with 2 releases. Johnathan MacDonald won the New Member Angler of the Year with a 1-9 Hickory Shad on 2 spin for 177 points.

Three Division Expert awards were earned in 2006. Reggie White earned his Fly Division Expert award, his 8 fish totaling 3567 points, including 5 club records and a 48-0 Barracuda on 20 fly for a Club and

World Record. Danny Noland earned his Plug Division Expert award with his 8 fish totaling 2155 points. Glenn Carter earned his Fly Division Expert award with his 8 fish totaling 2588. Glenn's entries were highlighted by a 11-0 Brown Trout on 6 fly and a 24-0 Chinook Salmon on 8 fly.

Glenn Carter also completed the requirements for his Saltwater Expert Award. Some of Glenn's catches were a 12-0 Bluefish on 6 fly for 300 points, 15-0 Striped Bass on 4 spin for 300 points, 33-8 Cobia on 8 plug for 338 points, a 50-8 Red Drum in the Surf for 361 points and a 120 Shark in the Surf for 300 points. His three required fish were a Sailfish Release on 20 general, a 16-12 Amberjack on 8 plug for 186 points and the 50-8 Red Drum in the surf.

Elly Robinson won the C. V. Kinnard Angler of the Year with 2932 points. Elly had four 1st places, one second, and 2 thirds to earn this award, narrowly out pointing Fred Cousins.

Fred Cousins won the Freshwater Angler of the Year with 5 fish totaling 2285 points. Fred had outstanding catches with a 9-4 Rainbow Trout on 2 fly for 722 points and a 41-0 Blue Catfish on 4 general for 437 points.

Elly Robinson won the Saltwater Angler of the Year and the Joe Brooks Overall Angler of the year with 1222 points in Saltwater and 2098 points in Freshwater. Elly's Saltwater AOY entries included a 29-8 Barracuda on 6 plug for 458 points, a 16-4 African Pompano on 6 spin for 361 points, and a 26-8 Almaco Jack on 6 general for 294 points and a new World Record. In addition to Elly's Saltwater catches, his Freshwater entries of a 8-6 Rainbow Trout on 2 fly for 654 points and a 14-0 Gar on 2 plug for 509 points earned him the Joe Brooks AOY with 3320 points overall.

Fred Cousin's 9-4 Rainbow Trout on 2 fly for 722 points earned the Freshwater Presidents Award. Elly Robinson's 29-8 Barracuda on 6 plug for 458 points earned the Saltwater Presidents Award.

Individual Plaques were awarded to the Virginia Anglers Club Surf Fishing Team, for winning the Cape Hatteras Anglers Club invitational surf fishing tournament this past November. Team members were Captain Lynn Spurlin, Gary Martel, Ray Nuckols, Quentin Corbett, Billy Corbett, and Tom Johnson.

The highlight of the night was the awarding of the 6th Masters Angler award to Elly Robinson. Some of Elly's catches included an 8-6 Rainbow Trout on 2 fly for 654 points, 36-8 Amberjack on 12 fly for 281 points, 43-8 Barracuda on 6 spin for 725 points, his 7-12 Largemouth Bass on 12 plug for 193 points and a 5 to 1 entry of a 11-15 Spadefish on 2 general for 596 points. While working on his required fish, Elly had 7 World Record fish, won 5 Saltwater Presidents cups, one Freshwater AOY awards, four Saltwater AOY awards, and three Joe Brooks Overall AOY awards. During this time, Elly has also earned his, Saltwater and Freshwater Expert Ratings, and his Spin, Plug, General and Fly Division Expert Ratings. Outstanding accomplishments Elly.
