yes Buddy does fish, had hickory shad of 0-14 and a white perch of 0-13. Now before you think, "why did they bother to turn in cards for such small fish", they claimed that they were fishing the tournament and were going for the various cups. Tournament results proved that excuse to be true as they swept 3 of the 4 cups.

Dean Winstead and Jeff Doughty made their annual trip to Lake Moomaw and enjoyed some success. Each turned in 4 cards and each had a club record. Dean's highest point fish was a 1-0 yellow perch on 2 general for 212 points. He had a 3-0 smallmouth bass on 4 general for 174 points and a 1-6 smallie on 2 spin for 137 points. Dean's club record was a 3-1 brown trout on 2 general for 153 points. Jeff's highest point entry was a 2-9 smallie on 2 spin for 256 points. Jeff also had a 0-9 yellow perch on 2 general for 119 points and a 2-2 smallie on 2 spin for 212 points. Jeff's club record was for a 3-1 brown trout on 4 general for 111 points. Jeff caught his big brown before Dean did so Jeff gets the lunker award. Now rumor has it that **Danny** Noland heard about the hot fishing the twins were into so he drove all night to get to Moomaw and fished the last day with the twins and only caught one tiny yellow perch for the effort. Then he had to drive all the way back to Richmond alone. So you tell me who won that 2 day unofficial big man on the mountain fishing contest? Well at least we know for sure who didn't win!

Talking about beginning to make some noise, new member **Will Mosley** journeyed to Rudee Inlet and managed to catch some red drum during late March. Will had a 24<sup>1/2</sup> inch puppy on 4 spin weighing 5-12 for 102 points and a 25" 6-0 puppy on 2 spin for 150 points and the new species lead. Showing that he isn't one dimensional, Will got in on the shad fishing on the James and landed a 1-10 hickory on 6 fly for 164 points. Before you know it Will will be our next member to achieve Angler rating.

**Bill Duval** probably had the most impressive catches recently with 3 mutton snapper club records in Florida. Bill landed a 16-4 on 12 general for 220 points, 16-0 on 6 general for 323 points and a 15-8 on 20 general for 145 points. If that wasn't enough, Bill caught a 10-4 bonefish on 12 general for 153 points.

**Robbie Robinson** hit a hot stretch in mid April and finished up a morning of turkey hunting by stopping by the Nottoway River and catching a 4-2 American shad on 2 plug for 330 points. He then went down to my pond and landed a 1-0 shell cracker on 2 spin for 263 points. Both fish took over the species leads.

**Eddy Johnston** and I fished the James and Eddy had a 1-10 hickory on 2 plug and I had an 8-8 flathead catfish on 2 plug for the species lead.

**Scott Johnston and Eddy Johnston**, no they are not brothers or father and son even though they look and act alike, fished the James on the day of our last membership meeting and Scott had a 0-12 white perch on 2 fly and Eddy had a 1-14 hickory on 2 fly. Eddy won the points battle 267 to 250 on that trip.

**Lynn Spurlin** landed a 1-0 white perch on 4 spin in the James on 4/25 which proves that all the big ones aren't caught early in April. Lynn's fish was worth 217 points.

**Roy Jones** continued his fishing spree of late and caught an 11-0 gar in the Chick on 6 spin and entered it in 12 spin for 150 points and a new club record.

Interestingly as good as the gar fishing has been this angling year; no member has been able to achieve a club record in the line class division that he caught the fish in. All new gar club records have been achieved by up lining to higher line classes. So maybe the gar fishing was better in the good old days!

Hopefully the weather will improve and saltwater fishing will get going in late May and June.

It seems that our beloved president Mr. John Wetlaufer went fishing with Ronnie Sides and used his VAC raffle winnings of fly rod and reel to catch a hickory shad. Apparently the size of the fish was insufficient for Ronnie to even consider weighing it so it was released. John on the other hand was so proud of his catch that he insisted that Ronnie fill out an entry card for it as well as an Angler of the Month card. John marched into the meeting and proudly handed me the cards!! I was shocked that John even went fishing, used a fly rod and actually caught a fish on 8# tippet. Upon checking the rules I discovered that John's 50 point release entry didn't meet the minimum of 100 points for club awards. And to top it all off Scott Johnston submitted a card for his 4 year old grandson, Ethan Farley, who caught a hickory shad that earned a legitimate 101 points besting President Wetlaufer's shad by quite a bit!

The actual March Angler of the Month competition was lively. Dean Winstead has come alive and is fishing quite a bit and took 4<sup>th</sup> place with a 1lb. 8oz. hickory shad on 4 spin for 142 points. Lynn Spurlin got 3<sup>rd</sup> place with a lunker list leading 1lb. 10oz. yellow perch on 4 spin for 353 points. Elly Robinson had a 12lb. gar on 2 plug worth 436 points that was good for 2<sup>nd</sup> place. And the gar king Eddy Johnston took 1<sup>st</sup> place with an impressive 13lb. 12oz. gar on 2 plug for 500 points.

The competition for the Angler of the Month at the April membership meeting was a little on the sparse side. At first only two cards were turned in and finally Eddy Johnston woke up and remembered he caught a nice hickory shad that very day and submitted the third entry for the month.

Eddy captured 3<sup>rd</sup> place with a 1lb. 14oz. hickory shad caught on 2 fly for 267 points.

Eddy also won  $2^{nd}$  place with a 12lb. 4oz. gar caught on 2 plug for 445 points. These two fish moved Eddy into  $2^{nd}$  place for the Ken Kinnard Angler of the Year competition, 401 points out of  $1^{st}$  place.

I won 1<sup>st</sup> place with a 14lb. 8oz. gar on 2 spin for 527 points.

## DGIF Shad Cam – Think North Side When Viewing

An interesting website available to those interested in checking what is going on with the fish passing thru the fish passage bypassing Bosher's Dam is the Shad Cam maintained by the Virginia Department of Game and Inland Fisheries: http://www.dgif.state.va.us/fishing/shadcam

Think "north side" as your vantage point when you are looking at the Shad Cam's images. Upstream is to the right, just as it would be if you were sitting on the north bank of the James River and looking out over the river.

The viewing glass has some stripes on it. The predominant black stripes are 12 inches apart. If the water is clear and you have a monitor presenting a good image, take a look for some faint red lines. These red lines are 6 inches apart. Remember that lateral position in the viewing port is important when trying to use the reference lines to measure a fish. A fish near the viewing glass will appear larger than a fish swimming along on the far (south) side of the viewing glass.
