#### August Membership Meeting: Sturgeon on the James River

Some may consider that the Atlantic sturgeon as being an extremely rare inhabitant of the James River. Some members of this ancient specie of fish are still in the river and the subject of research of Matt Balazik, a doctorial candidate at VCU. Matt will make a presentation identifying the programs active in the James to document the fish and the times and places at which these studies are taking place. If you get a minute, Google sturgeon. The sturgeon is interesting specie about which to learn. The sturgeon was instrumental in sustaining the settlers of Jamestown, donated its air bladders for isinglass and, at one time, carried the moniker of "James River bacon". Sturgeon, once a major export of the earlier settlers back to England eventually was overtaken by tobacco, a commodity that would not spoil in transit. Matt's bio appears elsewhere in this issue of the *Angler*.

#### September Speaker: Carl Herrin -- "All You Need to Know About Specks"

# CATCHY COMMENTS By Staurt Lee

This past month has produced quite a few notable catches by members - many within the city limits of Richmond. As you have probably guessed the fish in the spotlight is the Flathead Catfish, and it appears that some club members figured out what Fred Murray already knew - these fish can be caught on something other than live bait.

Thirteen club record Flathead Catfish were entered. All were caught on artificial bait, including two potential fly rod World Records. As you may know Fred Murray currently holds the fly rod World Records in the 2, 4, 6 and 8-pound class. Bob Brown caught a 31-pound fish on 6 fly for 565 points, and Glenn Carter caught a 28½-pound fish on 8 fly for 456 points. Both have been submitted to the IGFA for approval. Bob Brown also had eight additional club records on fly, spin and plug. Parks Rountrey entered three club records including a 29-pound fish on 4 fly for 614 points and a 37pounder on 4 plug for 627 points.

There has been other action besides the urban catfishing. New club member George Atkinson, wife Robin and Fred Cousins fished offshore in Ocracoke, NC with Captain Norman Miller for two days with good results. Their catches included African Pompano, Amberjack, Almaco Jack, Barracuda, Grouper, Sea Bass, Red Snapper, Cobia, Triggerfish and Shark. Robin's 40pound African Pompano is the largest that I can remember being caught in local waters.

# Historic Catch Entry Database Being Cleaned Up

The historic data base of catch entries is being upgraded by Danny Noland and Johnny Wetlaufer. Two catch data bases were merged into the "official" data base on which all 11,000 catch entries are now combined. In some cases, a number of variations of the Angler's name submitting the entry have been used. For instance, entries submitted by "Bob Katchem" may have been posted as "Robert Katchem", "R. Katchem" or "Bobby Katchem". Danny and Johnny are doing an extensive amount of housekeeping to get Member's catches identified by a consistent name. It will help the Angling Rules Committee post new catches if you take a moment and check out what format of your name is being used and try to use that same name format on future entry cards. Where there is a Bop Katchem, Sr. and a Bob Katchem, Jr, it is especially important to differentiate between which Katchem caught 'em.

# Catch Database Now Has "Look Up by Month of Catch"

You can now do a search of catches in the VAC Catch data base by the month of catch as well as by all of the other search features already in place. This means if you are interested in all catches of catfish in August, you will get a list of such catches. This listing can also be embellished by adding look up by date, location etc. You cannot hurt anything if you screw up while rummaging around in the catch data base. If you have not used it, try it out. The search possibilities are endless.
