Weigh master Larry Allen and his crew of talented assistants will be at the February Membership Meeting ready to certify your scales for the 2008 Angling Year. Bring your scales in a Ziploc® style bag with your name on or in the bag. Give the bag and scales to Larry and your scales will be certified by the end of the meeting. Be sure the outside of the barrel is free of oil, WD-40, etc. Brake cleaner or carburetor cleaner is recommended for oil removal.

### **Board Supports VMRC Flounder Proposal No. 3**

After considerable discussion of the five options opened for public comment by the VMRC that are intended to help increase the population of Summer Flounder, the VAC Board of Directors voted to support Option No. 3. Option No. 3 proposes a 19 inch minimum size, a 3 fish daily creel limit and a closure of the summer flounder fishery from January 1<sup>st</sup> thru the end of March. All five proposals considered were reported as equivalent in impact on the biomass of summer flounder.




## Blue Cats on the James --Light and Heavy Tackle

# CATCHY COMMENTS

What a tremendous start to a fishing season! On the saltwater front, Jim Sheffield kicks off the year with a 50 lb. 9 oz. Striper on 2# general for a grand total of 1,011 points. A 25 to 1 catch! This is the 4<sup>th</sup> highest point fish in the history of the club's 10,785 entries and misses 2<sup>nd</sup> place by only 4 points! Fred Murray still holds 1st at 1200 points. Bruce, Elly, and Jim were fishing the concrete ships area of the bay with eels the previous day without any outstanding catches. Jim was going one more time before the 3 mile territorial limit started January 1st. The NE wind was picking up the next day and no one else wanted to go, so Jim went alone in his flats boat. Jim knew it was a nice fish when he hooked it and hung on for an hour before he started putting pressure on him. A half hour later, Jim grabbed the fish by the gills and lifted it into the boat. After an official weight at the marina and Jim has a "potential" IGFA world record, more than doubling the existing record of 21 lbs. 7 ounces. Great catch! Bruce started off the month with a 28-8 Striper on 4# general worth 475 points before Jim caught a 35 pound Striper on 4 general for 583 points. A lot of quality catches comes off of Bruce's boat every year!

Also in December, **Parks Rountrey** had a notable catch of a 49 pound Blue Catfish on 8# general from the James River for 412 points.

Not to be outdone, the next week, January 6<sup>th</sup>, **Fred Cousins** is freshwater fishing with guide **Mike Ostrander** and catches

a 64 pound Blue Catfish on 4# general for a "potential" IGFA world record. After a lengthy battle and some tense moments with the fish wrapping the anchor line, Mike nets the fish and Fred has a 682 point entry. By the way, the current Blue Catfish 4 pound line class world record is 47 pounds, 9 ounces, held by fellow VAC member **Bob Shepherd**. Earlier in December, Fred had several other nice catches with several Spotted Seatrout entries with a 5 pound 6 ounce Spotted Seatrout on 2# spin for 358 points being the best. Fred also caught a "twin" to Bruce's Striper with a 28 pound 8 ounce on 4 general for 475 points.

Fred continued to pound the water fishing a grub in January and topped his Spotted Seatrout with a 6-2 on 2# spin again from the Elizabeth River. Between Jim and Fred, they have a total of thirteen "quality entries".

Fishing the James River with guide Mike Ostrander, **Kathi Sheffield** caught a 39 pound Blue Catfish on 4# general for a total of 415 points. Not bad for Kathi's first entry since becoming a member of the club in December. Jim had several more nice entries including a 11-4 pound Channel Catfish on 2# general for 359 points for a new Club Record and a 25 pound Flathead Catfish on 4# spin for 423 points.

**Scott Johnston** finally got the fly rod out and landed a 3 pound 4 ounce Channel Catfish on 2# fly on a Clouser for 162 points. Scott leads the Freshwater Fly Division.

Fred and Jim have set the "bar" pretty high and now its time for the rest of the Club to "step up to the plate!" How about it Elly?

# **Upcoming Angling Events**

Chickahominy River Yellow Perch Sat thru Sun, February 23-24, 2008 (blow date March 1-2)

Calling all perch-jerkers! Come out and show your fellow anglers how well you can jerk the perch. You are likely to see your fellow club members grouped in a few popular spots on the river. This is traditionally one of our largest participation tournaments. It's always a fun event and fishing is usually fairly dependable if weather conditions co-operate. Contact Chairman to confirm event if weather is questionable.

Location: Chickahominy River

Awards: We will recognize three places for heaviest weight fish and three places for highest point fish.

First = 3 pts. Second = 2 pts. Third = 1 pt.

These points will apply towards the annual Tournament Angler of the Year competition.

- Report in: Parks Rountrey within 5 days: 804-349-6001 You can not change the entry category once you have registered it with the Chairman. You do not need to fill out cards.
- Chairman: Parks Rountrey
- NOTES: A fish can be entered by weight or points (angler must declare which category) but not both ways for 1 fish.

One angler can win both weight and points divisions by entering 2 different fish.

One angler can win 1st, 2nd and 3rd in both weight and points divisions by entering multiple fish.

**Tournament First Place Awards** for weight and points = Anglers Choice: Traditional cup, \$40 Greentop gift certificate or a VAC Banquet ticket for the January 2009 Banquet.


