



# CATCHY COMMENTS By Elly Robinson

Well things sure have changed on the fishing front.
Significantly more entry cards have been received and the lunker, species and division leaders have really changed. It's summer and the fish are biting and our club's members are finally fishing and catching in a big way, especially in saltwater.

The catches and this column do not reflect entry cards that have been mailed in since late June as the club's mail box checker is on vacation and the box wasn't checked before the VAC board meeting. If you have questions about an entry please call me.

The most impressive saltwater fish caught in local waters this summer has to be the 11-13 Atlantic spadefish that **Quentin Corbett** caught on June 9<sup>th</sup> while fishing Wolftrap Light. Quentin set a new club record in 16 general with his spade that scored 189 points and took the species and lunker lead. Way to go Quentin!

New member **Will Mosley** is still burning the fish up and entered a 1-8 croaker caught on 2 spin for 200 points. Will was fishing Poquoson flats when he made the catch. See it doesn't take long for new members to get the hang of light tackle fishing and even using 2 lb. test. Will is being tutored by Master Angler **Stuart Lee** and **Scott Johnston**.

**Scott Johnston** and **Fred Cousins** have been fishing together recently and Scott had a 1-6 croaker on 4 fly for 185 points while Fred had a 1-5 croaker on 2 spin for 175 points. The guys were fishing in the Piankatank River.

Robbie Robinson, Mike Cline and I fished the East and North Rivers during the recent saltwater tournament and Robbie caught two new species leaders. Robbie had a 2-5 spotted seatrout on 2 spin for 154 points and a 2-0 croaker that weighed 2-2 when caught and weighed on the boat but shrunk when weighed officially the next day before cleaning and frying. The croaker was caught on 2 spin and a gulp shrimp and scored 266 points. We couldn't get the croakers to eat anything except a gulp shrimp in either 2" or 3". If you have never fished the west end of Mobjack Bay you are really missing out on fishing a beautiful place. Only problem it is wide open to the southeast and south so on an out going tide with moderate winds it can get rough. The grass flats are beautiful at Ware Point also. Think speckles in the spring and fall as several over 9lbs have been caught there this spring.

Bruce Henderson, Mickey Kodroff and Jim Sheffield fished out of Oregon Inlet at the 102 degree tower and at the point in the 3<sup>rd</sup> week of June and enjoyed good fishing. Bruce was the man with the club's first tilefish entry. Bruce caught a 4-4 blueline on 8 general for 141 points and a club record and species lead. Bruce had the hot rod and also landed and released 7 amberjacks on 8 plug and then weighed and released a 21-8 amberjack on 8 plug for 238 points. I understand that Mickey had an exceptional day catching and releasing amberjacks on fly and didn't want to quit at the end of the day.

Bruce, Jim and I fished together over the 4<sup>th</sup> of July holidays out of Hatteras with good success. Jim had an 18-0 amberjack on 6 plug for 257 points and the club's first official almaco jack entry

with a 9-0 on 8 plug for 128 points and a club record and new species lead. Previously almacos had been lumped together with amberjacks. Bruce took over the barracuda species lead with a 21-0 cuda on 8 spin for 233 points. I had a 26-0 amberjack on 8 plug for 288 points. I also got lucky and caught a 32-0 cobia on 8 plug for 355 points and the species and plug division lead. I say lucky because Bruce has been taking lessons from **Glenn Carter** on gaffing technique. At about 45 minutes into the fight I presented the cobia to Bruce for the gaff and Bruce hit the cobia and was hoisting it aboard when his long handle gaff got hung up in the overhead rods sticking out of the rocket launchers. Well the gaff stopped moving and the cobia took full advantage by hitting his tail on the gunnel and jumping off the gaff hook and back into the water. The cobia stayed hooked up and it took me an hour to get him back to the boat for Bruce to take two more missed gaff whacks before sinking the hook for good into the fish. I was one thankful and spent puppy when that was over. The next day I had a 24-0 amberiack on 6 spin for 342 points and the new species and spin division leads. That fish took over 2 hours to land and made me wish I was about 20 years younger. Bruce landed that fish with no problems thank goodness! During this trip Jim caught a spectacular fish in 150 feet of water on the bottom at the Manuela wreck. It was bright red and had a vivid yellow tail and was about 12 inches long. When I showed the pic of the fish to my 5 year old grandson he said it was a clown fish like on Nemo. Maybe he is going to grow up and be a fisherman also! One sad thing to report, Bruce fought a cuda on 8 spin for over an hour and the fish looked to be well over 30 pounds when it came up close to the boat but during a subsequent run the tube lure must have come across the cuda's mouth and the mono leader above the tube wire was cut we guess by the cuda's teeth. The good news about this was that I didn't have to screw up a gaffing attempt and be writing about myself in this column!

