## VAC NEW MEMBER RETENTION IS VERY ENCOURAGING

The VAC Leadership Team continually works hard to identity new members for the VAC. The conclusions of a study that considered new member retention from 2005 thru 2009 were presented at the February BOD Meeting. The conclusions were encouraging. For instance, the five new members joining in 2008 continued their membership thru 2010 for a 100% rate of retention.

Thirty-seven new members joined the VAC from 2005 thru the end of 2010. If the number of member-years retained vs. member-years not retained is considered for this period, there is a 4 to 1 ratio in favor of retention. Remember, we all were new members at one time and the efforts of a member or members got us hooked on membership. #### ARE YOU PAST DUE? DON'T BE - RENEW NOW!

## REMINDER CATCH SUBMISSIONS RECOGNIZED FOR PAID-UP MEMBERS ONLY

If for some reason, your 2011 VAC dues have not been paid (postmarked for mailed in dues) by February 28, 2011, any catches made on or after that date and submitted on an entry card are automatically disqualified for entry into the catch database of the VAC. Catches made after the date that dues are again made current will be eligible for entry into the catch record database if properly submitted on an entry card. Why the disqualification? The Entry Card System is only available to paid-up voting members, Life Members and Honorary Members.

Freshwater fishing is getting better with the warmer weather as reflected by the number of entries received. There were no entries for saltwater during the past month. By the time

the high water from the seasonal rains recede in the James River, the Shad and White Perch will be arriving in Richmond.

**Leroy Houser** and **Bob Brown** were fishing the James River together in early February. **Leroy** finished the day with a 51 pound Blue Catfish on 16# general for 302 points. **Bob** entered a 42 pound Blue Catfish on 8# general worth 353 points. Not a bad day. Rumors are that **Leroy** and **Gary Martel** had a Catfish over 70 pounds; as of this newsletter, I haven't received an entry .

**Fred Cousins** was also catching Blue Catfish in February. **Fred** had two 30 pound entries. The first fish was caught on the Chickahominy River on a Silver Buddy. It was a 2# plug entry is worth 461 points and will take the lead for the "freshwater plug" division. **Fred** and **George Atkinson** were fishing with **Mike Ostrander** for the second 30 pound entry. **Fred** was using cut shad on 4# line for the 319 point fish.

**Scott Johnston** and **Eddy Johnston** were fly fishing on the Chickahominy River several days later. **Scott** entered a Yellow Perch on 4# fly for 270 points which now is the "species points" leader. **Scott** usually ties his own Clousers and they work!

The same day, **Bob Shepherd** and **Fred Murray** were also catfishing on the James River. **Bob** turned in a huge 57-0 pound Blue Catfish, caught on 6# general, worth 536 points. This fish is now the leader for the "species", "heaviest", and "freshwater general" divisions. Not to mention that it will also be very difficult to beat before the end of the year.

Jeff Doughty took a week's vacation to fish the James River and entered three different species for points. His first entry was for a 10 pound, 8 ounce Bowfin, caught on 6# general worth 258 points. The fish was caught on a live minnow. Jeff's next entries were for Crappie. He entered three fish, with his best entry being 175 points. It weighed 1 pound, 12 ounces, was also caught on a minnow. Jeff's last entry was for a 2 pound, 5 ounce, Largemouth Bass on 2# general for 123 points. All three species will lead the "species" and "heaviest" divisions.


**Parks Rountrey** and **Matt Balazik** went to Chippoke's Creek for Gar in late February. **Parks** was using a jerk shad on 2# plug when he landed a 9 pound, 8 ounce fish. The Gar is worth 345 points and is now leading the "species" and "heaviest" divisions.

**Jim Sheffield** had the final entry for this newsletter. **Jim** caught a 27 pound, 8 ounce, "club record" Flathead Catfish from the James River. **Jim** was using a minnow for bait and caught the fish on 6# general. The flathead will lead the "species" and "heaviest" divisions with 321 points.

Now if the City of Richmond will clean the mud and debris off Ancarrow's Landing, we will be ready for the Shad to arrive!

### VAC MEMBER JIM DIRKS PULLS LINES FOR THE LAST TIME

Jim Dirks passed away at his home in Manakin Sabot, VA on Saturday, February 26, 2011. Jim joined the VAC in 1978. In his thirty-three years of membership, he served on the Board of Directors, was the unofficial parliamentarian of the VAC and was a member who was truly dedicated to the purposes of the Club. Although less active as an angler in the past five years, over the thirty-three years of his membership, Jim fished in seven states and Manitoba Canada, He has eighty-eight entries in the catch database that are spread among thirty separate freshwater and saltwater species. Jim was among the VAC Members who were registered as anglers at various times on the *Wild Card* when the boat was entered in the Oregon Inlet Bill Fish Tournament and unofficially represented the VAC in the Tournaments. Jim's 19-0 Jack Cravelle on 12 # spin is a Club Record that has stood for just two months short of twenty-two years when Jim pulled lines for the last time.

