<u>NEXT TOURNAMENT</u> <u>JAMES RIVER FLATHEAD CATFISH</u> <u>AUGUST 19TH THRU 27TH</u> (By Glenn Carter)

The Tournament is a nine day tournament and will run from August 19 thru August 27.. Several members work on weekends but are off during the week so we hope everyone will find a day or two to participate in this event.

This will be a James River tournament and anywhere you choose to go on the James is permissible. However, you don't really need to travel very far for a shot at a Flathead. Any of the waters flowing through the city of Richmond from Bosher's Dam to I95 is prime Flathead water.

Smallish live baits (sunfish) are the bait of choice. However, many flatheads have been caught using artificial lures and flies.

Awards will be made for the highest point and heaviest Flathead landed. All entries should be made electronically with an E-Card or call Glenn Carter [804-824-2389 (H), 804-543-5349 (C)] with your entry if you don't have access to make an electronic entry. Entry deadline is midnight on Monday August 28.

JUNE PROGRAM REPORT – WRECK FISHING

Member Mike Cline presented a thorough and well-illustrated program about fishing inshore and offshore wrecks for flounder and seabass. He shared how one may prepare for wreck fishing and subjects such as boat handling, tackle, how to use electronics to one's advantage and what times are best for wreck fishing.

Mike recommended going after the early bite to maximize the success of jigging up a sea bass or a flounder off a wreck. He also said dive shop web sites are a good source of pictures of what might be found on wrecks and checking out www.fishingstatus.com to see what the action on wrecks currently is. About seven in the morning, on a recent warm summer weekend, nine VAC members met for one of the 2017 VAC Expeditions. It was a wade fishing outing on a local small river, and the cooler waters from the incredible canopy of trees that surrounded us offset the hot temperatures that had set in by the time we left around noon. After fishing, we met for a great fellowship luncheon at a local restaurant where a cold beverage was enjoyed along with some fine wood smoked meats and sides. It was a fine day for certain.

As usual, the white grub stood out as a top lure, but Tyler Shands had a couple of his special imported crank baits that wore out a number of different species. In all, a dozen different species were caught on spin, general and fly. The largest point fish was a sweet 4-12 largemouth bass caught on 6 general by Mike Ostrander. A few 18+ inch smallmouth bass were landed along with a number of red-breasted sunfish, white crappie, shellcrackers (redear sunfish), spotted bass, bluegill, green sunfish, white perch, striped bass, pumpkinseed sunfish and bowfin.

Everyone caught plenty of fish, and the group included two fly fishermen, Eric Webster and David Nobles and seven spin fishermen; Bob Brown, Bill Patterson, Tyler Shands, Vic Skakandy, Mike Ostrander, Jack Dietrich and Steve Knox. "Catchy Comments" By Stuart Lee

Recent catches by club members have been few and far between when judged by entries in the club database. There have been notable exceptions. Gar-Whisperer Eddy Johnston caught a 16 Lb. fish on July 12, somewhere on the James River on 2 Spin, earning 581 points and taking the overall lead in the freshwater category. Eddy was using a 6-inch Gulp Shad for bait.

Fred Murray recently returned from his annual trip to Canada to fish for Walleyes. He reported the Walleye fishing was good, and the Walleye eating was better.

Danny Noland released a Cobia on 6 General on July 20, on Windmill Bar, at the mouth of the Rappahannock River. For those who do not know this has historically been a very popular bay Cobia fishing area. When our club was founded, the guys that founded it were regularly fishing Windmill Bar for Cobia. Interestingly enough, many people at that time referred to the fish as Bonita and not Cobia. When I was a youngster, I remember that a Bonita tournament was held each summer out of Deltaville.

In July of 1963, our club held the Virginia Anglers Club First Annual Light Tackle Tournament at Windmill Point. Teams from clubs from all over came to compete and fish on Windmill Bar for three days in July. The Panama Marlin Club won the prize for the best catch and the highest individual angler award. The best catch was a 54 Lb. 8 oz. Cobia on 20 Lb test by Unis Johnson, and the high rod award went to Casel Adamson. The largest fish of the tournament was a 57 Lb. 8 oz. fish taken on 30 Lb test by Don Lafferty of Hollidaysburg, Pennsylvania.

These details were taken from Joe Brook's Saltwater Game Fishing, published in 1968. While many things in fishing have changed since this book came out, it remains a very good book on many topics, including stories of Joe Brooks fishing trips with early VAC members.

I am looking forward to Andrew Stiles' presentation at the October membership meeting on the life of Joe Brooks. Andrew has had a longtime interest in Mr. Brooks and has accumulated a great deal of information. I am guessing that because Andrew is a fly fisherman, he will concentrate on Joe's fly fishing exploits. While it is true that he was a pioneer in fly fishing, particularly saltwater fly fishing, Joe Brooks was not strictly a fly fisherman. He was very skilled in all types of fishing, and his input in setting up our club's rules was intended to make members develop skills in all tackle divisions. In targeting a specific fish in a given situation, one method will prove to be more effective than others. A good overall fisherman will recognize what will work best and have the skill to employ that method.

I have heard some of Andrew Stiles' Joe Brooks stories and look forward to hearing more in October.

GLENN CARTER'S SPECIAL DOLPHIN ON 6# SPIN

"And Now, the Rest of the Story"

Over the years, Glenn Carter has fished in many waters to amass his required fish caught thus far for this coveted and, not that easy to attained, VAC Master Angler Award. It all started back on March 3, 1977 with Glenn's first catch entry, a landlocked striped bass* on 6# general. Forty-one years later, June 12th Glenn, Glenn ventured into the Western Atlantic to pursue one of the two remaining required fish for this award, a dolphin on spin worth 150 points or more.

Member Stuart Lee, a long time angling buddy of Glenn's, had extended Glenn an invitation to come down to Nags Head, NC over the weekend of June 12th and fish for this coveted dolphin. The weather looked like it was going to break on Saturday and Stuart thought the day would be the only day they could get out to the Gulf Stream.

Glenn's weekend was already fully committed; he declined Stuart's invitation. However, Glenn gave the invitation some second thought and called Stuart back on Friday evening. Glenn assured his host that he would be at the dock at 6:00 AM sharp.

Glenn was out of bed at 2:30 AM Saturday morning and left his home in Gloucester, VA at 3:00 AM for the three-hour drive to Nags Head. True to his word, Glenn arrived at Stuart's dock at 6:00 AM sharp.....dolphin dedication at its best.

Once the chum line was set, a couple of small dolphin perused Glenn's first cast offerings and calmly swam off. Stuart spied a larger dolphin headed toward the boat and told Glenn that he needed the 6# spin rig to work with this larger fish. On Glenn's first cast on the 6# rig, this larger dolphin sniffed the bucktail and swam off to continue its dolphin business.

Glenn then cast after this larger departing dolphin and, on this cast, caught its attention. Hooked up at 8:45 AM, at 9:10 AM Glenn boated his 150 point minimum dolphin on spin tackle. The fish weighed 10 lbs. – 6 oz. and clocked in at 227 points, well over the minimum needed to qualify as Glenn's next-to-last required Master Angler catch. Needless to say, Glenn was beyond elated.

Like most personally significant catches, Glenn's dolphin has a story connected to it. Thanks, Glenn, for stepping thru your normal veil of modesty and sharing your story and your accomplishment with us all. The VAC congratulates you for this very special catch.

* This landlocked striped bass, caught in Buggs Island Lake, was a club record catch. That record still stands to this day. Glenn's 10 lb. -6 0z. Dolphin was Glenn's 249th catch entry.
