JULY PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTED SOME IMPORTANT LEGAL ISSUES

The First Ever "Beau's Crown Grant Class"

If you missed the July Membership Meeting, you missed an extremely informative and important presentation by Beau Beasley, a noted Jackson River guide, outdoor writer and recently, a dedicated advocate of outdoor enthusiasts' right to hunt, fish and enjoy other outdoor activities in the Commonwealth. Beau's topic was: "Who Owns the River: An Angler's Guide to Staying On The Water and Out of Court". Those in attendance were treated to the first of many "Beau's Crown Grant Class". Over the coming months, Beau plans to present many "Crown Grant Classes" under the auspices of The Virginia Conservation Network.

Beau takes no sides in his presentations. He lays out information about the claims of New River abutting landowners' and developers' that they "owned" sections of the actual New River and the land beneath it because they could trace ownership of such land back to original Crown Grants. Beau also presents the Commonwealth's response and position on this ownership issue. The "ownership" claim was recently litigated at great personal expense to an angler who was charged with trespassing while fishing in the New River. The outcome of this and future potential litigation has an enormous potential downside that could affect many outdoor activities, including angling and hunting, in the Commonwealth.



VAC BOD VOTES TO SUPPORT BEAU BEASLEY'S CROWN GRANT CLASSES

Beau graciously returned his expense check for his visit to Treasurer Bobby Broughton and gave the VAC a "Buff" and a Fly-fishing Guide to auction. "Catchy Comments" *By Billy Nicar*

It seems as though salt is king. Since our last meeting we have only received

on freshwater entry. With the tasty fishes of the sea abundant, and ripe for the picking in our Chesapeake Bay and off our coast, who could blame us? The cards show that those who are able to venture into the briny seas have been blessed with some nice catches.

To start thing off, Vic Skakandy submitted an entry for a spotted Seatrout that he caught on 07/06/13 while casting a grub on 2# spinning tackle at Back River. The trout weighed in at 1 pound, 12 ounces and measured 18.5" in length. This trout earns Vic 116 points for the catch. Two days later, on 07/08/13, while fishing at York Spit Channel, Andrew Campbell was not only fortunate enough to get casting opportunities at multiple cobia with his fly rod, but hooked and landed two. The largest of which weighed in at 18 pounds and measured 40 inches in length. Andrew was casting a baitfish pattern on 20# tippet to entice both fish. His largest cobia is worth 90 points, and his second cobia which weighed 17 pound, 4 ounces and measured 37 inches is worth 86 points. Andrew's 18 pound cobia will also stand as the "Heaviest" and the "Highest Points" fish in the cobia category. Pretty work Andrew!







Black Drum

If there were a day to be out fishing within the last month it would have to have been July 21, 2013. The proof is in the cards my friends. I received four catch entries from four anglers on this day. Each was fishing in the salt. First is Bob Schepker's entry for a 6 pound, 14 ounce flounder worth 171 points. Bob and Vic Skakandy were fishing together at the CBBT when the 26.5 inch flounder made its' last meal out of a live spot that Bob was fishing on 12# line. This fish earned Bob the 1st place title in the "Heaviest" division for the flounder tournament as well as "Heaviest" for the species. Beautiful fish Bob! Ryan Noland joined in on the action as well. After a laborious day Ryan decided to make a few casts on the Piankatank River. His efforts were rewarded with a 1 pound, 4 ounce croaker that bit a Gulp grub fished on 2# spinning tackle. Ryan's croaker is worth 166 points. Robbie Robinson and Mike Cline were fishing together at The CBBT for flounder when Robbie hooked into a fish that they both knew immediately was no floun-



der. After a nice fight Robbie boated a 55 pound red drum. The drum struck a jig / Gulp combination that Robbie was fishing on 8# line. This catch earns Robbie 687 points, as well as, "Heaviest" and "Highest Points" values for the species of red drum. Robbie will also take the lead in the "Saltwater Plug" division. Congratulations on an



Mike Cline submitted the first catch entry for a black drum this year on 08/03/13. Mike's black drum bit a jig / Gulp combination being jigged on 6# line at the CBBT. Mike's drum is worth 140 points and now stands as the "Heaviest" and "Highest Points" fish for the black drum category. Nice work Mike.

