

BOD APPROVES AMENDMENTS TO ARTICLE IV OF THE BY-LAWS VOTE TO BE HELD AT THE NOVEMBER MEMBERSHIP MEETING

FROM RECENT EDITIONS OF THE DGIF OUTDOOR REPORT

VDGIF will be closing its Deep Point Public Boat Landing at the end of State Route 606 on the Piankatank River near Harcum in Gloucester County, starting September 5 and lasting approximately 60 days. The concrete boat ramp and courtesy piers will be replaced and the parking area refurbished. These activities will necessitate closing the ramp and parking area. John Kirk Boating Access Maintenance Supervisor for the coastal region wants the public to know, "This repair will upgrade an aging facility and provide boaters and anglers better access to the Piankatank river." Alternate launches in the area are Mill Creek Landing in Wake on the Rappahannock River and Warehouse Landing in Gloucester on the Ware River. <u>NEWS FROM THE</u> <u>VIRGINIA MARINE RESOURCES COMMISSION</u>

The Commission voted unanimously to advertise for an October 28, 2014 public hearing to consider an increase saltwater recreational license fees to ensure continuation of core recreational programs. These core recreational programs include, but are not limited to, recreational law enforcement, the Virginia Saltwater Tournament, the game fish tagging program, and the artificial reef program. The recreational license fees have only been increase two times since 1993. The recreational fishing advisory board is supportive of the proposed amendments in order to continue the funding of core recreational programs

If you are 65 years of age or older: No license is required, but these older anglers are required to obtain a no-cost FIP registration prior to fishing. Effective 7/1/13 there is a \$5 optional lifetime saltwater fishing license for VA resident anglers 65 or older, if a person has purchased this optional license they do not need to register in FIP.

OCTOBER PROGRAM – ATLANTIC STURGEON IN NEAR-BY WATERS



Matt Balazik will present a program about his research with the Atlantic Sturgeon. Mike has permission to net this ancient species for his research and has extensive information on each of his catches. He tags each sturgeon caught and tracks their local wanderings with special tags which he implants on each specimen he nets. Matt recently received his PhD from VCU and has spoken internationally about his research.

Matt works out of the Rice Rivers Center located just downstream of the Benjamin Harrison Bridge. He has been studying the life-history of the endangered Atlantic sturgeon for seven years now. New findings show that a large portion of the Atlantic sturgeon's life history was misinterpreted. The new data collected in the James not only answers important unknown aspects in our area but areas along the fish's entire range. The new information helps restoration efforts in the James. The species appears to be bouncing back very well and is on its way to a strong recovery.

BOD APPROVES AMENDMENTS TO ARTICLE IV OF THE BY-LAWS VOTE TO BE HELD AT THE NOVEMBER MEMBERSHIP MEETING

Proposed Amendments* to Article IV, Dues, Section 1 & 2 Of The By-Laws of The Virginia Anglers Club Section 1

Discussion:

Page 6

Article IV, Section 1 of the Virginia Anglers Club By-Laws requires that dues be billed at the beginning of each angling year (December 1st). The practice of sending out bills on December 1st has not been practiced for years.

This proposed amendment modifies Section 1 to reflect current practice.

The Board of Director's supports the amendment shown below for Section 1 and urges the VAC Membership to approve the amendment at the November Membership Meeting where the vote to make the below amendments will be held.

Amendment*:

Section 1: Dues for membership in the organization shall be payable in advance. The dues for resident members shall be sixty dollars (\$60) per year. The dues for non-resident members shall be forty dollars (\$40) per year. An initiation fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25) shall be required of each member, resident, or non- resident. Dues will be billed and are payable on December 1, the beginning of each angling year. New member's dues shall be prorated monthly from the date of membership to the next billing date (as amended 1-1-73, 3-1-78, 1-12-82, 8-25-97, 2-27-90, 11-22-94, 2-22-05 & 11-27-07, 11-25-14).

Section 2

Discussion:

Article IV, Section 2 of the Virginia Anglers Club By-Laws requires that any former member petitioning the VAC for reinstatement to membership is required to pay the \$25 initiation fee if he/she did not submit a formal notice of resignation when the member previously resigned. Such formal resignations are normally recorded in the Minutes of the VAC Board of Director's.

Verification of such a previous formal resignation may be not be able to made if the formal resignation was not recorded or the minuets in which such a resignation was recorded can not be found. The lack of payment of the twenty-five dollar (\$25.00) initiation fee does not have a discernable impact on the financial stability of the VAC.

No one can remember a member being automatically suspended from membership in the VAC for non-payment of annual dues by February 28(29).

These proposed amendments modify Section 2 to reflect current practice.

The Board of Director's supports the amendment shown below for Section 2. and urges the VAC Membership to approve the amendment at the November Membership Meeting where the vote to make the below amendments will be held.

Amendment*:

Section 2: Members whose dues are not paid within ninety (90) days of the date due shall be automatically suspended from membership. Former members may petition the board of directors for reinstatement to full membership. Prorated dues for the balance of the current angling year must accompany such a petition. Such suspended members may petition the board of directors for reinstatement after tendering all arrears and current dues. Any past member who gave a written resignation may be reinstated by paying the current dues and those who did not give a written resignation may be reinstated by paying the current dues and initiation fee,

*Notes:

(1) Deletions shown by $\frac{xxxxxxx}{xxxxx}$. Additions shown as $\frac{xxxxxx}{xxxx}$.

(2) Amendments to the By-Laws must be advertised one month in advance of the vote to make such amendments. This notice satisfies this requirement. The quorum for a vote on an amendment is defined by the VAC By-Laws is a minimum 20 members. Passing an amendment requires a 2/3rds majority vote.

NEXT TOURNAMENT - VA / NC SPECKLED TROUT (October 25th and 26th)

OUR TOURNEY WILL BE AT A PEAK TIME FOR ACTIVELY FEEDING FALL SPOTTED SEA TROUT. FISH CAN BE CAUGHT ON ALL THE SAME ARTIFICIAL OR LIVE BAITS. FOR LIGHT TACKLE POINTS -VARIOUS SOFT PLASTIC BAITS AND MIRRO-LURES ARE EFFECTIVE ON LIGHT SPINNING AND PLUG GEAR. FISH ARE AVAILABLE IN SKINNY WATER AND VERY EASY TO GET TO SO ANY TRAILERABLE BOAT, JON BOAT OR EVEN KAYAKS AND WADING CAN BE VERY EFFECTIVE. IF YOU HAVE NOT TRIED IT BEFORE, NOW IS A GREAT TIME - BE SURE TO PLAN ON FISHING AND LEARNING WITH US. CONTACT CHAIRMAN LEE ROTHGEB TO CONFIRM EVENT IF WEATHER IS QUESTIONABLE.

Two ways to win! We will recognize three places for heaviest weight fish and three places for highest point fish for each species. First = 3 pts. Second = 2 pts. Third = 1 pt. These points will apply towards the annual Salt Water Tournament Angler of the Year competition. A fish can be entered by weight or points (angler must declare which category) but not both ways for 1 fish. Only 2 fish of each species can be entered per person. Entries must be turned in within 24 hours from the end of tournament.




