
#### LAST CALL FOR AT MEETING SCALE CERTIFICATION


"Anticipation"

# "Catchy Comments" By Billy Nicar

It seems that freshwater is currently the place to be. The shad are running strong in tidal rivers and the striper have followed, largemouth and smallmouth bass are looking to spawn very soon, crap-

pie have moved shallow, and the catfish are plumping up for their spawn as well. Whew! It is a good time to be a freshwater angler. But, something stirs in the briny depths. In just the past few days I have heard reports of puppy drum at Rudee Inlet, tautog on the CBBT and surrounding wrecks, as well as a few flounder having been caught. So wipe the dust off those saltwater rods and get ready for some action because things are about to break loose.

We will kick things off with Jay Blankenship this month. His first entry was for a 4, 10 ounce largemouth bass that he caught on March 16th while fishing Randolph Lake. This bass is worth 231 points for Jay landing it using 6# fly tackle. Jay's second fish was a 2 pound, 6 ounce hickory shad landed on March 21st while fishing 6# fly tackle in the James River. This giant shad will earn Jay 239 points for the catch. Jay's third entry was for a 3 pound, 14

ounce largemouth bass that he landed using 6# fly tackle while fishing Ash Lake on March 22nd. This catch will earn Jay 193 points. Great catches, Jay! Our next entry comes from Karen Anderson. On April 8th Karen was fishing a shad spoon on 6# spinning Tackle in the James River when she landed a 1 pound, 4 ounce hickory shad worth 101 point. Congrats, Karen! Bob Brown managed to make it to the James River on April 5th to take advantage of a little shad action. Bob's 1 pound, 12 ounce hickory shad was landed using a shad dart tied to 2# spinning tackle and earns Bob 198 points. Nice fish, Bob! Andrew Campbell found himself hooked up to a bruiser of a shad while fishing the James River on March 18th. Andrew's 2 pound, 12 ounce hickory shad was boated using 6# fly tackle and ears him 277 points and the title of "Heaviest" for the species. On March 29th Andrew caught a 20 pound, 0 ounce blue catfish from the James River on cut shad fished on 20# tackle. This blue cat is worth 103 points. Great fish, Andrew! A 6 pound, 8 ounce largemouth bass was Glen Carter's first catch entry for the month. Glen was fishing a jig-n-pig in a private pond on March 12th when he hooked into the big ol' bass. Glen landed the bass using 12# plug tackle earning him 162 points for the catch and the "Heaviest" for the species. Glen had such a good day on March 12th that he decided to sneak back in to the pond on April 1st. On this day Glen caught a largemouth bass that would earn him the title of "Highest Points" for the species and 262 points. This 5 pound, 4 ounce specimen bit a spinnerbait fished on 4# plug tackle. Question... Should the club require photographs of fish submitted for entry if the date of catch is April 1st? Hmmm... Just kidding! Nice catches, Glen! Fred Cousins joined in on the shad fun. While fishing 2# fly tackle on March 27th Fred caught another of the unusually large hickory shad that have been landed this

season. Fred's hickory shad is worth 321 points and earns him the title of "Highest Points" for the species, "Fly Division" leader, and 1st place for the "Angler of the Month" competition at the March meeting. Great job, Fred! Eddie Johnston is officially on the board for the year with a 2 pound, 13 ounce chain pickerel worth 281 points. Eddie was fishing a jig on 2# spinning tackle in Chickahominy River on March 8th to catch the pickerel. This earns Eddie the title of "Highest Points" for the species. Nice fish, Eddie! Last, but not least, we have Stuart Lee's entries. Stuart spent a little time down south in Guatemala, and just happened to fish a little while there. On March 13th Stuart landed a pacific sailfish on 20# fly tackle. Unable to officially weigh the fish, Stuart used the release weight which earns him 500 points. About an hour after catching his sailfish, Stuart boated a 25 pound, 0 ounce dolphin on 20# fly tackle. The dolphin catch is worth 147 points and earns Stuart a new "Club Record". Stuart's final entry for the month is for a monster hickory shad caught on March 24th from the James River. Stuart's 2 pound, 7 ounce hickory shad bit a fly tied onto 8# fly tackle and earns him 215 points for the catch. Great fish, Stuart!

