### CATCHY COMMENTS

Fishing in a day off of Hatteras in a forecast of 10-15 and 2-3's turned out to be a time when the only thing we did not see was **Dorothy** and **Toto** from the Wizard of Oz and felt like an episode

from the Deadliest Catch. That night upon returning dinner included Advil and we all felt like old prize fighters. **Danny, Ryan** and **myself** set out with the intentions of scalding **Elly's** paulty 6# Almaco Jack record and ended up looking for the inlet early after one hookup on our only stop 15 miles off. **Ricky** and **family** thought trolling seemed the better option and 8 miles south of Hatteras had a 37# Wahoo and several dolphin and at 9 miles offshore almost spooled a 50 on a fish that was never checked. I guess **Elly's** record survives another day but he is probably not sleeping well knowing we are focusing on his accomplishments.

**Bob Shepherd** started off the month with a nice 7-8 pound Flounder on the Chesapeake Bay using Gulp on 20# braid line. The catch isn't recognized under the Club's new 50# braid category, but is still a notable catch.

While fishing the light tackle tournament in Islamorada, Florida, **Tony Horsley** released a Tarpon on 12# general using a crab for bait. This fish will be worth 195 points using the 45 pound "release weight".

**Bruce Henderson** visited the wrecks off Hatteras Island several times recently. **Bruce** entered a 24-0 pound on 8# plug for 300 points early in July. **Fred Cousins** was fishing with **Bruce** later in the month and entered a 12 pound Dolphin on 6# plug for 266 points using a bucktail jig along with a 16-0 pound Barracuda on 8# spin worth 200 points. The Dolphin will take the species lead. **Fred** was also freshwater fishing for Flathead Catfish at the Pony Pasture with **George Atkinson** and entered a 22-0 Flathead on 4# general for 298 points. **Fred** was using a live Sunfish for bait.

Ryan Noland, my nine year old grandson Cameron Brink, and myself were fishing the southern wrecks off Hatteras July 15<sup>th</sup>. For **Cameron**, his first fish would have been ~ a jumping 15 pound Dolphin on 8# before he pulled the hook. The fish "pinned the rod" to the boat gunnel and Cam was never really in charge. I think I'll start him off on something smaller next time because he never lifted the rod off the gunnel all day. **Ryan** caught several quality fish. **His** first was a 25 pound Barracuda on a tube lure on 6# spin for 384 points. The Barracuda will lead the saltwater spin division and also the largest division. Ryan then showed no gratitude for his uncle taking him fishing. Off the British Splendor, Ryan landed a 27.11 pound Almaco Jack on 8# general for 301 points. The Jack was weighed at Teach's Lair Marina and has been entered with IGFA for the 8# class world record. If certified, the entry will "replace" the current world record, 25 pound 14 ounce that I currently have!



**Vic Skakandy** was fishing the Spadefish/Flounder Tournament and had an unusual catch. **Vic** landed a 5-8 Tautog at the CBBT on a bucktail/spot combination for bait. The catch was below the 100 point minimum, but was still a nice pull on 12# line.

Fishing the same tournament, **Robbie Robinson** and **Mike Cline** landed over sixty Flounder with only three fish being above the of 19-1/2" minimum length. **Mike** did manage to enter a 4-11 Flounder on 2# plug for 390 points for the new Club Record. **Robbie** caught the other keepers which were a 5-14 on 6# plug and a 5-11 on 8# plug.

**Danny Noland, Ryan**, and **I** were targeting the Spadefish on the Tiger Wreck during the same tournament. **We** saw lots of Spades and tagged and released over forty. The big ones eluded us all day and preferred the jelly balls over our fresh clams. **Danny's** best fish was a 3-2 pound on 2# general for 166 points. **I** caught the largest Spadefish which was still only 4-4 pounds. **Ryan's** largest fish was a 4-2, but his 2-12 Spadefish on 2# spin set a new Club Record. **Ryan** later caught a species leader 1-15 Triggerfish on 2# general for 103 points.

The boats that can fish are having good billfish numbers as we followed two boats through the inlet yesterday with two Blue Marlin release flags with reports of other billfish catches in boats with charters in past days. It is a good time to be in the Outer Banks if you can catch the right weather to fish.

