BOARD VOTES TO DONATE \$500 TO CCA FOR USE IN MENHADDEN ACTION

After a thorough discussion of how to best help the campaign to rightfully place management of the menhaden with the Virginia Marine Resources Commission (and remove management of this one species from the General Assembly), the VAC BOD voted to donate \$500 to the CCA-VA with the stipulation that the donation be used exclusively for the campaign to bring management of the menhaden species to the VMRS vs. continuing the current management of menhaden by the General Assembly from high atop Capitol Hill. When the BOD works out how the donation can be guaranteed to be directed to the menhaden issue, the funds will be released. For additional information on this subject, please see Matt Balzac's Conservation and Legislation Report elsewhere in this issue of The Angler. This donation when added to the individual pledges of monetary support made by VAC Members brings to over \$1000 the VAC is putting toward getting menhaden management right.

ANGLING RULES COMMITTEE SEEKS IDEAS FOR RULE CHANGES

We are a club of rules. Angling rules are not intended to exclude members from participating in the club's competitive and individual recognition activities. They are intended to bring every member to common level of participation. I have several corrections since the last newsletter. **Parks Rountrey's** 7-ounce Rock Bass entry turned out to be actually a

Warmouth caught in a private pond. Also, not sure how I overlooked **Eddy Johnston's** huge Gar weighing over 15 pounds for taking all the Gar leads. Both the Warmouth and Gar will lead in the "species" and 'heaviest" categories.

Mike Cline started out July by landing a nice 32 pound Black Drum on 8# plug worth 256 points. **Robbie Robinson**, who currently holds the 8# IGFA world record for Black Drum at 82 pounds, 8 ounces, was on-board with **Mike** fishing around the islands of the Chesapeake Bay Bridge Tunnel. I'm sure **Robbie** was helping with plenty of instructions. The fish was caught on a bucktail/Gulp combination.

The saltwater catches are finally out numbering the freshwater. Respectable freshwater entries are still being submitted. Later in the month of July, **Billy Nicar** was Smallmouth fishing on the James River and caught a 3 pound, 3 ounce fish on 6# spin for 182 points. This fish will be the "species" and "heaviest" leaders.

Matt Balazik caught a nice Flounder at the 4th island of the CBBT. **Matt** was fishing with **Parks Rountrey** when he landed the 3 pound 8 ounce fish on 4# spin. The Flounder was worth 218 points.


Rob Choi had an incredible day catching Sheepshead off the pilings of the CBBT. **Rob** was fishing in his kayak with crab for bait and landed three Virginia citation Sheepshead. The largest being a 13 pound 4 ounce fish. Since there is not a "basic weight" for Sheepshead in the braid category, **Rob** has entered the fish for the "heaviest" category.


Bob Brown and **Parks** were vacationing at Morehead City, NC and took time to do some fishing. **Bob** was using live bait to catch a 15 pound Barracuda on 8# line. The Cuda is worth 100 points and leads the "species" and "heaviest" categories.

Danny Noland, Ricky Dale, Ryan Noland, Dean Winstead, myself, with some other friends are fishing off Hatteras this week. The winds and thunderstorms have been pounding us all week with a huge swell. The Barracudas and Amberjacks have been evading us all week, also. I did manage one 35 pound Amberjack on braid off the Proteus Wreck earlier in the week. So far, our only club entry is an 8 pound Grouper I caught worth 232 points. I got the fish off the Tarpon Wreck on 6# line using a bucktail and squid combo. Danny and Ryan did see a huge Tarpon jump in the sound the other day which was the only highlight of that "blow day".

NORTH CAROLINA DIVISION OF MARINE FISHERIES 2010 SALT WATER STOCK STATUS REPORT

Since some VAC Members fish the NC salt waters, the content of this report has been condensed to cover the species more frequently fished by members of the Virginia Angles Club. This condensation of the original report is presented here to give readers an idea of how the more sought after salt water stocks of our neighboring state are faring. More detail on (1) the definitions of stock categories and (2) the status of all NC fin and shell fish stocks can be found at www.ncfisheries.net.

Stock Status Categories and Definitions

Viable - Viable stocks exhibit stable or increasing trends in average length and weight, catch per unit effort, spawning stock biomass and stable or declining trends in fishing mortality. Stocks deemed recovered by the Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission (ASMFC) would be considered VIABLE.

Recovering - RECOVERING stocks are those stocks that show marked and consistent improvement in the criteria listed for a VIABLE stock.

Concern - Stocks designated as CONCERN are those stocks that exhibit increased effort, declining landings or are negatively impacted by factors that cannot be controlled like water quality, habitat loss, disease, etc.

Depleted – Depleted stocks are those stocks where the spawning stock abundance is below a predetermined threshold or where low stock abundance precludes an active fishery. Species designated as DEPLETED would be priority candidates for Fisheries Management Plan development.

Unknown - Stocks for which insufficient data are available to determine trends in effort, landings, age distribution, recruitment, etc. are classified as UNKNOWN.

Stock Status of the More Popular NC Salt Water Fish Stocks

STRIPED BASS: Albemarle Sound and Atlantic Ocean (Migratory) Stocks - Viable.

BLACK SEA BASS: Data scarce (e.g.: mortality estimate) on this stock – Concern.

BLUE FISH: The Atlantic stock is not overfished or experiencing overfishing - Viable.

ATLANTIC CROAKER: Landings increasing but below 10 year average – Concern.

RED DRUM: Stock is coming back under current regulations – Recovering

SOUTHERN FLOUNDER: Stock is overfished – Depleted.

SUMMER FLOUNDER: Stock is no longer overfished – Recovering.