#### APRIL PROGRAM - CAPT. GARY DUBIEL FISHING FOR DRUM WITH LIGHT TACKLE



A little background on Gary. He runs a year round light tackle and fly fishing guide service in North Carolina, fishing Oriental, New Bern and the Crystal Coast. In addition to his many other fisheries, he developed a light tackle artificial lure and fly fishery for adult red drum on the Neuse River and Pamlico Sound. He has been guiding for 15 years and have had numerous speaking engagements. Gary will be giving the VAC a presentation on his red drum techniques for both fly and light tackle. Gary is sure some of what our Members will learn can be applied to fishing in the Chesapeake Bay. He will incorporate both a Power Point and hands on presentation at the April Membership Meeting.

Gary offers VAC members a \$50 discount on bookings for his giant red drum trips for 2014 (July into October). He also can arrange a multiboat charter for red drum out of Oriental. He currently has a very large group originating from Richmond that is returning for their 3rd season. He can accommodate 21 anglers with 6 additional guides that work with him on these types of trips. Typically, Gary would fish 4.5 hours in the morning, take a lunch break, then fish 4.5 hours in the afternoon. Day 2 can either be another full day or 5 hour half day. Trip cost per angler including tip for 1 1/2 days would be \$450 or two full days \$600 based on 3 anglers per bay boat. Fishing licenses are also covered. He can help customers with room reservations as well. Everyone should have multiple drum over 40 inches during the trip! You can contact Gary at (252)-249-1520 or www.specfever.com.



#### TROUT IN THE CLASSROOM KIDS RAISE TROT FROM EGGS TO FINGERLINGS (From a recent edition of The Outdoor Report)

The Virginia Trout In The Classroom (TIC) program is wrapping up another successful year with 220 classrooms in Virginia raising trout from the egg stage through the fingerling stage. After raising their trout for the past few months, schools all over Virginia are starting to release their baby fish. Most schools release their trout in April and May in streams that have been approved by Virginia Department of Game and Inland Fisheries biologists. The young trout will range from 1/1/2 inches to as much as 3-4 inches long, depending on how many survived and how much food they ate.

Most schools raise Brook trout; however a few raise Rainbows and Browns. All eggs are provided by VDGIF, and the fish are raised in 55 gallon aquariums equipped with special chilling units that keep the water cool and comfortable for trout. Much of the success of the program is due to the efforts of volunteers from 13 chapters of Trout Unlimited. Trout Unlimited chapters help fund the programs and provide technical assistance to teachers. At the start of the school year, TU members help set up tanks and distribute trout eggs, during the year they trouble shoot aquarium problems, and in the spring they coordinate release activities. Teachers interested in starting TIC programs in their schools next year should contact the Virginia TIC Coordinator Chuck Hoysa at chuck.hoysa@dgif.virginia.gov.

# BERNIE SKYDANEK MEMORIAL EASTERN SHORE VA SURF RED & BLACK DRUM MAY 10TH AND 11TH, 2014

#### (TIDES HIGH @ 6:00 AM & PM) (BLOW DATE MAY 25TH AND 26TH - 2 WEEKS LATER)

Although this was a near blow-out last year, don't miss the tournament this year. Our tourney date is near peak of the spring drum migration. You should have waders, a fairly shallow draft boat (or ride with a fellow member) and be prepared for a long hike after anchoring your boat in shallow water behind a barrier island. Contact tournament guide Bob Shepherd before the 10th to confirm your participation and also to check if weather or surf conditions are questionable and may lead to a blow.

Times: Sun-up Saturday to Sundown Sunday Location: Barrier Islands of Virginia Eastern Shore

For those who may be unfamiliar with the Eastern Shore, but still would like to fish, please contact Bob Shepherd. Bob will be glad to lead people to the fishing grounds (keeping in mind that different sized boats may have to take different paths to access the islands).

Tips: Peeler crabs and fresh cut bait (such as spot, croakers, whiting, bluefish, menhaden, etc.) are all good red drum baits. Black drum are frequently caught from the surf this time of year as well, so fishing with peeler crabs opens the opportunity to catch those as well. A half dozen peeler crabs can get an angler through the day when things are slow, but on a good bite, or when bait stealers are prevalent, it's not uncommon to burn through 1.5 dozen peelers per angler per day.


