FEBRUARY 2018 CONSERVATION AND LEGISLATION REPORT

Virginia General Assembly Legislation Update

Listed below is a synopsis from current Bills posted on the LIS (Legislative Information System of the General Assembly) that may be of interest to VAC Members. Please keep in mind these bills are still in process unless it is no longer moving forward or it is amended in the CODE of VA. HB 635: Free Fishing day

Permits the Board of Game and Inland Fisheries to designate a substitute free day in the event that a free day is canceled as a result of inclement weather.

Status: 01/30/18 House voted (99-Y 0-N)

02/15/18 Senate: Reported from Agriculture, Conservation and Natural Resources (15-Y 0-N)

HB 1151: Nonresident youth fishing license, exemption

Authorizes a nonresident under age 16 to fish without a fishing license when accompanied by a person possessing a valid license to fish in Virginia. Current law allows a resident under age 16 or a nonresident under age 12 to fish without a license.

Status: 02/13/18 House voted (96-Y 3-N)

02/14/18 Senate: Referred to Committee on Agriculture, Conservation and Natural Resources

HB 1404: Snakehead fish; certified restaurants and retail markets

Authorizes a Hazard Analysis and Critical Control Point (HACCP) plan certified restaurant or retail market to purchase from an HACCP certified dealer or sell processed snakehead fish of the family Channidae.

Status: 02/13/18 House voted (100-Y 0-N)

02/14/18 Senate: Referred to Committee on Agriculture, Conservation and Natural Resources

HB 1075: Poaching; revocation of hunting, trapping, or fishing license and privileges.

Bill is no longer moving forward


"Catchy Comments" By Fred Cousins

It appears that the 2018 fishing year is off to a good start. Even though there were no entries from late December to late January, there have been 24 entries so far this year. Frozen lakes and rivers do make fishing difficult!

Twelve members have submitted entries for a total of 12 different species. All but 2 entries are for freshwater species, which is typical for this time of year. The most popular species have been crappie (5), yellow perch (4), chain pickerel (3), and rainbow trout (3). Included in the entries so far are some notable catches: a 1 lb.- 12 oz. crappie by Rob Choi; a 4 lb.-12 oz. rainbow trout by Carter Clevinger; a 19 lb. muskie by Rob Choi; a 5 lb.- 11 oz. spotted seatrout by Larry Allen; and a 11 lb.- 8oz. gar by Fred Cousins.

While members have been fishing all over the state, over half of the fish (15) have been caught either in the Chickahomony Lake/River or Piscataway Creek. Check out the Catch Database on the Club website for the details.



The total combined pts must be 1600 or greater and no fish can be less than 150 pts. This 3lb 6oz bow (191 pts in 4lb class) makes the 3rd species I've been able to catch towards my goal. I now have a brown (156 pts), Carp (315 pts), and this bow. I need one more freshwater species and then I will focus on the salt.

This has been a very fun goal for me as I never focused on light lines or measuring fish before joining.

I feel all these challenges have led me to be a more efficient Angler.




