BALLOT FOR 2012 DIRECTORS AND OFFICERS COMING SOON

In the past, the December issue of The Angler included the ballot by which Voting Members of the VAC could designate their approval (or write in alternates) of the slate of Directors and Officers nominated by the Nominating Committee and approved by the Board of Directors. This year the ballot will come as a separate Informational E-Mail. The ballot will be easier to extract from a single page e-mail than from the multipage Angler.

2012 BASIC WEIGHT CHANGES CREATE FORTY TWO (42!) NEW FRESH WATER RECORD SETTING OPPORTUNTIES

The Directors have approved the changes in the VAC Freshwater and Saltwater Basic Weights, effective December 1, 2011, as recommended by the Angling Rules Committee. Among the changes was the "freezing" of the former "SUNFISH, ALL" species in the Fresh Water Record Sheets. This species listing now appears as "SUNFISH, ALL" species are now replaced by the species "SUNFISH, ALL" species are now replaced by the species "SUNFISH" and "SUNFISH RED EAR". These two new Freshwater Species classifications open a total of forty-two (42) brand new VAC Club Record setting opportunities for Members.

SUPPORT FOR ATLANTIC STURGEON RESTORATION PROGRAM DECLINES in 2011

Two full years of support by Members of the Virginia Anglers Club of the VCU Rice Center's Atlantic Sturgeon Restoration Project has been completed. In 2010, the VAC and nine (9) individual VAC Members contributed a total of \$1019 to this program. In 2011, the number of individual VAC Members contributing dropped to five (5) and the amount of the total contribution dropped to \$600. If you are lining up your budget for contributions for worthy causes in 2012, please keep this Restoration Project in mind. One Atlantic Sturgeon ("Rex") tagged in 2010, was detected up in the waters of Connecticut this summer. An anomalous VAC Member has offered to make a special \$100 donation if any fish tagged in 2012 beats this distance. VAC Member Matt Balazik, a doctoral candidate in the Rice School, manages this program and will gladly discuss his work. Donation instructions are found on page 6 of this issue of The Angler.

CATCHY COMMENTS by Buddy Noland

The 2011 fishing year ended with a small number of entries. Regrettably, as in the past fishing years, only nine saltwater "species" awards will

be given out this year out of a possible thirty-six awards available. Freshwater did much better with nineteen entries out of a possible twenty-two awards to be given at the banquet in January. These species are "local entries" only because there are numerous other species not available to us in Virginia and our adjoining states. Five year old **Claire Wilkerson** had several entries in the 0-5 year age class. There were no entries in the 7-12 or 13-17 year age class for boys or girls. Hopefully, the 2012 season will be better for all of us!

Speaking of 2012, I already received a 27# Flathead entry from **Bob Brown** on 4# general worth 365 points. **Fred Cousins** has also started the New Year fishing for Spotted Seatrout. The mild December weather is helping I'm sure. Recently, **Ricky Dale** and I fished an artificial reef for Tautog and Stripers without success. But, we haven't thrown in the towel yet!

One good thing about the end of the season is that I can go over all the entries and compare them to what I have on paper and hopefully they match. Well, not all the time. One entry that I overlooked was a 165 point Club record Landlocked Striper caught by **Charlie Fasano**. The fish weighed 16 pounds, 9 ounces and was caught on 12# line using live bait. **Charlie** also released a Largemouth, Smallmouth, and a Hybrid Striper fishing on Boone Lake in Tennessee.



Parks Rountrey went back to Chipoke's Creek in early November and landed a 10 pound, 8 ounce Gar on 2# general worth 305 points. **Park's** was using a live minnow for bait.

While fishing Lee Hall Reservoir, **Fred Cousin's** entered a Chain Pickerel weighing 2 pounds, 13 ounces on 2# spinning tackle. The fish was caught on a grub and is valued at 281 points. Several days later, **Fred** caught a 4 pound, 1 ounce Speckled Trout on the Elizabeth River "hot ditch". The 270 point fish was landed on a Mirrolure.

After the VT/UNC football game, **Ricky Dale, Ryan Noland, Ron Hickman**, and I went to Cripple Creek for some Rainbow Trout. The water was very clear and low which caused the fish to easily spook. **Ricky** and **Ron** caught the most trout from the large pool in front of the warming shed but didn't weigh any of them. I landed a 3 pound Brown and a 4 pound, 4 ounce Rainbow using a Panther Martin on spinning gear. None of the catches pulled enough points to knock **Billy Nicar** off the leader board. **Ryan** was skunked! Imagine that.

Bob Brown turned in the last fish entry for 2011. Surprise, surprise, it was a 30 pound Blue Catfish. **Bob** was using cut bait in the James River when he caught the 282 point fish. A large number of quality catfish were caught this year in the club, but none could top **Leroy Houser's** 76 pound, 8 ounce Blue Catfish landed earlier in the year.

Hope to see everyone at the "awards banquet" at Sam Miller's in January!

BASIC WEIGHT CHANGES MADE FOR FIVE SPECIES FOR 2012

Here is a summary of the changes in Basic Weights that went into effect on December 1, 2011. Please refer to Freshwater and Saltwater Basic Weight sheets and VAC Club Record sheets in the Members Area of for the new basic weights.

WAHOO Lowered basic weights in all categories.

CATFISH, FLATHEAD Increased all basic weights in Fly, Spinning, and Plug Divisions. No changes in basic weights in the General Division.

SUNFISH, ALL Froze all Virginia Anglers Club Records in effect on November 31, 2011 in the "SUNFISH, ALL" category and changed this listing to read "SUNFISH, HISTORIC" (no more entries will be made in this category).

SUNFISH Established the new category "SUNFISH" in the Freshwater Basic Weight sheets and the VAC Club Record sheets with the same basic weights as the just frozen "SUNFISH, ALL" category.

SUNFISH – REDEAR Established a new category "SUNFISH - REDEAR" in the Freshwater Basic Weight sheets and the VAC Club Record sheets with the same basic weights as the "CRAPPIE" species.





A Reminder - New for 2012 - Facility Access Permit Needed on Jan. 1, 2012

Effective January 1, 2012, a Facility Access Permit will be required when using any Department-owned Wildlife Management Area or Fishing Lake. Members of the Virginia Anglers Club do not need a permit as long as they hold a valid hunting, fishing or trapping license or a current certificate of boat registration issued by the DGIF. Also exempted are persons 16 years of age or younger. The Facility Access Permit requirement does not apply to DGIF- owned boat ramps or segments of the Appalachian Trail on Department- owned land. The Facility Access Permit fee is \$ 4 for a daily permit or \$23 for an annual permit. The Facility Access Permit may be purchased online or at any license agent.

Legislation and Conservation By Matt Balazik

Local News:

Tautog: The VMRC has enacted new restrictions on the recreational and commercial harvest of Tautog in order to comply with a federal requirement to begin rebuilding a fishery deemed to be lagging coastwide. In order to cut the harvest in half, the Tautog season will be closed for recreational fishing from mid-April to mid-September.

Sturgeon Report: Atlantic sturgeon reproduction in the York River was confirmed on December 1st. The 135mm fork length fish was caught in the VIMS trawl survey a couple of miles up the Pamunkey River. This just confirms what many of us already thought. I get goose bumps just thinking about catching one of these.


