Due to interest in this simple device, the VAC has ordered two dozen test kits which will be available for purchase at the Country Store at the November Meeting. According to **Dean Winstead**, the Elizabeth River has been pretty good for catching Spotted Seatrout. **Dean**, within a couple of hours of fishing the last several days, has gotten his limit of 2 to 4 pound fish using grubs and MirrOlures®'ae. Now the remnants of Hurricane Ida are pounding the tidewater area with high winds and flooding. The fishing won't be as good for a while.

Bruce Henderson and **Jim Sheffield** were fishing the deep water off Oregon Inlet and **Bruce** landed a "club record" Tilefish. The fish weighed 4-8 pounds and he caught it on 8# line using squid for bait. **Bruce** is now looking for a break in the weather to bring his boat to Lynnhaven for the Striper season. Limits of the Stripers are now being taken at the CBBT islands at daybreak.

Scott Johnson was visiting his son **Kevin**, in Michigan when he managed a nice Carp entry on 8# fly on the Detroit River. The fish weighed 9-14 pounds and was worth 220 points.

Fishing off Atlantic Beach, North Carolina in early October, **Parks Rountrey** landed a 3-1 pound Spanish mackerel. **Parks** was trolling a Clark spoon at the time.

The "species" leader for Rainbow Trout is now **Will Mosley**. He was fishing the South Branch of the Potomac River in West Virginia. The trout weighed 3-14 pounds and was caught on 2# fly worth 302 points. **Fred Cousins** has the club record of 9 pounds 14 ounces from John's Creek.

Rob Choi has another quality entry this month. **Rob** was fishing the James River and landed a 19-7 pound Flathead Catfish on 4# general for 263 points. A live Bluegill was used for bait.

Ricky Dale, Dave English, Danny Noland and **myself** fly fished several southwest Virginia trout streams near Tazewell near the end of October. Numerous Rainbows' were caught by all with

Danny landing the highest point fish on 2# fly. It was a 3-10 pound Rainbow valued at 283 points. **Danny** also entered a 10 ounce Rock Bass worth 208 points which will take the "species" and "largest" leads with this entry.

Ryan Noland was again fishing with **Mike Ostrander** earlier this month and caught several quality Blue Catfish. **Ryan's** highest point fish was a 33-8 catfish on 4# general worth 357 points. His largest Blue Catfish entry weighed in at 36-0 pounds. All were caught on cut Shad.

Fred Murray and Stuart Lee made the trip to the Oak Orchard River in New York November 5th for the huge Brown Trout. Stuart says that Fred put on a fly fishing seminar hooking numerous fish as usual. Stuart's best Brown weighed 12 pounds, 4 0unces, and totaled 450 points. As large as this fish was, it still didn't surpass the current club record of 16-4 pounds caught by Dave English several years ago from the same river. Stuart was using an egg pattern on 8# fly.

Remember, only several more weeks left in the "angling year" for you to earn an award. The new "angling year" begins on December 1, 2009 and you have until December 10, 2009 to turn in your entry cards.

EASY GASAHOL TESTING - KITS AVAILABLE IN COUNTRY STORE

Bob Brown showed the members present at the October 27th Membership Meeting a really clever device that can be used to determine % of alcohol in a sample of gasohol (gasoline with alcohol added). The testing kit can also be used as a rough indicator of the quality of the gasoline sampled. The tester is a glass tube (looks like a high school chemistry test tube) with a screw-on top. The tube is filled with water up to a mark printed on the tube. Then gasoline with alcohol in it is added on top of the water until the gasoline reaches a second, higher mark. Screw on the top, shake the tube and let the contents settle for a few minutes. The alcohol comes out of the gasoline and mixes with the water in the bottom of the tube, increasing its volume and raising the interface between the water/alcohol mixture and the gasoline. The new level of the interface is read against a scale of % alcohol printed on the testing tube. The reading is the % alcohol in the gasoline sample. Two dozen (24) testing kits (tubes with use instructions and scales printed on the side) have been ordered and will be available at the Country Store for \$5.00 each at the November Meeting. More information on testing for alcohol in gasohol is available on the internet. VAC SURF FISHING TEAM FINISHED 59TH IN THE CHAC TOURNAMENT

The Virginia Anglers Club has had a team fishing in every Cape Hatteras Angler's Club Invitational Surf Fishing Tournament since its inception. The six-man Virginia Anglers Club Surf Fishing Team fishing the tournament this year finished 59th out of 120 teams fishing in the 2009 edition of the Tournament. Fishing was skimpy to say the least. Compared to many previous years, the numbers of catches among all teams fishing were down considerably. The winning team had 114 fish (worth 218 points), 100 of which were caught at site #52 on the Thursday morning session. The VAC Team never had the luck to fish site #52, which was one of the most productive sites in the Tournament. The VAC Team had 12 fish worth 37 points for the four fishing sessions. Only three teams had over 100 fish and only 18 teams had over 100 points. Seven women's teams finished ahead of the VAC Team and six women's teams finished below the VAC Team. The VAC Team was captained by Lynn Spurlin and Gary Martell, Quentin Corbett, Billy Corbett, Matt Balazik and Steve Bisbing rounded out the six member team.



Tournament News



Virginia / North Carolina Striped Bass: December 15-31 (no blow date)

Our tourney will be at peak time for big winter Rockfish. Drifting live baits or conventional trolling are preferred methods for the heaviest fish. For light tackle points - various soft plastic baits are effective on light spinning and plug gear. Fly fishing is also productive when you can find fish near the surface. A number of club members like Cape Charles and CBBT areas this time of year, but you can fish any Virginia or North Carolina salt waters. Remember - this is our first tournament for the new angling year - so be sure to plan on fishing.

Two ways to win! We will recognize three places for heaviest weight fish and three places for highest point fish. First = 3 pts. Second = 2 pts. Third = 1 pt. These points will apply towards the annual Salt Water Tournament Angler of the Year competition. A fish can be entered by weight or points (angler must declare which category) but not both ways for 1 fish. Only 2 fish can be entered per person.


