- Clean the outside of the barrel so certification stickers will adhere
- Gather your scales together in one or two Zip Lock type bags.
- Write your name on the outside of the bag.
- Leave your bagged scales on the certification team's table (just inside the entry door to the meeting room).

ASMFC SETS SUMMER FLOUNDER REGS FOR VIRGINIA

The Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission has set the lower length limit for Summer Founders in Virginia at 16" and the daily creel limit (possession) of 4 fish per angler.

PROPOSED NEW REGULATIONS FOR SELECTED SPECIES

Lynn Spurlin, Conservation and Legislation VP, has gone thru the list of proposed changes in existing regulations of the Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission's Fin Fish Committee. Lynn has picked out the proposals for the following three species most likely of interest to members of the VAC who fish in Virginia waters.

Speckled Trout

A moratorium on recreational catching of Speckled Trout went into effect on March 1 and will end on July 31, 2014. The exceptionally cold winter weather in the Commonwealth has resulted in a heavy mortality of specks. Without pressure from recreational angling, the remaining stock of specks can have the best chance of a successful spawn.

When catching specks is allowed again, the proposed regulation is one fish over 24" and a creel limit of 5 specks per angler. Commercial purchase reporting would be required weekly and monthly until 80% of the commercial quota is reached.

Cobia

A limit of one fish per person with an additional limit of 6 fish per boat per day is being considered.

Red Drum

The proposal is to limit possession by an angler to 3 fish within the slot limit of 18" to 26" in length.

DGIF WADE FISHING WORKSHOPS FOR FLATHEADS OFFERED AGAIN THIS JULY

The Virginia Department of Game and Inland Fisheries will again hold their popular Wade Fishing For

Flathead Catfish workshops this coming July. Four of the instructors are members of the Virginia Anglers Club; Mike Ostrander, Lee Rothgeb, David "Sarge" Brayman and Billy Nicar. Please turn to page 6 of this issue of The Angler for more details. Many VAC Members attended a session of this workshop last year. Early registration is important for these popular days of instructional fishing.

MCAULIFFE APPOINTS THREE OFFICIALS

The McAuliffe administration has announced another round of appointments, including top posts at the Virginia Marine Resources Commission and the Department of Conservation and Recreation.

John M.R. Bull has been named commissioner of VMRC, which has oversight of key fisheries in the Chesapeake Bay, including the bay's signature crab and oyster stocks. Bull is a former newspaper reporter who joined the commission in June 2007. He most recently was the commission's spokesman and liaison with the General Assembly.

Somewhere between the snow, sleet, and freezing rain, spring is peeking at us. It has only given us brief glances, but it is undeniably knocking on our door. Not only have I noticed the daffodils sprouting in the past few days, but I have been given the most conclusive proof possible. A little four letter word... shad! It's true! I have not only

spoken with state biologists who have shocked them up in the James River, but I have first hand reports accompanied with pictures of some beautiful hickory shad caught on hook and line in Richmond on the James River within the past couple of days. So, load up those reels with fresh line, grab your favorite spoons, darts, or flies and let the fun begin. Guys, spring is here. Go fishing.

I would like to make everyone aware of an emergency closure in Virginia's spotted seatrout season. Due to an unusually cold winter there has been a large number of trout found dead in the Middle Peninsula creeks, as well as, Rudee Inlet and Lynnhaven Inlet. This season closure will extend from March 1, 2014 and last through July 31, 2014. The closed season does not apply to commercial fishing or recreational catch and release.

Starting things off this month is Robbie Robinson who was fishing the Chickahominy River on the 22nd of February when quite a nice fish fell victim to the irresistible dance of his blade bait. After what I am quite sure was a great fight, a 22 pound blue catfish was boated using 2# plug tackle. This 338 point fish will earn Robbie the title of "Freshwater Plug" division leader. Great catch Robbie! Our resident "Fly Guy", Andrew Campbell, was fishing the Chickahominy as well the very next day on February 23rd. While casting a fly on 12# tippet Andrew hooked and boated a chain pickerel weighing in at 2 pounds, 12 ounces. This 21.75" specimen earns Andrew 123 points, the "Freshwater Fly" division lead, and the "Highest Points" for the species. Nice fish Andrew! Also fishing the Chickahominy River on February

