
It looks like the continued summer weather has discouraged either the fish or the fishermen as entries seem to be lower than normal. There were however some good catches reported, **Parks Rountrey** took the Flathead Catfish lead with a 23 lb. fish caught on 4 general. **Scott Johnston** set a new club record for a 15 lb. Carp on 16 fly caught on a recent trip to Michigan. **Steve Luterek** set a new club record for Yellow Perch with a 1 lb. 9 oz. catch on 2 general which was part of a 50 fish catch that was only halted when his minnows ran out.

Bill DuVal took the lead for Rock Bass with a 9 oz. fish that he caught on a recent float trip on the New River. **Eddie Johnston** continued to prove that Gar is not his only target as he entered a 29 lb. Barracuda on 8 spin for 362 points, but while he was off in North Carolina **Fred Cousins** slipped into his Gar hole and caught a 10lb. 8 oz. Gar on 2 general for 305 points.

A little confusion on who was suppose to bring their certified scales on an early morning bass fishing outing, **Tony Horsely and Mike Ostrander** found themselves with needing to break out their certified rulers. Each angler caught a number of nice largemouth bass including Mike's 23.5" largemouth bass.

I would like to nominate **Scott Johnston** for this month's patriotic fisherman award, as he entered a 7 oz. Spot caught on 4 fly. His entry card describes the fly as red, white and blue.





The View From Up North By Steve Luterek

The Walleye, Smallmouth and Perch fishing on Lake Erie has been nothing short of Phenomenal this year. We have had Pro Bass Tournament Stops in here in Buffalo, NY and a local two day Walleye tournament was won with a creel limit of 10 fish totaling 78 lbs. That is an amazing almost 8 lb average per fish.


The perch fishing was hot and cold and has been hot again. My wife and I went out with 50 minnows, caught 50 perch average 10 inches and kept 35 of them. The largest was 1-9 on 2 general and was over 13 inches long. Some friends where out earlier in the week and reported catches of 100+ perch per trip.

Another friend of mine reported catching and releasing a 4 foot long Sturgeon in the Lower Niagara River while fishing for salmon. He did get a 25 pound salmon that trip also.

For those with affection for The Oak Orchard River, the state of New York has paid local land owners along the Oak \$7,500.00 per year for public access to an additional 4,000 linear feet of shore for world class fly fishing for Trout and Salmon. The area opened includes the renowned Sycamore Hole, a mid stream island and part of the peninsula north of the power dam.

Officials say the rules have been adopted and will be posted along with a map of the site, which has been officially named The Oak Orchard River Access Area. The new land can be accessed via the north and south DEC access points.

I probably will not get to see anyone before the holidays, so I would like to extend the warmest wishes to all for a blessed holiday to everyone and their families. Tight lines.

Gene DuVal Passes

A valued and personally loved friend of many Members of the Virginia Anglers Club, Gene DuVal, passed away near dawn on Sunday, October 14, 2007. Gene was an exceptionally talented angler with scores of IGFA World Records to her credit. She was one of Virginia's IGFA Representatives and was always willing to support the VAC in any way she could. Gene was very active in the International Women's Fishing Association. She was known to and respected by anglers all over the world and would often fish in their company. She always greeted you with a warm smile and was always sincere and enthusiastic when she engaged you in conversation. Whenever you had the pleasure of fishing in her company, you could not help but learn how stand-up angling was best done by just observing Gene bring a difficult or easy catch to gaff. Gene was a great champion of youth angling. You would always hear how her children, when young, then her grandchildren were doing in their angling pursuits. She always had special interest on how any youth with whom you were acquainted was doing in their fishing. On numerous occasions when alerted to the sale of marlin in a restaurant or from a seafood counter in a grocery store by a VAC Member, Gene would promptly and personally inform The Billfish Foundation of the incident. The Foundation would always follow up with the establishment of concern. Regrettably, Gene has pulled lines for the last time. Many Club Members will deeply feel this loss. However, in the balance, warm memories remain of a wonderful friend and a larger-than-life credit to sport of angling to who we were so close.