I would also like to mention a catch that was not submitted by catch entry card, but is well worth noting. During a recent trip out in the Chesapeake Bay, on the hunt for six citation saltwater species of fish in one year from a kayak, Rob Choi landed what could be one of the most impressive catches that I have heard about recently. On this trip Rob landed his 5th species of citation fish. A 75 inch long blacktop shark!!! From a Kayak!!! Crazy?!? You be the judge. Watch the video at www.angling-addict.com. Great job Rob!

And last, but not least, Fred Cousins submitted the only freshwater entry this month. Fred was fishing the East River when he hooked up on a 12 ounce white perch while casting a grub on 2# spinning tackle. Not only did this fish earn Fred 197 points in the spin division, but a first place title as "Angler of The Month" at July's meeting, as well as, "Heaviest" and "Highest Points" for the species. Nice fish Fred.

Flat Out Catfish Workshop - Pony Pasture Park

The Virginia Department of Game and Inland Fisheries sponsored a flathead catfish workshop in August. I've never attended a fishing class (though some would argue that I need one) and didn't really know what to expect. I needn't have worried. Chris Dunnavant (Angling Education Coordinator / DGIF) and his team really outdid themselves. First, the site: I've lived for 35 years within 3 miles of Pony Pasture Park and have never made a visit. Shame on me! What a great place to go fishing, or for that matter, a family picnic, swimming, kayaking or just sunning on the rocks. It is just gorgeous. With the river below 5 feet, it was a fairly easy wade to the 'fishing hole' with the water generally at waist level or below. The river bottom can be slippery so, even at this level, a life jacket is recommended. As always, safety first!

Second, the instruction: Capt. Mike Ostrander provided a great overview on the equipment, the bait and the fishing techniques for catching Flathead Catfish. Capt. Mike is a guide on the James River. It is obvious that he knows his trade and the James River very well. Of primary interest to me was 'setting the hook'. I'm used to immediately setting the hook when I feel a tug on my line but today we were using circle hooks. Additionally, flatheads are a little different in that you need to let them take the bait. You need to wait until your pole is almost parallel to the water before setting the hook. In this case, 'Patience is a virtue'. Of course, Capt. Mike's excellent instructions did little to prevent my reflexes from kicking in and setting the hook on the first tug that I felt. As expected, I missed him. I did manage to keep my reflexes under control for the remainder of the day.

Third, the team: All of the instructors are volunteers. Several were from the DGIF but we also had Lee Rothgeb and Capt. Mike Ostrander from our Virginia Anglers Club. We were split into teams with anywhere from 2 to 4 people per instructor. This is a far better ratio of angler to instructor than I had expected. The instructors only goals were to make sure that we had fun and that we caught fish. They offered as much, or as little, assistance as the individual desired. They would bait and cast for you or walk you through the process if you wished to do it yourself. They fished alongside us but, if they managed to hook into a catfish, were more than willing to pass the pole to us. Once you did catch one, they were indispensable in removing the hook and releasing the catch. Believe me, a 15lb to 25lb Flathead is a handful, especially when you are in waist deep





water. The instructors were also instrumental in fostering a little friendly competition among the teams.

In addition to the instructors, DGIF provided all of the fishing gear, life vests, bait and even threw in a great lunch with soft drinks. The class runs for approximately 8 hours. You may think that this is a lot of time to spend up to your waist in water. It isn't....the time really flew by. When we called it quits, no one wanted to leave. All 13 of us caught fish. Total catch was 28 catfish. Though we did catch some Blue Cats, the majority were Flatheads. The lead team managed to catch 10. Not to be outdone, the 'Women's Team' showed the guys a thing or two and made up for 'quantity' with 'quality'. They hauled in the largest of the day at 21lbs. As for myself, I managed to catch 3 with the largest coming in at 17.5lbs, second largest of the day. This workshop is offered annually. Keep an eye out for it in the VAC Newsletter or on the DGIF website. If you enjoy a nice relaxing day on the river, give it shot next year. You won't regret it.




