President's Message

Transitions and Adaptation

It's October, and already my backyard is filling up with leaves. The Tulip Poplar trees are already shedding their leaves. And as the nights begin to cool, the leaves on the Gumball or Liquid Amber trees will begin to turn red, orange and yellow and fall to the ground as well. Once again, I will have to go into the garage and take down the rake that hasn't been touched since last October and begin the process of removing the leaves from the lawn.

October is a time of transition from Summer to Fall. Transition requires adaptation. The transition from Summer to Fall requires the adaptation of rakes and extra layers of clothes.

It's the same with fishing. I have found that for the species that I target, Largemouth bass, the transitional months are September, October and February. In the case of September and October, the fish that I could count on to be hiding in cover in the shade have moved. In the case of February, the bass have reproduction on their minds and are tougher to encourage to bite artificial baits.

So, adaptation is required. But adaptation comes in several forms.

One way to adapt to fishing transitions is to just quit fishing. My fishing partner Earl, would quit fishing in September and wouldn't pick a rod up until May, because he had turned from fishing to hunting. Dove, deer, turkey and ducks were his focus during those fishing transitions. When the temperatures warmed up and the fish were coming off the beds, Earl picked up a rod, once again, and started throwing weightless Senko worms at the shoreline.

Another way to adapt to the fishing transitions is to switch species. When I was living in California, the CA Fish and Game Department would begin to stock lakes with Rainbow trout in late October and early November. It was easy and fun to switch from bass and begin to target trout since they were more active and predictable.

There is a third method of adaptation during these transitional periods. And that is to try to figure out what your fish are doing and follow them into their transition and present different baits that will be more suitable to what that species is doing.

This third method requires a good deal of effort. There is research, additional tackle and time on the water to search out and find those fish that just a month ago were so easy to find.

It is during these fishing transitions that I am most thankful for the members of the Virginia Anglers Club. The vast wealth of knowledge found within the membership of our club has helped me tremendously, especially when I am struggling to find fish during these times of transition.

Regardless of your preferred method of adaptation during these transitions, enjoy the opportunity that you have been provided.

If you switch from fishing to hunting, enjoy the sounds and smells of the woods and marshes.

If you switch to a different and more active and predictable species, enjoy the time on the water that you have. Enjoy the change in gear and tackle that that species requires.

If you decide to follow your targeted species as they move to new areas, enjoy the hunt and the challenge of finding your fish when they act like they don't want to be found.

There will always be transitions. Transitions are predictable and should be expected. Just like the leaves on my trees are going to fall to the ground every October, the bass are going to move away from the shore in September and October.

Do I put the rods and reels down and go hunting? Do I change species and target more predictable and active species or do I follow my fish into there new haunts? Making those decisions is part of what makes being and angler so fun.


Dear Members:

There are opportunities for kayak fishermen, boat fisherman and shore, wade fisherman. The Kiptopeke State Park excursion offers great kayaking opportunities from launching at the park to fish the waters around the concrete ships for flounder, tautog, trout, etc.

James River Trophy Catfish Expedition November 23rd, 2024, 7:00am Deep Bottom Park, 9525 Deep Bottom Road, Henrico, VA 23231

One of the best locations and times to catch a trophy blue catfish is the upper tidal James River during the fall and winter. This is a great way to try and catch VAC's Freshwater President's Cup (highest point freshwater catch entered into database).

Jumbo catfish on light line: The following VAC members currently hold IGFA line class World Record blue catfish caught in the James River. Bob Shepherd (2-lb line - 36lb 9 oz), Fred Murray (4-lb line - 53lb 0 oz) and Fred Cousins (6-lb line - 64lb 0 oz).

Boats should be in the water and ready by 7:00am (sunrise is 6:58am). High Tide is 10:29am, so you will have a chance to fish the incoming and outgoing tides. Wind and tide will play a roll was to where you can fish. An order has been placed for calm winds.

Sign Up Required: Email <u>Mike@DiscovertheJames.com</u> if you plan to attend (have a boat) and/or would like to attend and need a spot on a boat. This is a perfect outing to match up members who want to fish this expedition but do not have a boat, with members who have openings on their boat. This highlights one of the greatest parts of the Virginia Anglers Club. Fishing and getting to know other anglers who share our passion.

When emailing, Include the following information: If a you have a boat, indicate if you have any openings for members. If you don't have a boat, indicate, and I will try to get you on a boat. Small to medium sized boats & kayaks are ideal for fishing this area of the James.

Other upper tidal James departure locations on the James are available. Osborne Landing is not far away. Ancarrow's Landing is across from downtown, and a handful of boat ramps are located downriver further towards Hopewell.

BAIT: Fresh bait is paramount. Chicken thighs work good (really), but a goal is for each boat to receive a couple of fresh shad the morning of the trip. I'll be on the river catching shad by 5am, so if anyone wants to learn how to catch gizzard shad, plan on showing up to Deep Bottom at 4:45am, and I'll be glad to have you ride aboard and learn how to catch shad. I can handle three or four people easily while catching shad.

TACKLE: Medium to medium heavy rods are preferable. Four to six pound line is pretty light to use, but doable. Eight to twenty pound line will give you an edge over these big fish, but if you can try lighter line, give it a go!




