


The key word this month for freshwater fishing is "Flatheads, Flatheads, and more Flatheads!" The low water level in the James River must have "turned them on". This is the most Club Records set for Flathead Catfish that I can remember.

Bob Brown, Parks Rountrey, and Glenn Carter accounted for the most entries. From the middle of July until the rains came at the end of August, Bob, Parks and Glenn were constantly topping each other with quality entries, especially in the Fly division. Bob Brown ended with the most Club Records with his best catch being a 31-0 pound Flathead on 6# Fly for 565 points. Bob also has entered two of his catches for "pending" IGFA World Records. Gulp Jerk Shad's and Clouser Flies seem to be the lures of choice!

Parks now has the 4# Plug Club Record, the Specie lead, and Plug Division with a 37-0 pound worth 627 points. Another nice catch by **Parks** takes the lead for the Fly Division with a 29-8 pound on 4# fly for 625 points. This catch will also be submitted to IGFA for the 4# Fly World Record.

Glenn Carter thought he had the 4# Fly IGFA Record entry with a 30-0 pound Flathead, but after measuring his required tippet length, it was 2 inches too long!

He did enter his 28-8 pound Flathead Catfish on 8# Fly for the "pending" World Record and has since found out that his line has tested OK. That was Glenn's highest point entry worth 456 points and now replaces Jim Farrell's 22-8 Club Record.



caught several Catfish on the James River with his best catch being a 29-8 pound Blue Catfish on 6# line fishing with a live Bluegill.

On the Saltwater side, Eddy Johnston maintains his Croaker Specie lead with another 1-10 pounder on 2# Plug. Stuart Lee also had several nice Fly entries with a 19-4 Cobia on 16# Fly and a 14-0 Red Drum on 12# Fly fishing out of Oregon Inlet. Fred Cousins was wreck fishing with Norman Miller out of Ocracoke when he caught a 30-0 pound Barracuda on 12# General and a 21-0 Amberjack on 8# Plug for his entries this month.

Bruce Henderson and Elly Robinson were also fishing the wrecks off Hatteras in early August. Bruce's best catch was a 28-0 pound Barracuda on a "tube lure" on 8# Spin worth

350 points. Elly also entered several nice catches. He had a 14-8 pound African Pompano on 8# Plug fishing a bucktail and an Almaco Jack weighing 20 pounds on 6# Spin worth 400 points.

Later in August, **Danny Noland, Dave** English, Ricky Dale, and myself spent a week in Hatteras. We had four good days of fishing and ended up with



....eight African Pompanos, numerous Amberjack and Almaco's, and Barracuda. The Manuela and the British Splendor proved to be our best wrecks.

Dave English used a bucktail to catch the largest African off the Manuela. It weighed 16-8 pound on 12# Plug. **Ricky** had several nice catches with Power Pro line but could not enter any. **Danny** proved that he was the "top rod" on this trip with four Specie leads and one Division lead. **Danny** had a 29-0 Barracuda worth 446 points, 22-0 pound Amberjack worth 314 points, a 23-0 Almaco Jack for 460 points and an 18-0 African Pompano worth 400 points, all on 6# Plug. My best catch was a 20-8 Almaco Jack on 6# Plug for 410 points. A huge Hammerhead Shark enjoyed dinner with my nicest Almaco Jack. I fought it for an hour and a half on 6# Plug when a large shadow rose from the depths and ate him in two bites. That's fishing!



ONE GOOD TERN DESERVES ANOTHER... AN OLD LINE TALE

Johnny Wetlaufer and his dad, John Wetlaufer, Sr .were for off for an early September afternoon of fishing down south of Bodie Island Lighthouse in Nags Head, NC. They had just navigated thru the cut north of the Oregon Inlet Coast Guard Station, passed thru some skinny water over some grass beds and were making the run past Off Island toward the deeper water south of the light. John spied something thrashing up along the bank. Johnny turned the boat for a closer look. What was thrashing was a young common Tern that was wrapped up on some old discarded mono that pretty well immobilized the tern's wings and tethered the bird to the bottom. The tern's apparent parents were not too happy to see the two anglers going toward their young tern and dove at the boat. Johnny approached the fouled tern and cut the line that tethered the tern to the bottom. He then put a bandanna over the tern's head and cut the line that had become fouled in the bird's wings. The tern's feathers were a complete mess and the bird was waterlogged. It was able to swim away but was very low in the water. Although the tern tried to take flight, the continued thrashing apparently had its feathers soaked very well. The tern disappeared around the east end of Off Island with its parents hovering overhead. Hopefully, the tern could find a get out of the water, dry out and preen so it could resume its growth with full mobility. The message here is to keep old or broken line, that you have or find, in the boat when ever possible and take it back to the dock for proper disposal. Also, if you find a sea bird in distress, wrapping it in a towel, shirt or other piece of material will help calm the bird and keep its beak away from your hands and arms while you render assistance.

Bob reports that while fishing at various locations on the Eastern side of the Bay on four separate days in mid- to late August, he caught limits of flounder each day (except one day when he only caught 3 in about 20 minutes of fishing before he had to run back in because he was taking waves over the bow and transom). His catches included several other fish over 6 pounds. Unfortunately, the fish were all caught on braided line so none are eligible for entry into the club. The fishing technique that proved to be so deadly involved vertical jigging various types of Gulp baits (mostly the large jerk shad and twisty tail Gulps) on 1.5 to 2 ounce jig heads over and around structure.

Our tourney this month will be at peak time for big fall Specks. Various soft plastic baits, Gulp baits and MirrOlures can be effective on ultra-light spinning and plug gear. Fly fishing is also productive. A number of club members like Rudee and Lynnhaven this time of year, but you can fish any Virginia waters.