23rd was Glenn Carter. Glenn was casting a Jig-n-Minnow on 2# spinning tackle to catch one slab of a crappie. The 178 point crappie weighed 1pound, 2 ounces and will stand as the "Freshwater Spin" division leader, the "Highest Points" and "Heaviest" for the species to date, and hopefully a darn good meal. Yum!!! While Andrew and Glen where fishing the Chickahominy on February 23rd, Bob Shepherd was soaking some bait around the corner somewhere on the James River. As usual Bob pulled out a nice fish. In what I expect to be another great fight, Bob boated a 46 pound blue catfish using cut shad on only 4# tackle. This fish will earn Bob 490 points for the catch, the "Freshwater General" division title, as well as, the "Highest Points" and "Heaviest" for the species. Beautiful catch Bob! Fred Cousins found himself fishing the Chickahominy River on March 11th. Fred was jigging a blade bait on 2# plug tackle when a 1 pound, 3 ounce yellow perch worth 312 points slammed his lure. This catch will stand as the current "Highest Points" and "Heaviest" for the species. Nice job Fred!

<u>APRIL PROGRAM - CAPT. GARY DUBIEL</u> FISHING FOR DRUM WITH LIGHT TACKLE

A little background on Gary. He runs a year round light tackle and fly fishing guide service in North Carolina, fishing Oriental, New Bern and the Crystal Coast. In addition to his many other fisheries, he developed a light tackle artificial lure and fly fishery for adult red drum on the Neuse River and Pamlico Sound. He has been guiding for 15 years and has had numerous speaking engagements. Gary will be giving the VAC a presentation on his red drum techniques for both fly and light tackle. Gary is sure some of what our Members will learn can be applied to fishing in the Chesapeake Bay. He will incorporate both a Power Point and hands on presentation at the April Membership Meeting.

Gary offers VAC members a \$50 discount on bookings for his giant red drum trips for 2014 (July into October). He also can arrange a multi-boat charter for red drum out of Oriental. He currently has a very large group originating from Richmond that is returning for their 3rd season. He can accommodate 21 anglers with 6 additional guides that work with him on these types of trips. Typically, Gary would fish 4.5 hours in the morning, take a lunch break, then fish 4.5 hours in the afternoon. Day 2 can either be another full day or 5 hour half day. Trip cost per angler including tip for 1 1/2 days would be \$450 or two full days \$600 based on 3 anglers per bay boat. Fishing licenses are also covered. He can help customers with room reservations as well. Everyone should have multiple drum over 40 inches during the trip! You can contact Gary at (252)-249-1520 or www.specfever.com.




Sam Hall (Sponsors Bob Brown and John Wetlaufer, Sr.)

SHAD ID PHOTOS AND VMRC "RIVER HERRING" MORATORIUM REMINDER

Remember the VMRC has established a moratorium on the possession of "River Herring". The formal description of "River Herring" is any fish of the species Alosa aestivalis (Blue Back Herring) or Alosa seudoharengus (Alewife) (see pictures below). Any person possessing "River Shad" shall be guilty of a Class 3 misdemeanor and a second or subsequent by the same person, within 12 months of a prior violation, is a Class 1 misdemeanor. 

MARK YOUR CALENDAR! PRIME SHAD FISHING IS FROM ROCKETTS TO UP ABOVE THE 14TH STREET BRIDGE. THE ONLY POTENTIAL PROBLEM IS POTENTIAL HIGH MUDDY FLOOD WATERS THAT CAN SOMETIMES MAKE THE JAMES UN-FISHABLE FOR A FEW DAYS IN THE SPRING. SMALL SPOONS, SHAD DARTS AND CRAPPIE JIGS CAN BE EFFECTIVE ON ULTRA-LIGHT SPINNING AND PLUG GEAR. FLY FISHING IS OFTEN MORE PRODUCTIVE THAN THE SPINNING OUTFITS. VARIOUS FLIES WORK WELL, MOSTLY WITH SINKING LINES, AND JUST ENOUGH ROD TO THROW THE SINKING LINE. PERCH ARE OFTEN CAUGHT WHILE TARGETING SHAD ON THE SAME LURES. IN DEEPER WATER SILVER BUDDIES OR ANY BLADE BAITS ARE VERY EFFECTIVE ON WHITE PERCH. CONTACT CHAIRMAN TO CONFIRM EVENT DATES IF WEATHER OR RIVER CONDITIONS ARE QUESTIONABLE.

THIS IS ESSENTIALLY 2 TOURNAMENTS ON THE SAME WEEKEND. A FISH CAN BE ENTERED BY WEIGHT OR POINTS (ANGLER MUST DECLARE WHICH CATEGORY) BUT NOT BOTH WAYS FOR 1 FISH. ONE ANGLER CAN WIN BOTH WEIGHT AND POINTS DIVISIONS BY ENTERING 2 DIFFERENT FISH. ONE ANGLER CAN ONLY ENTER TWO FISH OF EACH SPECIES (4 TOTAL).