Board of Directors Answers Petition

Another chapter in the work of the review committee and Board of Directors has come as additional changes were asked for by individual members, then by a group of VAC anglers through a recent petition.

After communicating the work of the review committee to the membership, there was negative feedback on the proposal of awarding cash for tournament awards. The BOD replaced the cash awards with a winner's choice of a suitable trophy, a Green Top gift card or one ticket to the Annual Banquet. Additionally, a group who strongly opposed the change of awarding species awards and tournament winners to heaviest fish from highest points submitted a petition to the BOD expressing this opposition.

At the October 9, 2007 BOD meeting, the Directors came up with the following compromise:

- Species Awards (certificates) will be awarded for BOTH highest point and highest weight catches.
- Tournament winners will be awarded for BOTH the highest point and highest weight catches (fish must be entered as points or lbs so one fish cannot win both).
- Annual tournament champion awards will be given for BOTH points and highest weight in fresh and saltwater.

Stuart Lee Completes Requirements for "Fly Division Expert"

Stuart has completed the eight fish, four freshwater and four saltwater with each being worth a minimum of 150 points, requirement for "Fly Division Expert". One of the more notable catches was a Tarpon release on 12# fly. The Tarpon was estimated to weight ~80 pounds. A Pacific Sailfish on 20# fly worth 500 points. West coast Sailfish are normally larger than the east coast variety. And, an African Pompano weighing 13 lbs.,14 oz. on 8# fly totaling 347 points.

Several of the freshwater catches were a 6 pound Rainbow Trout on 8 fly and a 14 pound Coho Salmon on 12 fly worth 350 points.

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE BY-LAWS OF THE VIRGINIA ANGLERS CLUB

VOTING TO BE HELD AT THE NOVEMBER 27, 2007 MEMBERSHIP MEETING

The following is a listing of proposed amendments and additions to the By-Laws of the Virginia Anglers Club. These amendments in the form shown were approved by the Board of Directors of the Virginia Anglers Club at the Board Meeting on October, 9, 2007. Text being <u>deleted</u> is shown with <u>strike thru</u>, and text being <u>added</u> is shown <u>highlighted in italics</u>, with both entries being <u>underlined</u> for clarity.

This listing in the October 2007 Issue of *The Angler* is considered prior notice of the proposed changes as required by Article VI, Amendments, Section 1. A vote at the November 27, 2007 Membership Meeting, by show of hands on the amendments as listed, was unanimously approved by the Board of Directors of the Virginia Anglers Club on September 11, 2007. A two-thirds vote of those Members present and voting is required to amend or add to the By-Laws (Roberts Rules).

Proposed Amendment A – Removal of the word "male" as noted below which will remove the historic gender based membership requirement. The Board of Directors feels Proposed Amendment A is the most significant amendment.

ARTICLE III MEMBERSHIPS

SECTION 2: ANY MALEPERSON SUBSCRIBING TO THE OBJECTIVES OF THE ORGANIZATION MAY BECOME A MEMBER UPON SUBMISSION OF AN APPLICATION AND INITIATION FEE TO AND ITS APPROVAL BY THE MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE AND ITS CONFIRMATION BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS. AN APPLICANT FOR MEMBERSHIP MUST BE A MINIMUM OF 18 YEARS OLD (AS AMENDED 5-14-73, & 4-28-81 & 11/27/07).

NOTE: Proposed Amendments B, C, and D are "housekeeping" in nature and correct typographical errors, record items that are traditional with the Virginia Anglers Club or are recommended to be formalized as part of the By-Laws.

<u>Proposed Amendment B</u> – Inclusion for clarity of the new text in the second paragraph corrects the omission of two membership classes that have been voting in the past. The new paragraph formalizes the nomination process used for many years.

