With one exception, all recommendations from the Committee were unanimously approved by the Board of Directors. One recommendation was approved 3 to 2 with 2 abstentions. This recommendation will receive more study by the Board Members before any action is taken on it.

More details of the approved recommendations are in a synopsis coming with this issue of the *Angler*. Please take a little time to review this synopsis of approved recommendations. All are designed to come into effect wit the start of the 2008 Angling Year.

Tony Horsley fished with **Mike Ostrander** during the flathead tournament and had an 18 and 14 lb flathead both on 6 general.

Mike took off his fun fishing hat and put on a guide hat to fish with **Glenn Carter** and the trip produced an 18-8 flathead on 4 general worth 250 points for Glenn. As I have said before the James offers some excellent close by flathead fishing and Mike makes the day even more enjoyable.

To prove the point our president **John Wetlaufer** took his 5 year old grandson **Jack Fox** on a **Mike Ostrander** guided flathead trip and the little fellow caught several flatheads over 20 pounds as part of a 23 cat day with Jack out fishing John.... But what's new?


New Member **Will Mosley** is still going strong. Will entered two flounder. The new species and lunker list leader was a 3-1 on 2 spin for 255 points caught in the York River. Will also had a 2-12 on 2 spin caught at the HRBT.

Fred Cousins took over the croaker species and lunker lead with a 2-6 on 2 spin for 316 points.

Tony Horsley fished out of Islamorada over the 4th of July and caught a club record 5-8 bonefish on 6 general for 131 points. In case you haven't met Tony he is the guy walking around with his chest puffed out from recent success fishing the Florida Keys multi species tournaments. The impact of the VAC is felt everywhere in the fishing world!

And last but not least **Steve Luterek**, our great northern fishing whiz, submitted 3 club records. Steve will be the featured speaker at the September club meeting to talk about fishing in the great lakes. To prove he knows what he is talking about the had a 3-9 smallmouth bass on 2 general worth 285 points, a 2-12 walleye on 6 general for 101 points and a whopping 8-8 walleye on 16 general for 170 points. All were club records and all were caught on Lake Erie. Way to go Steve.







VAC Website Team Seeking Members and Ideas

One of the recommendations from the VAC Review Committee that was approved by the Board of Directors was the formation of a VAC Web Site Team.

The Board has charged this Team with determining the content of a Club website, the cost of setting up and maintaining the web site, the expertise needed by a web master, the costs of hosting the website on a server and other things needed to establish a VAC Website. The team will report back to the BOD in time for the Board to vote on establishing a web site before the budgeting process starts for 2008. The Team will study both a relatively simple and a more complex web site.

Director Frank Dennis has volunteered to chair this Team. If you are interested in being a part of the VAC Web Site Team, please contact Frank via e-mail at dennisfk@comcast.net. Frank will collect the names of interested members and the work of the Team will start around the 1St of September. If you have some information, features or links in mind that the VAC web site should contain, please pass them along to Frank. You do not need to be on the Team to submit ideas and suggestions.

Frank secured the domain name "www.virginiaanglersclub.org" some time ago so that the Club would have a logical domain name reserved.





Report of the VAC Review Committee to the Membership From the Virginia Anglers Club Board of Directors

As noted in previous issues of the *Angler*, the VAC Review Committee has been working on recommendations for changes in the structure and operation of the VAC. Meeting on nine Monday nights, the eight members of the committee spent an estimated 300+ man hours in meetings and in outside preparation related to their work. The result was a 28 page report and an accompanying 20 page appendix containing quantitative cost, membership and awards receipt data that helped the committee define and support the need for the recommendations brought forward. Recommendations fell into 6 areas and all recommendations came forward bearing the consensus of the committee.

The report was presented at the August 14th Board of Directors Meeting, first as a slide show and then in hard copy. With one exception, all recommendations were unanimously approved by the Board. One recommendation was approved 3 for, 2 against and 2 abstentions. The Board will review this last recommendation before any action is taken.

The recommendations make no changes in The Articles of Incorporation or The By-Laws of the Club. No change is made in the accumulation of points toward individual achievement awards and club records. The entry card system remains intact. All angling activity by club members still must adhere to IGFA and club rules.

