VIRGINIA ANGLERS CLUB 2009 APPROVED AT \$13,000

ANNUAL SCALE CERTIFICATION AVAILABLE DURING THE FEBRUARY 26TH MEETING

It's time to check over your scales and get them in order for their annual certification. Weigh master Larry Allen and his crew of talented assistants will be at the February Membership Meeting ready to certify your scales for the 2009 Angling Year. Bring your scales in a Ziploc®'a8 style bag with your name on or in the bag. Give the bag and scales to Larry and your scales will be certified by the end of the meeting. Be sure the outside of the barrel is free of oil, WD-40, etc. Brake cleaner or carburetor cleaner is recommended for oil removal.

THREE MOTIONS OF INTEREST PASSED AT THE FEBRUARY BOD MEETING

The Board of Directors passed three motions of interest to the club. The BOD gave thorough consideration to the subject of each motion before the motions were brought to a vote of the Directors. All Directors were present to make the vote and there were no abstentions.

Recognizing the need for total flexibility during the budgeting process, the BOD voted to have the value of the budget line item concerning discretionary donations for conservation programs set during the budgeting process vs. being

automatically \$1500 as voted in 2007. Typically discretionary donations make up roughly half of the total value of VAC donations to conservation programs. The rest of the donations are set at specific values for specific organizations.

In a move to allow members the option of paying membership dues on credit cards, the BOD voted to have the VAC Webmaster set up a Pay Pal account thru which dues payments can be made to the Club. A special email notice of how to use this account will be issued in February.

In answer to a request by the VMRC for public input in setting the summer flounder regulations for the 2009 season, the Board voted to support the 19" – 5 fish limit – no closure option. The 3rd. VP – Conservation and Legislation was directed to advise the VMRC in writing of the support of the VAC for this option. In all options the catch limit was 5 fish. The board felt having no closed season (one week) was less confusing than a one week closure in one of the other alternatives offered.

CATCHY COMMENTS

It has been several months since we have had an update on the new angling year which began 12/1/09. There have been some very significant catches on both the fresh and saltwater by our members. Not too many years ago, this period was a slow time of the year with very few entries. Now with the growth the Catfick in the James River and the return of the

of the Blue Catfish in the James River and the return of the Striped Bass, that has all changed.

The season began with the first entry being a *Blue Catfish* from Chippoke's Creek on December 3rd. **Scott Johnston** and **Eddy Johnston** were jigging for *Gar* when **Eddy** had a fish on the line that acted and felt a lot different than the targeted specie. It turned out to be a 33-0 pound *Blue Catfish* which he caught on 2# plug. What a surprise and a new Club Record. Fish was worth 507 points. Not too shabby a catch!

Several weeks later, **Parks Rountrey**, **Glenn Carter**, and *Richmond Times-Dispatch* outdoor writer, **Andy Thompson**, were fishing the James River with **Mike Ostrander** and also released some *Blue Catfish*. Andy had the heaviest fish with a 54-0 pound. **Parks** caught a 28-0 pounder on 4# general and **Glenn** landed a 49-0 *Blue Catfish* on 12# general. Points were 298 and 340 respectively. Cut *Shad* was used for bait.





Bob Shepherd and **Fred Murray** were also catching *Blue Catfish* in early January. They had several fish over 40 pounds with the best being 51-0 pounds worth 543 points caught by **Bob**. The *Catfish* was on 4# general and has been submitted to IGFA to better his current world record of 47-9 pounds set in January of 2002. This catch is also the current "specie leader".

The saltwater fishing has also produced some outstanding catches. The *Stripers* were the prey in early December with *Speckled Trout* filling out the remainder of the month. The high winds after Christmas kept the *Striper Tournament* entries low with few anglers able to fish. The deeper areas along the eastern side of the bay from the Concrete ships to Nautilus Shoals have been the hot spots for the live eel fishermen. As the fish exited the bay, the trollers began to out number the eelers until the very end of January when most fish moved out past the three mile limit.