### VAC BOD PICKS POCKET KNIFE AS 50<sup>TH</sup> COMMEMORATIVE ITEM

After a lengthy discussion of each idea submitted for an special engraved or embroidered item to commemorate the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Virginia Anglers Club, the Board of Directors has selected a red, 3.5" Swiss Army Knife as the official commemorative item to be offered to members. Included in this knife is a small set of fold-out scissors that will cut fishing line, including braid. The knife will have durable engraving on the sides noting the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the VAC. The cost of the knife will be announced when finalized.

The Club will bear the cost of half of the purchase price. The other half of the purchase price, paid by VAC members when they buy the knife from the VAC Country Store, will be directed solely to the conservation account in the VAC annual budget.

The initial order will be for 50 knives which will be sold from the general inventory of the Country Store (no requests for reservations please) on a first-come-first-served basis. If the initial inventory is sold out, additional commemorative knives will be ordered. Country Store Keeper Eddy Johnston estimates that initial details, ordering and receipt of the initial stock of knifes will be competed by early summer. ### ABILITY OF SCALES BY BRAND TO CONSISTENTLY CERTIFY

You often see the Scale Certification Team hunkered down in the rear corner of the "Small Side" room at the Skilligalee working hard to certify a pile of Member's scales. This year, Member Ryan Noland is leading the certification work and Mike Cline is helping Ryan with the "heavy lifting". Danny Noland and Dean Winstead are doing the record work and being sure the certification stickers go on each scale as they are certified. The entire program of scale certification is overseen by Member Larry Allen. Thanks to these five guys for keeping the playing field level.

By the end of the February Membership meeting, the Team has certified a total of 142 scales this year. Many more scales are expected to be submitted for certification at the March Membership Meeting.

Over the years, the Team has noticed some trends in the ability of different brands of scales we use to pass certification. The most reliable scales have been the Boga Grip line of scales; all of which consistently passed certification. Several Manley all passed too. Chatillon is another brand which consistently passes, with some older and lighter capacity (e.g.: 6# capacity) not passing certification. Scales with aluminum frames like the Bass Pro models and scales of the digital style do not pass. This year one Bass Pro high capacity scale showed a consistent 3 pound off-set over its entire range. Scale Team members will be glad to help with any questions you might have.

### SCALE CERTIFICATION COMING UP IN MARCH

The second meeting at which scale certification will be offered will be the March 22, 2011 Membership Meeting. Please remember the following points:

- Clean the outside of the barrel so certification stickers will adhere
- Gather your scales together in one or two Zip Lock type bags.
- Write your name on the outside of the bag(s).
- Leave your bagged scales on the certification team's table. Your scales will be delivered to you when the certification process is complete.

#### MARCH WEB SITE HOW – FIND CATCH HISTORY BY SPECIES

The Web Site How for March a reminder of how to view and print down the catch records by species in the VAC database. With the shad on the way to downtown Richmond, we will use that species as the example in this discussion.

Enter the "Member's Area", log in and click on the heading "Search All Catches (Catch Database)", in the box containing the words "Any" for "Species", scroll down and click on the species for which you want to search the catch history database. This database contains all past catches submitted on any Entry Card and is current within a month or so of the receipt of new Entry Cards). For this month's example, click on "SHAD, HICKORY". Leave the other boxes with "Any" and "Date" in them alone for now. Next, click on "Search". Up comes a paltry 351 entries for all Hickory Shad submitted, automatically presented in descending order by date caught... '85.most recent catches first. There you have a tackle box full of information about baits, tackle etc.

If you want to see what hickory shad catches were submitted last year, in the box titled "Year", scroll down to 2010, click on "Search" and up comes the hickory shad entries submitted in 2010. When catches this year are submitted, they will appear in the database and you can get more current catch information. You can try all combinations of species, dates, anglers or what ever and come up with interesting historical data about past catches. You cannot harm the database, so have at it.

To print down any screen of data, just select print and you have a hard copy of the information for which you searched, ready to study, go in a file or take with you in your tackle box. Having a copy in your tackle box might be handy if the hickories turn up their noses at a shad dart. Check out other baits that have worked in the past and maybe Mr. Skunk will slip out of the boat.

Please let Johnny or John Wetlaufer know if you have a subject that you would like covered in the Monthly Web Site How feature. They will be glad to honor all requests. By the way, it is good to be a patriotic American but not too good to have a pelagic American in your cooler during shad season. If you doubt this rem inder, just ask the "expert".






## Legislation and Conservation By Matt Balazik

### **Local News:**

### Shad Fishing:

Remember, it is illegal to possess American shad in any tributaries that flow into the Chesapeake Bay. You can however possess hickory shad below the fall line in Chesapeake Bay tributaries but not above. The easiest way to tell an American from a Hickory is size; American shad are typically bigger than hickory shad. Another distinct dissimilarity has to do with the bottom jaw. The bottom jaw of an American shad is directly inline with the upper jaw; hickory shad have a very large under bite.

### **Herring:**

There is not going to be a moratorium on river herring this year (bluebacks and alewives). This is due to lack of data by the VMRC in our area. They need two years of data before a decision will be made and data collection started in 2010. Unless there are some drastic changes there will be a moratorium on herring 2012. You may possess these fish below the fall line but please use good judgment. Neither of these species are doing well.

