

CATCHY COMMENTS by Buddy Noland

Judging by the low number of entries over the past month, the weather must have kept a lot of anglers from fishing. The Red

and Black Drum bite has been phenomenal off the Eastern Shore Islands. Spadefish are beginning to show inside the bay as well as the Chesapeake Light Tower area. **Dean Winstead, Ryan Noland**, and **I** recently fished the Triangle Wreck area for Black Sea Bass. We did not catch any fish over three pounds or submit any entries because of the rough sea conditions requiring heavier fishing line. **Mike Cline** and **Robbie Robinson** fished the CBBT several times lately for Flounder and have had to return four or more for every one keeper!

Scott Johnston and **Fred Cousins** chartered **Norman Miller** to fish for Cobia off Ocracoke recently. **Fred** landed a 37-0 fish using a bucktail on 12# spin worth 246 points. This Cobia will now lead the "species" and "heaviest" categories. On the same trip, **Scott** got into the Black Sea Bass and entered a 1-12 pound on 8# plug for 109 points. **Scott's** fish will take the early lead for "species", "heaviest", and "plug divisions".

Fishing Western Branch Lake, **Billy Nicar** had a good day on Sunfish. **Billy** was using night crawlers to catch a 1-7 pound on 4# general and also a 2-1 pound Sunfish on 2# general. **His** largest fish is worth a whopping 438 points and will also lead the "species" and "heaviest" categories.

Parks Rountrey was fly fishing a private pond and entered a Sunfish on 2# fly. **Parks** landed an 11 ounce fish worth 229 points using a Shad fly. A message here is to not give up on the Shad flies after the spring run is over! **Parks** was also fishing the Chick several days earlier and caught a Gar on 2# line using a minnow for bait worth 174 points.

Jeff Doughty just informed me that he is getting the Grady White out of mothballs and going fishing for Flounder in the bay this coming weekend. Now that the word is out, I'm sure that all the large Flounder are making a "mad" early migration from the bay to the ocean! Ultimately, the ASMFC will be forced to impose a mandatory "moratorium" to protect the remaining species. **Jeff**, give the rest of us fishermen a break and release a few fish for future generations to enjoy!

The 2010 Legislators passed SB 646 requiring all towed trailers to be secured to the towing vehicle with a "locking" device. In general it contains the following requirements according to Sgt. Jones of the Safety Division of the Virginia State Police, 804-674-2827:

1. Trailer hitch connections must be secured (locked) with a pad lock, locking pin, clip, bolt and nut, or other such devise preventing the hitch from being released while underway.

2. Crossed tow chains or cables structurally adequate to securely stop and hold the trailer being towed must be in place.

3. The towing vehicle must have reinforcement, bracing, or construction of the frame sufficient to produce strength and rigidity of the frame to prevent its undue distortion.

4. This law applies to all towed trailers or towed vehicles irregardless of the type of hitch or connection including fifth wheels, drawbars, or similar devices.

5. The bill has been signed by the Governor and is effective July 1, 2010.

Several vendors of "locking" devices, costing up to \$100.00, are advertising their products in such a way that it suggests such devices are mandatory. A simple lock or nut and bolt will comply with the law.



Virginia Flounder Tournament: July 24-25

Doormat flounder action will peak in mid summer and we have a tournament at peak citation time. Popular spots for large summer flounder include the buoy 36 area and the Chesapeake Bay Bridge Tunnel. The tournament is open to all Virginia waters.

We will recognize three places for heaviest weight fish and three places for highest point fish. First = 3 pts. Second = 2 pts. Third = 1 pt.

These points will apply towards the annual Saltwater Tournament Angler of the Year competition. A fish can be entered by weight or points (angler must declare which category) but not both ways for 1 fish. One angler can enter up to two fish. It is possible to win both weight and points divisions by entering 2 different fish.

Call in entries within 24 hours from end of tournament to Angling Activities Chairman Parks Rountrey 804-349-6001. You can not change the entry category once you have registered it with the Chairman. You do not need to fill out cards.