Jim Sheffield was fishing with **Bruce Henderson** on the *Bounty Hunter* and had two of the early December entries with a 28-0 and a 43-8 pound *Stripers* on 8# general. **Jim's** largest fish missed the current world record by less than two pounds but is a new Club Record 8# general.

Fishing on the Elizabeth River December 23rd with the air temperature at 16 degrees Fahrenheit, **Ryan Noland** had a super day on *Spotted Seatrout*. Fishing with Mirrolures, **he** got his "limit" with the smallest being 2-6 and the largest a whopping 7 pound 10 ounce on 2# plug. **Ryan** set three Club Records with 4-6 for 8# plug, a 5-10 for 6# plug, and the 7-10 pound fish for 2# plug record. The best *Speckled Trout* was worth 508 points and is now the "plug division" leader. **Danny Noland** went to the Elizabeth River three days later with his best catch of *Trout* being a 4-7 pound on 2# plug, also on a Mirrolure.



Stuart Lee and **LeRoy Houser** were jigging off Rudee Inlet with a bucktails on December 29th **Stuart's** best entry was a 10-0 pound *Bluefish* on 12# plug which now is the *Bluefish* "specie leader".

Fishing with **Bruce Henderson** and **Jim Sheffield**, **Fred Cousins** had a real nice *Striper* to start off the season. **Fred** was fishing a live eel on 4# line and landed a 39-0 *Striped Bass* worth 650 points. This catch now is now the current "general division" leader.

Ricky Dale, Dave English, Danny Noland, and myself went to Puerto Aventuras, Mexico to try to in on the early bite of Sailfish in mid January. The trip turned out to be more of a learning experience than a catching experience. We had used American boats and captains in the past, but this time went with the Mexican captains and mates. Fun was had by all with





just a few *Barracuda's* landed. The tackle wasn't exactly what we had been promised and so on. Any of us would be happy to share this information if interested.

No additional entry cards have been received since the middle of January but I am expecting some "Yellow Perch" entries real soon. Several of our members have been testing the waters of the "Chick" lately.

WHAT IS THE VIRGINIA COAST PRESERVE?



In years past, the barrier islands of the Eastern Shore of Virginia were a popular angling destination for Members of the VAC. Stimulated by the active angling of VAC Members, such as Member Bernie Skydanek, many Club Members would participate in scheduled and impromptu angling trips to fish these islands which are partially or totally owned by the Nature Conservancy's Virginia Coast Preserve. The following information on the Virginia Coast Preserve was shamelessly stolen from the Preserve's website. These islands are an amazingly unique peaceful part of Virginia and offer wonderful opportunities for sound and surf fishing. The islands of the Reserve are accessible only by boat. Check in with the Reserve if you plant to visit the islands at (757) 442-3049.

"Virginia's Eastern Shore is a narrow finger of land that separates the from the Atlantic Ocean. It is home to the longest expanse of coastal wilderness remaining on the eastern seaboard of the United States."

The Conservancy's Virginia Coast Reserve (VCR) is comprised of 14 undeveloped barrier islands, thousands of acres of pristine salt marshes, vast tidal mudflats, shallow bays, and productive forested uplands. Situated at the lower end of the Delmarva Peninsula, VCR is one of the most important migratory bird stopover sites on Earth.

This coastal wilderness features beaches, forests, maritime vegetation and salt marshes. Barrier islands, thin strips of land running parallel to the coastline along much of the Atlantic shore, comprise a large part of the coastal habitat. The Conservancy owns all or part of 14 of the 18 Virginia barrier islands. Lying at the intersection of diverse habitats, these islands both support a rich array of life and help buffer Virginia's against storms.

Location The islands run more than 60 miles south from the Maryland border to the Chesapeake Bay

Hours Year-round

Size 38,000 acres

Conditions

The islands are all in their natural state with many beaches. There are no trails. A navigational chart is recommended for boaters.

The abundance of waterfowl and sea life described is truly amazing and the comings and goings of the islands themselves gives testimony that the islands are not permanent by any stretch of the imagination. One angler can win both weight and points divisions by entering 2 different fish.


One angler can only turn in two fish total.