A synopsis follows highlighting the recommendations approved. The Angling Rules and Angling Activities Committees will bring some recommendations into final form. All recommendations are structured to come into effect December 1, 2007, the beginning of the 2008 Angling Year.

Tournaments

A six-tournament schedule was approved that will include three salt water and three fresh water tournaments. The weight of fish caught in tournaments, instead of the current points value of the fish, will be used to determine the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place winners of each tournament. The 1st place winner will receive a \$75 award from the club in each tournament. Place Points of 3 for 1st, 2 for 2nd, and 1 Place Point for 3rd heaviest fish will be awarded for each tournament. Place Points will be added up at the end of the year. New awards for Freshwater Tournament Angler of the Year and Saltwater Tournament Angler of the Year will be given to members having he most Place Points over the year in FW and SW tournaments. The awarding of Jefferson cups the winners of individual tournaments will be discontinued. Call-in to the tournament director is required for catches to be considered and submission of entry cards is optional.

Membership Meetings

The schedule of 10 membership meetings, February thru November, no December meeting and the January Awards Banquet is retained. A 20 minute "how-to" presentation tied to the next-up tournament will be included in the membership meeting preceding a tournament. Three meetings will have a four-specie "how-to" format (15 min per specie). Three meetings will feature an invited "expert" speaker with expertise in an area related to the fishing members do. Two meetings will be social in nature with a format something like the Maymont Fish Fry and the November "drink on the club" meeting at which angling rules changes will be introduced and explained. One meeting will be a round table of club members talking about club history, remarkable catches, etc. Finally, the February meeting will have scale certification as the main theme with an accompanying activity or speaker.

Website Study Team

The recommended establishment of a Web Site Study Team was approved. This team will define two levels of website, one a simple site and one a more complex site. The Study Team will define such things as the content, the cost to establish and maintain and the requirements of a web master to establish these two levels of web site. The team will report back to the Board of Directors in time to have total cost, if a website is approved, entered as a line item in the 2008 Budget. No action by the Board of Directors to establish a web site will be made before this data and the commitment of a webmaster (volunteer or contracted) is secured, reviewed and voted upon by the Board. Frank Dennis has volunteered to chair this team.

Conservation and Legislation

The recommendation of having the 3rd Vice President / Conservation and Legislation manage the entire budget and donation process in areas of conservation was approved. Currently, the process traditionally falls by default to the Treasurer. The VP/C&L will manage the C&L donation program by annually identifying recipients, donation amounts and timing of donations and notify the membership via the Angler when donations are made. The VP/C&L will be expected to provide the Newsletter Secretary with a written C&L item for each issue of the Angler. The C&L budget for the 2008 Angling Year will be \$1200 and increase to \$1500 for the 2009 Angling Years and beyond.

Awards and Recognition

Eight of the twenty pages of the Appendix contained quantitative data on the cost of annual awards, the distribution of annual awards among the membership, the number of special awards presented over the past 10 years, etc. Based on this data, all of the annual and monthly awards were

examined with the goal of identifying awards that could be changed to appeal to the angling interests and skills of a wider group of the membership and, therefore, generate more angling activity in the club. Special awards were examined in terms of presentation history. Appendix Table 6.9 is attached and details the awards that will be cancelled, the awards that will be changed and the awards that will be added. All items noted received Board approval.

Once the committee agreed to recommended changes to the awards system, a cost analysis was made to see what effect the changes, etc. in awards would have on the Club's Budget. The analysis indicated the new system would free up about \$1000 for redistribution in the budget. As a starting point, \$500 was recommended for the C&L Budget and the balance was recommended to be applied to the expense budget for invited speakers.

Membership

A study of membership over the past 10 years indicates that the number of voting members in the club has remained fairly constant with some year-to-year variation of a few members. Membership recommendations addressed attracting and keeping new members which should lead to a steady increase in membership. The current practice of the Membership Chairman and President of greeting

and meeting each guest at each meeting and a follow-up via e-mail or letter by the president was formalized.

An outline of a new orientation program was written. This outline recognizes that the first orientation needs to "sell" the programs, the activities and the advantages of membership in the VAC to the prospective member. This outline aligns with the recommendations that were approved and will change the emphasis given in past and current orientations.

The points and records systems of the Club may or not be of any interest to the candidate. If the candidate shows interest in the points and records system, the outline suggests covering these details in a separate, later orientation meeting.
