### VAC ANGLING RULES COMMITTEE SEEKS MEMBERS' INPUT

The Angling Rules Committee will soon meet to consider any changes in angling rules, catches of species eligible for records and awards, basic weights for all FW and SW species, tackle divisions and line weights. tournament rules, etc. If any members see anything in the VAC Angling Rules as currently written that needs a change, please bring these items to the attention of Stuart Lee, Angling Rules Chairman (stulee37@gmail.com).

#### HAVE YOU ATTTENDED OR TAKEN BOATING SAFETY CLASS?

The General Assembly passed legislation making it mandatory for operators on Virginia Waters of jet skis and motor boats powered by motors of 10 HP or greater to attend a Boating Safety Class sponsored by the DGIF or take an approved course on line. This requirement was phased in over the last few years and is at the point, as of July 1, 2014, that all operators of Personal Water Craft (jet skis) and that operators of age 45 years or younger of motorboats with motors 10 HP and over must have taken one of the Safe Boating Class options. After next July 1, 2015, the age ratchets up to 50 years and younger. After July 1, 2016, the class requirement applies to all operators of PWCs and Motor Boats powered by motors 10 HP or greater. For details of documentation that may be shown in lieu of taking a class, please see information at www.dgif.gov/boating.

There are classes available on line on the Internet that qualify as Boating Safety Classes. These classes are roughly four hours in length and may cost something around \$29.00 to take. These on-line classes do require the student to go thru the entire class and he/she cannot skip to the end and just take the class. ## "Catchy Comments"

Cooler winds are blowing, and if some on the forecast predictions that I have seen come true we are all in for quite a cold, nasty, snowy, winter. This is an El Nino year. Now is the time to go get some fishing done! Just because the temperatures are cooling a bit doesn't mean that the fishing is. There are reports of big red drum near and around the CBBT, some speckled trout and puppy drum inland, and the spot should be about prime. Freshwater fishing can only get better as well as the water temperatures cool. There were only a handful of catch entry cards submitted this past month, so dust off those rods and tackle boxes. It's time to go to work on some fish! I hope that the month of September treats everyone well, both on and off of the water.

All of the entries that I have received this past month belong to the Nolands. On August 6th, while trolling a ballyhoo on 50# tackle, Ryan Noland hooked into a giant wahoo weighing tipping the scales at 56 pounds. This wahoo is worth 151 points on the 50# general tackle used to catch it and earns Ryan the titles of "Heaviest", Highest Points", and "Saltwater General Division" leader. On top of that, Ryan will receive a Trophy Fish Citation award from North Carolina for this fine fish. Great catch, Ryan! The very next day, on August 7th, Buddy Noland was casting a bucktail jig on 8# plug tackle when a 25 pound amberjack crashed the party. This 277 point amberjack will earn Buddy the titles of "Highest points" for the species and "Saltwater Plug Division" leader. You've got to love a wreck donkey! A few days later Buddy found himself hooked up again while fishing the Virginia Beach Billfish Tournament aboard the 52' Viking, "Contango". This time he was tied into an Atlantic sailfish on 30# general tackle. Using the "release weight" of 50 pounds assigned to this species Buddy will earn 151 points for his catch. Not more than 40 minutes later Buddy was hooked up once again, but this time it was a white marlin that ate the trolled ballyhoo. The "release weight" assigned to a white marlin is 55 pounds, and when boated on 30# general tackle, Buddy's white marlin catch calculates to 148 points. Congrats on such fine catches this month, Buddy!

Please let me know if you have any fun, exciting, informational, or scary fish tales from your recent trips out. I would love to include them in future newsletters. ### "REX", THE ROAMING STURGEON, RETURNS TO THE JAMES RIVER

In June 2010, John (Sr.) and Johnny (Jr.) Wetlaufer made a donation to VCU's Rice Center and designated the donation to the support of the work with the Atlantic Sturgeon being led by Member Matt Balazik. Their donation entitled them to have a tagged Atlantic Sturgeon named by them. The name picked was Johnny's family dog, a Shepherd – Doberman mix (actually all bark and very little bite) named "Rex". Rex was with Johnny on the river Sept 6, 2010 and they had pulled alongside Matt to talk. Matt had just caught and tagged a sturgeon with a prop injury on his gill plate. Matt asked Johnny if he wanted to adopt that fish, since he witnessed its catch. Hence, Rex was the moniker put on an Atlantic Sturgeon that Matt caught and tagged. Rex left the Richmond Area by swimming on down the James and out into the expenses of the Western Atlantic Ocean.

The next time Rex "checked in" was up in Connecticut in June and July of 2011 while swimming in the Connecticut River. Other than this sighting, nothing was heard of from Rex for three years.

This August, a couple of days before the 28th, Matt was checking his nets around the Ghost Fleet. Guess what? Yep, there was the long absent Rex waiting for Matt's welcoming hug. Matt recognized Rex by a deformity on one of his gill plates. Some of the Atlantic Sturgeons sponsored by generous donations by VAC members have come back annually to the Richmond Area. However, Rex holds the longest known distance record.

If any other Atlantic Sturgeon that has been named by a VAC member is confirmed to have travelled to a more distant spot than Rex, the Wetlaufers will donate to the work of Matt in the name of the sponsor of that further roaming sturgeon, who can, in turn, name another Atlantic Sturgeon. In 2011, the Wetlaufers made a second donation to Matt's work.

Somewhere out there cousins "Frick" and "Frack" are hopefully enjoying the good life.

To make a donation to Matt's work thru the VCU Rice Center, here is what you need to do. For each increment of \$100, Matt will bestow the name of your choosing on one of his Atlantic Sturgeon friends.

# NEXT TOURNAMENT - VA / NC SPECKLED TROUT (OCTOBER 25TH AND 26TH) BLOW DATE THE FOLLOWING WEEKEND

OUR TOURNEY WILL BE AT A PEAK TIME FOR ACTIVELY FEEDING FALL SPOTTED SEA TROUT. FISH CAN BE CAUGHT ON ALL THE SAME ARTIFICIAL OR LIVE BAITS. FOR LIGHT TACKLE POINTS - VARIOUS SOFT PLASTIC BAITS AND MIRRO-LURES ARE EFFECTIVE ON LIGHT SPINNING AND PLUG GEAR. FISH ARE AVAILABLE IN SKINNY WATER AND VERY EASY TO GET TO SO ANY TRAILERABLE BOAT, JON BOAT OR EVEN KAYAKS AND WADING CAN BE VERY EFFECTIVE. IF YOU HAVE NOT TRIED IT BEFORE, NOW IS A GREAT TIME - BE SURE TO PLAN ON FISHING AND LEARNING WITH US. CONTACT CHAIRMAN LEE ROTHGEB TO CONFIRM EVENT IF WEATHER IS QUESTIONABLE.

Two ways to win! We will recognize three places for heaviest weight fish and three places for highest point fish for each species. First = 3 pts. Second = 2 pts. Third = 1 pt. These points will apply towards the annual Salt Water Tournament Angler of the Year competition. A fish can be entered by weight or points (angler must declare which category) but not both ways for 1 fish. Only 2 fish of each species can be entered per person. Entries must be turned in within 24 hours from the end of tournament.


