November Speaker: Stuart Lee - Stripers on Fly and Jig

Interest in catching salt water striped bass moves to the forefront of late fall angling. Stuart Lee, skilled striper angler and long time member and Director of the VAC, will make a presentation on catching stripers by jigging and by fly tackle. As of December 1, 2007, Stuart held seven (7) salt water striper records: five (5) of which are on fly (4#, 8#, 12#, 16# and 20# tippet). He knows how to successfully fish for stripers. This past month started off with some nice catches being entered in the Speckled Trout Tournament. Larry Allen and Wilson Nobles, avid *trout* fishermen for years, didn't surprise anyone with their entries. Larry took first place

with a 6-5 pound *Speckle* on 2# spin for 420 points. This same fish also takes the "specie" and "spin division" leads. **Wilson** caught several nice fish with a 5-4 *Speckle* on 8# spin for the Largest award on a Fin-S grub. **Fred Cousins** went to the Hot Ditch on the Elizabeth River the same weekend and used a grub to land a 4-11 *Speckled Trout* on 2# spin for 312 points.

Bob Brown, Parks Rountrey, Elly Robinson, and **Eddy Johnston** were all fishing Rudee Inlet October 15th. **Eddy** caught a 10 ounce *Spot* on 2# spin worth 231 points and takes the "specie" lead. **Parks** ended up with a 2-10 *Spotted Seatrout* on 2# spin for 175 points.

Lynn Spurlin and **Rob Thomas** were off to Oak Orchard, New York the third week of the month for some *Chinook Salmon*. **Lynn** was fly fishing with a cone head wooly bugger and landed a Club Record 29 pound *Chinook* on 20# tippet for 199 points. Nice catch!

The Poropatank River yielded a Club Record 1-2 *White Perch* for **Scott Johnston** on 4# fly. **Scott** was using a clouser which I'm sure he tied himself. By the way, where is the Poropatank River?

Fishing the James River, **Fred Cousins** was after *Gar* and caught a 8-4 on 2# plug worth 300 points on a grub. **Rob Brown** had two *Carp* entries from the James. **Rob** was fishing the old fashioned way with "night crawlers" when he netted a 11-8 and a 12-8 pound fish, both on 6# general. The word must have gotten out about the *Carp*, because **Parks Rountrey** fished the James several days later and landed a 12 pound *Carp* on a dough ball for 240 points on 4# general.

If anyone is in the running for the New Member Angler of the Year Award, they had better get on their horse. **Rob Choi** has entered at least one fish almost every month this year and time is quickly running out. **Rob** submits a 2-13 pound *Flounder* from the Hampton Roads Bridge Tunnel caught on a Gulp Paddletail on 4# spin for 175 points.

Stuart Lee, Fred Murray, and Bob Shepherd also ventured up to New York for some *Brown Trout* and *Chinook Salmon* fishing the last week of October. Stuart fished Sandy Creek and landed a nice 11-12 pound *Brown Trout* worth 431 points and a 26 pound *Chinook Salmon* worth 379 points all on 8# fly. Not to be out done, Bob Shepherd caught the largest *Brown Trout* which came from Johnson Creek that weekend. It weighted 14-12 pounds and was also caught on 8# fly making it worth 542 points. Dave English still holds the *Brown Trout* Club Record of 16-4 pounds on 8# fly from Oak Orchard River, NY.

Leaving from Long Bay Point, **Bruce Henderson** fished the Triangle Wrecks area November 1St. Fishing with 8# plug and a jig, **Bruce** landed a 17-12 *Bluefish* worth 295 points. **Bruce** said that the *Black Sea Bass* commercial "pots" are getting most of the large *Sea Bass*, but there are still lots of large *Bluefish* on all the wrecks.

Ryan Noland, Dave English, Ricky Dale, and myself decided to go *Rainbow Trout* fishing after the last VT football game. We were already in Blacksburg and it just made sense. On Friday, we fished a private stream called Little River on a huge farm with lots of farm animals. Once you could get a fly through the falling autumn leaves, some real nice trout were caught by all. Ryan was using a hopper imitation and entered a 4-4 *Rainbow* on 4# fly for 241 points. I caught a 4-8 *Rainbow* on a peach

wooly bugger on 2# fly for 241 points and the specie lead. The only problem encountered was with the farm animals I mentioned. While the bull was having his way with a cow, he was so excited that he managed to remove a lot of paint from the front fender of my truck with his horns. That's not all, while several horses were licking the dust off our fishing trailer and truck, another horse was checking out my CD's on the dash. I suspect someone had slipped back to the truck to take a nap and left the door open. Think I'll go back to fishing out of a boat!

Note! Last day to enter a catch for this angling year is before midnight November 30th. Then, December 1St begins another angling year and it starts the competition all over again.

APPROVAL OF 2009 CHANGES IN ANGLING RULES DELAYED

The changes in the Angling Rules for the 2009 Angling Year were not voted upon by the BOD at the November 11 Board Meeting (too few directors were present to form a quorum) Therefore, the changes do not appear in the this November issue of the Angler as has been the practice in the past. The changes will be voted upon just before the November Membership Meeting and be reviewed during the meeting. The changes will also be communicated electronically via special e-mail memo, will be included in the December Angler and will be placed on the VAC web site for convenience. The new 2009 Angling Rules will first be in effect for the December VA/NC Striper Tournament.

2008 ANGLING YEAR DRAWING TO A CLOSE

The 2008 Angling Year Closes at midnight on November 30, 2008. Catches made in the 2008 Angling Year need to be submitted no later than 21 days after the 30^{th} for credit. Catches made from December 1, 2008 thru November 30, 2009 will be counted in the 2009 Angling Year. The first tournament of the 2009 Angling Year is the VA/NC Striper Tournament to be held from December 15^{th} thru December 30^{th} , 2008.

Virginia / North Carolina Striped Bass Tournament December 15-31 (no blow date)

Our tourney will be at peak time for big winter Rockfish. Drifting live baits or conventional trolling are preferred methods for the heaviest fish. For light tackle points - various soft plastic baits are effective on light spinning and plug gear. Fly fishing is also productive when you can find fish near the surface. A number of club members like Cape Charles and CBBT areas this time of year, but you can fish any Virginia or North Carolina salt waters. Remember

- this is our first tournament for the new angling year — so be sure to plan on fishing. Two ways to win! We will recognize three places for heaviest weight fish and three places for highest point fish.

First = 3 pts. Second = 2 pts. Third = 1 pt.

These points will apply towards the annual Salt Water Tournament Angler of the Year competition.

A fish can be entered by weight or points (angler must declare which category) but not both ways for 1 fish.


CALENDAR SALES MONEY NEEDS TO BE TURNED IN
