CATCHY COMMENTS by Buddy Noland

The volume of "entry cards" has decreased somewhat since the fall fish migration has begun to slow.


Mickey Kodroff and Jim Sheffield were fishing together at Swan Quarter, NC, when Mickey caught a 34 pound Red Drum using menhaden for bait for an entry worth 178 points on 17 # line. A few days later, Mickey was offshore fishing out of Oregon Inlet and "released" a White Marlin on 50# general for 122 points. Bruce Henderson's White Marlin will maintain the "species points lead" because of an earlier entry.

For the second month, **Bob Shepherd's** fishing talents have yielded additional high point entries. Fishing alone in Hungers Creek on September 19th, **Bob** caught the "heaviest category" leader, a 4 pound 12 ounce Spotted Seatrout. The trout was landed on 4# line and earned 237 points. The next day, **Bob** landed a 1 pound, 14 ounce, 312 point Croaker on 2# fly using a Clouser. The Croaker now is the "species points" and "fly division" leaders.

While fly fishing for Little Tunny off Beaufort Inlet, NC., **Parks Rountrey** had several nice catches. His best entry was a 4 pound Little Tunny worth 133 points on 6# fly. This fish will lead both the "species points" and "heaviest" categories. **Parks** also had a Little Tunny "plug" entry worth 129 points. Several days later off Atlantic Beach, **Parks** landed the "species points", "heaviest", and Club Record Spanish Mackerel. **He** was using a live mullet for bait and 8# fishing line.

Fishing together, **Bill Duval** and **Stuart Lee** submitted several entries from the New River Smallmouth Tournament. **Stuart** had a new Club Record Muskellunge, 19 pounds, 8 ounces. **He** landed the Musky on 6# spin and it is worth a whopping 406 points and replaced one of the long standing Musky records held by **Bob Shepherd**. **Bill Duval** entered a 6 ounce Rock Bass on 4# spin for the "heaviest" lead for a short period of time. The very next day, **Bob Brown** and **Parks** were fishing together in the same tournament, and **Bob** caught an 8 ounce Rock Bass on 2# spin, earning 131 points for the current "species" and "heaviest" category leads. Sorry about that **Bill**!




Bob Brown fishing the Smallmouth Tourney













VAC MEMBERS DR. DAVID DUMVILLE AND BILL REWALT PULL LINES

Two long time members of the Virginia Anglers Club have passed away recently. They are Dr. David Dumville, MD (88) of Richmond, VA and J. William ("Bill") Rewalt, III (78) of the Grand Cayman Islands. They became members of the VAC in 1966 and 1965, respectively, and fished extensively during their active years in the VAC.

DR. DAVID M. DUMVILLE, MD, (A)

Longtime Virginia Anglers Club Member and well respected Richmond physician, Dr. David M. Dumville, (88), pulled lines for the last time on September 30, 2010. Active in his cardiology and internal medicine practice on Monument Avenue for 44 years, Dave joined the Virginia Anglers Club in 1966. Known mostly by the VAC members of long tenure, David maintained his 34 year VAC membership thru 2000. He was most active in the Club from the 1960 thru the 1980s. During this time he entered 47 fish in the Club catch record system. David's angling time was primarily spent in the Atlantic Ocean off the coast of Rudee Inlet, Virginia with excursions to the same waters off North Carolina and the waters around Key West, FL. David's main angling interest was catching white marlin. VAC Member Bill DuVal accompanied Dave on many of these trips. On one trip back from offshore marlin fishing, Dave's son, Dave, Jr., unknown to Dave, fell overboard. About one and a half hours into the return trip, Dave missed seeing Dave, Jr. and discovered he was nowhere on the boat. Dave turned the boat on a reciprocal course and returned to the spot where Dave, Jr. was most likely lost. Executing a spiral search pattern in this area, Dave came upon Dave Jr. Dave Jr. had the presence of mind to pull off his pants, tie off the ends of the legs, capture air in the inverted pants and use the improvised PFD to remain afloat until rescued. Recounting this story was emotional for father and son.

J. WILLIAM ("BILL") REWALT, III (SWE, MA)

The Virginia Anglers Club has become aware of the death of the second VAC Master Angler in the history of the Club, J. William ("Bill") Rewalt, III, late of the Grand Cayman Islands. Bill passed away on November 17, 2008. Bill was invited into the VAC by Bill DuVal in 1965 while both men fished in Bermuda in the Bermuda Anglers Club International Light Tackle Fishing Association tournament. His most active years as a member of the VAC were in the 1960s thru the early 2000s. Bill Rewalt was a noted and successful fresh and salt water angler, spending 23 years to attain the rating of Master Angler. He also held the Rating of Salt Water Expert. Bill Rewalt came to the 1988 Angling Year Awards Banquet to accept the honor. Not surprisingly, if one searches the VAC data base of entries with the angler name of JW Rewalt, up come 81 entries from all over the world. His largest point catch was a 71 pound Tarpon on 4# plug worth 1014 points, a catch which was made in April, 2001 in Tobago, West Indies and a current VAC record. Probably his most unique catch was boated in May, 1977 which was a 63-6 pound white marlin caught on 6# spin while using a buck tail with a worm on it worth 636 points. Among Bill's many angling-related interests and activities, he was the Bermuda Representative of the IGFA, fished both fresh and salt water worldwide from Australia and New Zealand through Alaska, Canada, Central and South America, Europe and all of the Caribbean, was Salt Water Editor of the Mullet Wrapper (the newsletter of the International Fellowship of Fishing Rotarians, of which he was president at least one time), at one time held some 37 Bermuda line class and 11 IGFA World Records, and set up the Cayman Islands Angling Club. He helped established the Cayman Island Million Dollar Fishing Month, a tournament that lasted the month of June and offered a one million dollar prize to the participating angler who broke the Cayman Island's blue marlin record weight of 584 pounds. Bill was involved in organizing angling tournaments for 40 years. Although Bill was personally known to only a few members of the Virginia Anglers Club, we can surely be proud that such an active participant in and a supporter of international angling activities would maintain a membership in the Virginia Anglers Club for forty three years.