## VAC Member Tony Horsley Fishes The 2009 Florida Keys Outfitters/IGFA Light Tackle Inshore World Championship

Virginia Anglers Club Member Tony Horsley carried the VAC colors down to the Florida Keys and fished the three-day 2009 Florida Keys Outfitters/IGFA Light Tackle Inshore World Championship. Tony was one of the only 15 anglers fishing this tournament, all 15 of which come from all over the world. To qualify, Tony had to win one of the 30 qualifying world wide tournaments in the U.S., Australia and the Bahamas in 2008. This is the first year the Inshore World Championship was divided into two separate events, a Fly Fishing Inshore World Championship and a Light Tackle Inshore World Championship. A World Champion was recognized for each of the two, separate events and came from the 15 anglers fishing each event.

This was the first year for the new co-sponsor and two-event tournament formats. Fishing will take place Tuesday thru Thursday, July 7<sup>th</sup> thru 9<sup>th</sup> and is headquartered at Islamorada in the Florida Keys. Each of the 30 total participants drew a knowledgeable local guide who offered to participate in the tournament. The guide and angler fished together all three days, a change from past Championships where the anglers fished with a different guide each day. Tournament Director Sandy Monet is the owner of Championship cosponsor Florida Keys Outfitters, a prominent saltwater fly fishing shop, school and organizer of numerous Keys tournaments. Sandy commented, "Teams should be able to develop a rhythm and work more effectively together without having to start from square one each day."

Each of the Inshore World Championships was an all-release tournament. Virginia Angler Club's Tony Horsley strove to catch more "grand slams" than any other angler during the three days of the Light Tackle Inshore World Championship. A "grand slam" is a catch of each of the targeted species: bonefish, tarpon, permit, redfish and snook. After all five species are caught for a "grand slam", anglers move on to catch their second "grand slam". The angler with the most "grand slams" becomes the World Inshore Champion. To qualify for scoring, a fish must fall within a length slot included in the Florida Saltwater Fishing Regulations.

Note: Slot lengths for "grand slam" species are as follows: Bone Fish – 12" minimum", Tarpon (no minimum), Permit – 11" to 20", Redfish (Drum) – 18"-27", Snook – 28" to 32"

For the first year, ESPN Outdoors covered the World Championship. Television crews were on hand to film the angling and related events. The resulting footage will be presented on ESPN Outdoor's Saltwater Series of programs.

### VAC WEBSITE FORUMS - DISCUSSION AT AUGUST MEMBERSHIP MEETING

### Fishing Reports:

The Fishing Forum is visible to anyone who logs onto www.virginiaanglersclub.com. Any fishing information posted, therefore, becomes "public knowledge" and can be used by anyone logged on. There is some feeling that information about where the action is hot, etc. should stay within the VAC and, therefore, be kept in the Members (only) section of the Website. For instance, if a member posts some specific location information about a specific bite, is there the possibility that a lot of non-members may show up at the hot spot and cause it to be crowded to the point that it is unfishable. Where do you come out on this question? Should the Fishing Forum be open to VAC Members only for posting and for reading? Maybe there is a way to post catch information to show the club is an active angling club while protecting the other related information that may best left to Member's eyes only.

#### For Sale Forum:

The Forums section of the VAC Website has a For Sale Forum on which items for sale can be posted. The For Sale Forum is currently visible only to members who have set up a Forum Account. When an account holder clicks on "Forums", the For Sale Forum comes up in the list of Forums. The question arose should items for sale be visible to the public? Should the public be able to post items for sale? Are the best interests of Members served by having the For Sale section of Forums only available to Members for posting items for sale and for contacting the seller about the item?

#### Postings in the Forums Section:

All forums require a pre-approved account to post messages. Currently only VAC members are approved for forum accounts. Should we allow non-members the ability to obtain a forum account and post comments? Is the possibility of posting of comments contrary or damaging to the mission of the VAC a significant enough possibility that posting should be limited to account holders?

Please think about these questions. Maybe you have opinions of other changes that need to be made in the Forums section of the VAC Website. The Leadership Team wants the features of the website to be set up to best serve the needs of the VAC and the interests of the Membership. Vic will spend a few minutes seeking Forums related opinions at the June Membership Meeting. Thanks in advance for your helping the Leadership Team.