As I write this column on July 12<sup>th</sup> the weather at Hatteras has been terrible for several days and is expected to continue to blow for the rest of the week. Why do I share this with you? Well **Buddy and Danny Noland**, **Ricky Dale** and **Eddie Johnston** are all on vacation in Hatteras this week and **Glenn Carter** is in Corolla. So the next time you want to schedule a fishing vacation on the Outer Banks you might want to check and be sure these guys are no where near eastern North Carolina. Definitely they are the bad news weather bears!

On the freshwater front I fished with **Mike Ostrander** on the James and caught a 19-4 flathead catfish on 4 general for 260 points and the new species lead. If you want a close by, very enjoyable fishing trip Mike is the man to see. The James above Richmond is beautiful and the fishing is very good for big flatheads. The trip would be great for a child and your bride or significant other also.

It's about time for **Tony Horsley** and friends to start fishing the Eastern Shore for tarpon and for the wreck fishing for cudas and Africans to really heat up so we might just see some great catches in next months Catch Comments also.


# New DGIF Program Seeks Volunteers

#### US Fish & Wildlife Service Considering Closing Significant Fishing Areas of the Cape Hatteras National Seashores

In recently held public hearing in Buxton, NC Mr. Pete Benjamin of the Southeastern office of the US Fish & Wildlife Service announced the consideration of closing significant areas of the Cape Hatteras National Seashores to any public usage due to Piping Plover critical habitat. This action could potentially stop any usage of significant beach areas including the south end of Oregon Inlet, Cape Point around to the beach entrance near Billy Mitchell airfield near Frisco, the south end of Hatteras inlet and the south end of Ocracoke Island. In essence most of the top surf fishing areas in the Cape Hatteras National Seashores!

If we wish to protect our ability to use our national parks and continue to surf fish in these areas, we need to tell the appropriate USFWS officials what we think of their proposal. These closures could become permanent!

As for the controversy, **Bruce Henderson** caught a 21-8 amberjack on 8 plug but turned in his official entry card and duplicate card for Angler of the Month as 12-8. **Jim Sheffield** signed both cards as weight and catch witness! Under our new angling rules in a case like this the Angling Rules Committee has to weigh in on the changing of a card after official submission and agreed to change Bruce's card to the correct weight. After all that it didn't make any difference as Bruce's catch scored 238 points and came in 4<sup>th</sup> place and out of the money.

**Fred Cousins** took 6<sup>th</sup> place with a 1-5 croaker on 2 spin for 175 points.

**Quentin Corbett**'s outstanding 11-13 Atlantic spadefish took 5<sup>th</sup> place only because it was caught on 16 general for 189 points.

I had a 3-0 largemouth bass on 2 fly for 250 points good for  $3^{\mbox{rd}}$ .

**Glenn Carter** took  $2^{\text{nd}}$  place with a real nice 15-8 dolphin on 6 general for 258 points.

I won the competition with a 19-4 flathead catfish on 4 general for 260 points.

I have a fearless prediction. The winning fish in the July competition will have to score more than 350 points as some nicer fish have been taken by members wreck fishing out of Hatteras but they have to be at the meeting to participate so maybe everybody ought to go ahead and submit their catches as you just never know what will win.

## The View From Up North By Steve Luterek

Well the snow finally melted, Lake Erie is 70 degrees, and we've finally had some opportunities for some good fishing. Today and tomorrow the BassEye Celebrity Challenge is taking place on Lake Erie, to aid Cystic Fibrosis, sponsored by Bob Rich Jr. of Rich Products and an IGFA Director. Next week, ESPN comes to town to showcase the Bassmaster Elite series, which will feature some of the best anglers in the country. The Southtowns Walleye Tournament is over and the Can-Am Walleye tournament is this weekend. The spring Lake Ontario Counties Tournament is over but the Fall LOC is yet to come. (http://www.loc.org)

The fishing has been nothing short of phenomenal. I had an opportunity to fish a Walleye tournament in June and the largest I boated was an 8-8 trolling on 16 general. My wife and I then went out twice for a few hours on two separate afternoons and landed 15 fish one trip and 22 the next, all a mix of Walleye and Smallmouth Bass in 23 feet of water while drifting with 3D Worm Harnesses. The largest bass being 3-9 on 2 general, and a 2-12 walleye on 2 general.


My wife also caught a 3-6 Smallmouth on 4 general that trip. Most of the bass guys catch and release between 50 and 100 fish per day in early June, and the limits of Walleye are being caught on a regular basis right now and should continue through October if you can get out there. Lake Ontario Salmon and Steelhead catches are up and I'm looking forward to a week of fishing up there in August.
