- Deadline for dues is March 1 if not paid, you are no longer a current member, and will not have access to enter catches, and will not be eligible for above awards. Pay now so you don't miss out!

What's New in 2019

The following regulation changes are new for 2019. More details can be found in sections that follow this summary.

General Information

- Lake Merriweather, a 450-acre impoundment owned by the Boy Scouts and located in Goshen, VA, is now open for public fishing on a seasonal basis. In addition to an appropriate fishing license, a Public Access Lands for Sportsmen (PALS) permit is needed to fish this lake.
- There are additional streams where anglers are restricted from using fish as bait. These include Big Stony Creek in Giles County, Dismal Creek in Bland and Giles counties, Laurel Creek in Bland County (Wolf Creek drainage) and Cripple Creek in Smyth and Wythe counties.
- Goldfish are now legal to take with bow and arrow or crossbow.

Creel (Harvest) and Length Limits

- There are new largemouth, smallmouth, and spotted bass length and creel limits on Claytor Lake as well as new length and creel limits for striped bass and striped bass X white bass hybrids.
- A new trophy fish regulation has been established for small mouth bass on the Levisa Fork River in Buchanan County.
- New length limits for crappie on Buggs Island Lake/Kerr Reservoir, Briery Creek and Sandy River reservoirs.
- Creel and length limit changes for striped bass.
- There are new creel and length limit changes for white bass on Buggs Island Lake/Kerr Reservoir.
- There are new creel and length limits for blue catfish on Lake Gaston.
- Rock bass and Roanoke bass regulations have been revised statewide for simplification purposes and to protect rare Roanoke bass populations.
- Moratorium on possession of American shad. Anglers on the Meherrin River below Emporia Dam, Nottaway River, Blackwater River (Chowan Drainage), North Landing, Northwest rivers, and their tributaries plus Back Bay are no longer allowed to harvest American shad. Possession of American shad while on public waters is prohibited statewide.

Nets and Seines

• Use of cast nets in the Staunton and Dan Rivers – It is now legal to use cast (throw) nets in the Staunton and Dan Rivers to collect bait fish. The use of other types of nets (other than hand landing nets and cast nets) is still prohibited in these rivers.

Trout

- A trout license is not required to fish designated stocked trout waters during Free Fishing Days, June 7-9, 2019.
- Hearthstone Lake (Augusta Co.) and North Fork Moorman's River (Albemarle Co.) will not be stocked in 2019.
- Two new special regulation (catch and release) waters established, Beaver Creek (Bristol) and Wolf Creek (Abingdon).

American Shad Possession

As of January 1st, 2019, there is a statewide moratorium on the possession of American shad. However, catch and immediate release is permitted.

Menhaden Fishery Managers Won't Pursue Punishment for Virginia



Virginia's menhaden fishery gets a major victory, as Atlantic fisheries managers decide not to hold the Commonwealth out of compliance with its most recent catch limits.

Back in fall of 2017, the Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission (ASMFC) voted to reduce the maximum allowable harvest on the Chesapeake Bay from 87,216 metric tons to 51,000 metric tons a year.

Virginia's legislature failed to adopt the reduced catch limits, after the East Coast menhaden fishery's biggest player,

Omega Protein, argued the reduction was unnecessary. Under law, the U.S. Department of Commerce can put an immediate moratorium on a state that doesn't comply with catch limits.

ASMFC won't seek a moratorium from the Department of Commerce, announcing it has "indefi nitely postponed" action to find Virginia out of compliance. ASMFC explains, the Virginia fishery has stayed within the limits of a precautionary "Bay Cap" that was imposed to protect the small, oily fish as an important link in the Chesapeake Bay food chain.

In a statement, ASMFC writes, "This action is contingent upon the Chesapeake Bay reduction fishery not exceeding the cap. If the cap is exceeded, the Board can reconsider the issue of compliance. In making its decision, the Board took into account the fact that reduction fishery harvest within the Chesapeake Bay has been below the cap level since 2012, including 2018 harvest."

Unsurprisingly, Omega Protein applauded the decision not to pursue a noncompliant finding.

"The Commission made the right decision today because the Bay Cap is not 'necessary for the conservation of the fishery,' as is required in a non-compliance finding," said Ben Landry, Director of Public Affairs for Omega Protein. "The Commission's decision to press pause on this motion signals their acknowledgement that the basis for the reduced Bay Cap was not going to meet federal standards."

Texas-based Omega Protein operates out of a Reedville factory employing about 200 people. -Meg Walburn Viviano

From Hook to Table

SMOKED TROUT DIP

Don't worry if you don't have a smoker! Just read the ingredients for what you'll need. If you don't have the smoking oil, this recipe still tastes great without it. It's the perfect appetizer or party side dish. It's light and refreshing. This dip requires more than 2–3 filets if you're making it for a larger crowd. Just keep adding ingredients as necessary to fulfill consistency and flavor. It's simple and less stressful than trying to prevent the fish from flaking when it gets stuck to the bottom of the pan since we want it flakey

Ingredients:

Amount Ingredient

2 Large Trout Filets

1 package Cream cheese, softened 1 package Goat cheese, softened

3 tablespoon Dill 1 cup Chives

2 tablespoon Garlic Powder

2 Lemons

Smoke-flavored Infused oil

1 package Crackers

Directions:

- 1. Set cheeses out to melt to room temperature or pop in microwave for a few seconds before mixing to soften.
- 2. In a skillet with butter, cook trout and shred. Season the trout with salt and pepper and smoked oil.
- 3. Remove and put in a large bowl aside and allow to completely cool.
- 4. Once cooled, add the cheeses and spices.
- 5. Mix all ingredients until incorporated well. Place in fridge and allow to slightly cool.
- 6. Serve with crackers.