David and Bill now have pulled lines for the last time and join many of the early members of the Virginia Anglers Club. This group of talented and dedicated anglers set a fitting example of what a fine anglers' club should and can be. All current members now share this precious legacy and need to keep it in mind as they enjoy their angling activities as members of the Virginia Anglers Club...

CHECKING FOR THE NEW E15 FUEL

The Thursday, October 14, 2010 edition of USA Today reported that the EPA announced on October 13th "that gasoline can now contain up to 15% ethanol instead of just 10%" and noted the caveat that it be used in 2007 and newer model vehicles. The article further stated that the EPA said that"E-15 is not legal for older vehicles, heavy duty equipment, boats and small engines such as in lawn mowers". So far, 15% alcohol is permitted but not mandated. If you have any doubts at any time as to the ethanol content of any gasoline you want to test, the VAC Country Store stocks simple, reusable testing tubes. Simply fill the tube with the gasoline you want to test to a designated line on the tube. Add fresh water to a second printed line on the tube. Close the end of the tube and shake the tube. You will see thru the clear tube a line of separation of the resulting two parts of fluid. Where that line hits the percent alcohol scale printed on the tube gives you a direct reading of the percent alcohol in the sample. You may want to consider carrying one of these testing tubes on your boat or in your glove box on the tow vehicle. Remember, you are pouring raw gasoline into the tube and handling and storing a glass tube. Treat both with proper caution and you can make many tests of the gasoline you purchase at the pump or at the marina.

OCTOBER SPEAKER - CAPTAIN DAVID HESTER

Hester also loves to surf fish, chase big cobia and teach the finer points of fishing. This should be a great program.





THE FATHER OF THE MODERN "V" HULL DESIGN

When members of the Virginia Anglers Club take their boats fishing, a good number ride on hulls of the "Deep V" type design, a hull form that is easily identified by its fine entry forward with the hull flaring out into some amount of dead rise aft. Any member who has owned or currently owns a Sea Craft or a Boston Whaler rides on a Hunt inspired design. Raymond C. Hunt was the father of the "V" hull design and his design work has influenced many hulls, both power and sail.

On a spring day in 1960, a 31 foot in-board roared out through Miami's Government Cut and careened into boating history. It was a hasty morning for a test ride, but that's just what owner Dick Bertram wanted. The wind was "blowing out of the east at 22 knots and the seas were rough," he recalled. Looking at driver Sam Griffith through the spindrift, Bertram wondered what to expect from the boat with its radical bottom, a "deep-vee" designed by a quiet New England innovator named Ray Hunt.



Bertram was excited by the potential of the odd-looking hull - veeshaped for its entire length with fore-and-aft strakes below a sharp chine. Hunt knew it ran faster and handled better than other boats in high seas. Now Bertram was about to find out for himself.

Griffith, the veteran racer, cut speed instinctively to take the first wave at about 25 knots. "After the third wave, Sam started smiling and eased forward the throttles," Bertram wrote later. Griffith spun *Moppie* around and headed downwind. Instead of yawing, "the boat held its course as though it were on tracks. We opened the throttles and raced those following seas at 40 knots straight for the inlet."

In those first few moments, Bertram and Griffith became deep-vee believers.


Bertram was so impressed with Hunt and his deep-vee that he entered Moppie in the 1960 Miami-Nassau Race. The boat covered the rough, wind-whipped, 160 mile course in record time, averaging

just about 20 knots. A third of the fleet couldn't even finish.

The deep-vee was just one of many achievements in the wide-ranging design career of Charles Raymond Hunt, a complex man with a quick mind, little affinity for business and no taste for fame. Among his creations are the classic Concordia yawl, the 12 Meter Easterner and the ubiquitous Boston Whaler.

Hunt, who died in 1978 at 70, never successfully patented the idea and never got rich off it. A private man, he shunned publicity and eventually faded from the public eye.

Local News:

Striped bass Chesapeake Bay Fall Season:

The Chesapeake Bay fall striped bass (Morone saxatilis) season is in full swing until December 31st. There is a two fish per person per day possession limit now with some important size restrictions that MUST BE FOLLOWED. The typical slot limit is 18"-28", however, **one** of your two fish may be 34" or larger. Possession of stripers between 28" and 34" is illegal. Also remember gaffing striper is illegal, even if you plan to keep the fish.

Sturgeon Report:

What a season for adult Atlantic sturgeon (Acipenser oxyrinchus oxyrinchus, which I refer to AOX) upstream this year in the James. I believe most of the big boys have gone for the fall season. We caught a total of 34 fish this year which is almost double what we caught in the previous three years **combined!!** Of the 34 collections 18 fish had tracking tags mounted and are producing priceless data. Most of the tagged fish have dropped downstream and are likely in the Bay if not the ocean by now. As of October 17th VAC_1 was somewhere between the mouth of herring creek and the powerlines just downstream. This success has a lot to do with contributions from both the anglers club and individual club members. http://www.vcu.edu/rice/research/research-sturgeon.html

James River VA Blue Catfish Tournament and Social:

November 13-14 (blow date November 20-21)

Catfishing on our own home court - James River is heating up as the weather cools down. 