### Fisheries Assistant Administrator Talks with Congress About Ending Overfishing:

At the March 8 Senate Commerce Committee hearing on the Magnuson-Stevens Act, Assistant Administrator for Fisheries, Eric Schwaab, said the U.S. is making good progress toward meeting the mandate to end domestic overfishing. You can listen to his talk at:

#### **Global News:**

#### **Protecting Deep-sea Corals in the North Pacific:**

At international delegation passed new conservation measures that will protect more than 16.1 million square miles of seafloor habitat in the North Pacific Ocean from bottom trawling and other bottom contact gear. Participating nations, including the U.S., Canada, Japan, Russia, China, Korea and Taiwan (Chinese Taipei), acted on a commitment they made at the United Nations General Assembly to enact interim conservation measures to protect vulnerable marine ecosystems, like seamounts, deep-sea coral and hydrothermal vents, in international waters. Oceana (an ocean protection group) and others have been working to advance these measures since 2006.



## Tournament News

### KELLY STAFFORD MEMORIAL HICKORY SHAD AND WHITE PERCH TOURNAMENT • APRIL 9 & 10, 2011 • (BLOW DATE 16 & 17)

Don't miss this one! Last year's tourney was awesome with hundreds of fish caught. Our tourney date is near peak of shad perch runs. If we are early in the runs fishing may be better down river as opposed to the I-95 area. The only potential problem is potential high muddy floodwaters that can sometimes make the James un-fishable for a few days in the spring. Small spoons, shad darts and very small 1" plastic grubs can be effective on ultra-light spinning and plug gear. Fly fishing is often more productive than the spinning outfits. Various flies work well, mostly with sinking lines, and just enough rod to throw the sinking line (5 to 7 wt). Perch are often caught while targeting shad on the same lures. In deeper water, silver buddies or any blade baits are very effective on white perch. Contact Chairman to confirm event dates if weather or River conditions are questionable.

Social gathering at Parks' truck at the Ancarrow ramp parking lot from 4:30 to 5:30 PM Saturday will include snacks, and a hot tailgate dish. You can register your catches at the social or wait till later by calling or e-mail entries to Angling Activities Chairman Parks Rountrey 804-349-6001 (prountrey@comcast.net).

This is essentially 2 tournaments on the same weekend. A fish can be entered by weight or points (angler must declare which category) but not both ways for 1 fish.


One angler can win both weight and points divisions by entering 2 different fish.

One angler can only enter two fish of each species (4 total).

Call in entries within 24 hours from the end of tournament to Angling Activities Chairman Parks Rountrey 804-349-6001. You can not change the entry category once you have registered it with the Chairman.

You do not need to fill out cards to turn in for the tournament, but do need a card if you want it to be registered as a club entry.

Tournament First Place Awards for both species by weight and points = Anglers Choice: Traditional pewter cup, \$40 Green Top gift certificate or a VAC Banquet ticket.

## TWO BILLS OF INTEREST TO ANGLERS PASSED BY THE GEN. ASSY.

(As presented in the newly revised Legislative Information System)

### **SB995**

Special combined individual sportfishing licenses; boat license

2. A special combined sportfishing license to fish in all the tidal waters of the Commonwealth during the open season that covers the owner of a recreational boat not carrying anglers for hire, in any registered boat owned and operated by him, and his passengers. For residents, this license shall be in lieu of the state resident fishing license required by subdivision A 2 of § 29.1-310, the saltwater recreational license required by § 28.2-302.1, and the saltwater recreational boat license established by § 28.2-302.7. The cost of this license for residents shall be \$125. For nonresidents, this license shall be in lieu of the state nonresident fishing license required by subdivision A 3 of §29.1-310 and the saltwater recreational license required by § 28.2-302.1. The cost of this license for nonresidents shall be \$200.

Agents of the Commission shall retain the agent's fee established by the Board of Game and Inland Fisheries pursuant to subsection B of § 29.1-327, except that the agent's fee shall be deducted from the license fee established by the Commission pursuant to subdivision 4 of § 28.2-201, as compensation for issuing each license. Of the funds collected under this subdivision, (i) \$48 per resident license sold and \$76 per nonresident license sold shall be paid into the state treasury to the credit of the Virginia Saltwater Recreational Fishing Development Fund, as established in § 28.2-302.3, and (ii) \$77 per resident license sold and \$124 per nonresident sold shall be paid into the state treasury to the credit of the Game Protection Fund, as established in § 29.1-101.

### **HB 2370**

An Act to amend and reenact § 29.1-328 of the Code of Virginia, relating to multipleyear hunting, fishing and trapping licenses and permits.

C. The Board may authorize the sale of any annual license or permit issued under this title for a period exceeding the one-year term. Such a multiple-year license or permit shall be valid for the number of consecutive years stated on the permit or license. The fee for such a multiple-year license or permit shall not exceed the total amount that would be charged if the particular license or permit was purchased on an annual basis over the specified number of years.