ARTICLE I ORGANIZATION

SECTION 1: (Second Paragraph)

THE ELECTION OF MEMBERS TO THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS AND THE ELECTION OF OFFICERS SHALL BE BY THE CARD OR LETTER BALLOT AMONG RESIDENT, NON-RESIDENT AND LIFE MEMBERS. UPON WHICH THE NOMINATIONS MADE BY THE NOMINATING COMMITTEE SHALL APPEAR. SPACE IS TO BE PROVIDED FOR WRITE-IN VOTES. ALL BALLOTS RECEIVED POST-MARKED PRIOR TO DECEMBER 31ST SHALL BE COUNTED, AND THE ELECTION OF NEW OFFICERS AND DIRECTORS SHALL BE CERTIFIED BY THE JUDGES OF ELECTION, WHO SHALL BE TWO (2) IN NUMBER APPOINTED BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE CLUB (AS AMENDED 11/27/07).

(New Paragraph To Be Inserted After The Second Paragraph (Above) And The Current Third Paragraph)

THE NOMINATING COMMITTEE SHALL CONSIST OF THE SITTING PRESIDENT (WHO WILL CHAIR THE COMMITTEE) AND THE PREVIOUS TWO PRESIDENTS. THE NOMINATING COMMITTEE SHALL, BY THE DECEMBER BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING, PRESENT TO THE BOARD FOR APPROVAL, THE SLATE OF OFFICERS AND THREE NEW DIRECTORS FOR THE COMING ADMINISTRATIVE YEAR. THE SITTING PRESIDENT SHALL BE OFFERFOR BY THE BOARD AN APPOINTMENT AS ONE OF THE THREE NEW DIRECTORS (AS AMENDED 11/27/07)

Proposed Amendment C - Proposed Amendment C corrects the typographical errors noted.

ARTICLE IV

SECTION 1: DUES FOR MEMBERSHIP IN THE ORGANIZATION SHALL BE PAYABLE IN ADVANCE. THE DUES FOR RESIDENT MEMBERS SHALL BE THE STATY DOLLARS (\$60) PER YEAR. THE DUES FOR NON-RESIDENT MEMBERS SHALL BE THE TY-FIVE DOLLARS FORTY DOLLARS (\$40) PER YEAR. AN INITIATION FEE OF TWENTY-FIVE FIVE DOLLARS (\$25) SHALL BE REQUIRED OF EACH MEMBER, RESIDENT, OR NON-RESIDENT. DUES WILL BE BILLED AND ARE PAYABLE ON DECEMBER 1, THE BEGINNING OF EACH ANGLING YEAR. NEW MEMBER'S DUES SHALL BE PRORATED MONTHLY MONTHLY FROM THE DATE OF MEMBERSHIP TO THE NEXT BILLING DATE (AS AMENDED 1-1-73, 3-1-78, 1-12-82, 8-25-97, 2-27-90, 11-22-94, $\frac{1}{8}$ 2/22/05 $\frac{1}{8}$ 11-27-07).

<u>Proposed Amendment D</u> - Proposed Amendment D formalizes the selection of voting methods and the notification requirements when amendments or additions are proposed to the By-Laws of the Virginia Anglers Club. Two textbooks on Roberts' Rules advise this information should be part of an organization's by-laws.

ARTICLE VI AMENDMENTS

SECTION 1: THESE BY-LAWS MAY BE AMENDED <u>OR ADDED TO</u> FROM TIME TO TIME OR ADDED TO AT ANY REGULAR OR SPECIAL MEETING OF MEMBERS, PROVIDED THAT NOTICE OF THE MEETING <u>IS GIVEN IN WRITING IN THE MONTH PRECEDING THE MONTH OF THE MEETING</u> AND THE NOTICE STATES <u>IN WRITING</u> WHAT AMENDMENTS OR ADDITIONS TO THE BY-LAWS WILL BE CONSIDERED. A TWO-THIRDS VOTE IN FAVOR BY THOSE MEMBERS ELIGIBLE TO VOTE AND VOTING IS REQUIRED TO APPROVE ANY AMENDMENT OR ADDITION TO THE BY-LAWS. THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS WILL DETERMINE, BY MAJORITY VOTE OF THE BOARD, THE METHOD OF VOTING TO BE USED (BY SHOW OF HANDS, BY BALLOT, ETC.) (AS AMENDED 11/27/07).