GAG GROUPER: Overfishing of stock is taking place – Concern.

RIVER HERRING: In the Albemarle Sound – Depleted.

KING MACKEREL: Stock is not being overfished – Concern.

REEF FISH: Seventeen (17) of 75 species overfished – Viable to Concerned.

SPANISH MACKEREL: Stock is not being overfished – Viable.

SPOT: Stock is not being overfished – Viable

SPOTTED SEA TROUT: Stock is at low level of abundance – Depleted.

WEAKFISH: Stock is at low level of abundance – Depleted.

A PRESENDITAL EXECUTIVE ORDER OF IMPORTANCE TO ANGLERS

If you have not read a really scary horror story, you might want to check out the following. Google "Interangency Ocean Policy Task Force" and the first pick is the home page of the Council of Environmental Quality. At the top of this home page, you will read the following:

President Obama signed an Executive Order establishing a National Policy for the Stewardship of the Ocean, Coasts, and Great Lakes on July 19, 2010. That Executive Order adopts the Final Recommendations of the Interagency Ocean Policy Task Force and directs Federal agencies to take the appropriate steps to implement them.

The Executive Order strengthens ocean governance and coordination, establishes guiding principles for ocean management, and adopts a flexible framework for effective coastal and marine spatial planning to address conservation, economic activity, user conflict, and sustainable use of the ocean, our coasts and the Great Lakes."

You are well advised to go into some of the details of these recommendations and see the possibility of a huge negative effect forthcoming regulations could have on recreational (as well as commercial) fishing. By the power of an Executive Order, the process whereby the citizens thru their Senators and Representatives is bypassed. Legislation and Conservation

Local News:

BOATERS SAFETY REQUIREMENTS: Due to a lot of safety issues concerning water crafts Virginia is slowly implementing a required boater's safety class. As of now, PWC (Jet skis etc.) users under the age of 34 are required to have had a boater's safety course of some kind. On July 1 of 2012 motorboat operators under the age of 30 will be required to have a boater's safety course of some kind. The age will increase until July 1, 2016 when all boaters are required to have had a safety course. If you have already taken a safety course it will count towards this requirement. You need to show proof to VDGIF.

OTOLITHS!!! I could really use otoliths from various species of fish caught in the Chesapeake Bay area. I'm trying to do a study on fish parts found in the Jamestown wells from 400 years ago. Whenever you catch a fish that you plan to eat and don't plan to eat the head just simply cut the head off and freeze it in a bag. I can pick heads up at meetings. I don't need 100's of a species but I could use a few. Examples of species I am looking for: sheepshead, tautog, white perch (big ones), Spanish mackerel, all kinds of stuff. I don't need anything that is found a lot in freshwater (i.e. shad, herring, catfish).

MENHADEN: There is a lot of debate on menhaden (*Brevoortia tyrannus*) management in Virginia. There's data published online that encompasses various issues on the subject. Please go to www.savemenhaden.org for more information.

Regional News:

EAT LIONFISH: Lionfish (*Pterois antennata*) are a very invasive fish spreading across reefs and wrecks from North Carolina to Florida. NOAA estimates that 27% of the current mature

population needs to be removed in order to keep the species growth to zero. The nice thing about this is that the fish taste delicious, very similar to snapper or grouper. The fish meat is not toxic as many people believe; all of the venomous parts are located on the spine tips. Just be careful handling the fish and you will be fine. The sooner we stop the invasion the better.



DEEP SEA PROTECTION: NOAA is implementing a plan to protect over 23,000 square miles of deep sea coral along US Atlantic seaboard. The plan is to eliminate any destructive fishing gear (bottom trawls) from destroying a very pristine environment. This is an important step in conserving vital oceanic ecosystems.

Global News:

BLUEFIN TUNA SEASON: The European Commission closed bluefin tuna (*Thunnus thynnus*) purse seining season short this year. This makes it three years in a row the season was cut short. It is hypothesized that the global bluefin tuna stock is 20% of what it was prior to industrial fishing.





Captain's Corner By Mike Ostrander

At the July membership meeting, during the Conservation & Legislation report we talked about the important upcoming menhaden legislation. The Virginia Angler's Club has always been a conservation club and it's our job to help where we can.

We donate money to a number of organizations that are very important to us as fishermen and our members also donate their time to many worthwhile fishing events that involve kids, adults, the disabled and veterans.

Some of the groups we donate to annually include the following: International Game Fish Association (IGFA), the Nature Conservancy (Eastern Shore), Coastal Conservation Association (CCA), the James River Association, and the Recreational Fishing Alliance (RFA). These groups work very hard and are in constant need of finances for projects and issues.

The Virginia Anglers club also donates to special projects when called upon. For example... earlier this year, member Matt Balazik's study on Atlantic Sturgeon was in dire need of some funding. Matt's need was answered by many individual donations from our membership. Matt also currently is our Conservation and Legislation chairman. We also have members who donate their time to worthy events, lead by our Publicity Chairman, Lynn Spurlin.

Right now, one of the biggest issues we face is the depleting stock of menhaden on the Atlantic Coast and the Chesapeake Bay. For years, this food source for just about every saltwater gamefish has been ravaged by the growing, powerful menhaden industry. BUT, hopefully the time has come for science and common sense to unite and change the future fate of the menhaden. For many years, the work of citizen anglers like Parks Rountrey and groups like the CCA may finally be paying off as the stronghold the Menhaden industry has had on the government may finally be starting to loosen.

The CCA is seizing the opportunity for a huge push to lobby towards changes in the menhaden industry. To get the info straight from the horse croaker's mouth, start at the following website for more info on their plan ...


